MONDAY, JANUARY 10th, 1842.

The Senate met pursuant to adjournment.

Mr. McLean moved that the Secretary of the Senate be authorized to subscribe for ten copies each of the newspapers printed in the city of Tallahassee, to be furnished each member of the Senate during the session—which was adopted.

Mr. Dupont offered the following resolutions, viz :

Resolved, That so much of his Excellency, the Governor's Message as relates to the Seminole war, be referred to the committee on the state of the Territory.

Resolved, That so much thereof as relates to the

claims of our citizens against the United States for military services rendered, and supplies furnished for the use of the government be referred to the committee on the state of the Territory.

Resolved, That so much thereof as relates to banks and other incorporations, be referred to the committee on finance and banks.

Resolved, That so much thereof as relates to the Pensacola Bank bonds, be referred to the committee on the Judiciary.

Resolved, That so much thereof as relates to the annual reports of the Auditor and Treasurer of the Territory and other public officers having the charge of public funds, and the revenue system of the Territory, be referred to the committee on public accounts.

Resolved, That so much thereof as relates to the organization of the militia, be referred to the committee on the militia.

Resolved, That so much thereof as relates to the completion of the Capitol, be referred to the committee on the state of the Territory.

Which were read.

On motion of Mr. Livingston, it was ordered, that the Senate meet hereafter at 10 o'clock, A. M.

The Senate then adjourned until to-morrow.

TUESDAY, JANUARY 11, 1842

The Senate met pursuant to adjournment.

On motion of Mr. Berthelot it was resolved, [the House of Representatives concurring in the same] that the joint Rules of the last Legislative Council be taken and considered as the Rules of the present Legislative Council, and that the Secretary certify this motion to the House of Representatives.

Mr. Berthelot gives notice that he will on tomorrow ask leave to introduce a Bill to be entitled an act to amend an act to provide for the collection of rents, approved Nov. 21st, 1828.
