A bill to be entitled, An Act to class the Senators of this State, Was read a second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

A bill to be entitled, An Act to fix the compensation of members of the General Assembly of this State,

Was read a second time.

The Senate resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole on said bill; Mr. McLean in the chair, and after some time spent therein, rose and reported progress, and asked leave to sit again.

Which was granted.

The bill from the House to be entitled, An Act to repeal an act to provide the mode of punishment for certain offences at Key West in the Southern Judicial District,

Was read a second time and ordered for a third reading.

A bill to be entitled, An Act to organize the Supreme Court of the State of Florida,

Was read a second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

A bill to be entitled, An Act respecting the Books and Maps belonging to this State,

Was read a second time, and ordered to be engrossed.

A bill to be entitled, An Act to organize the Circuit Courts of the State of Florida,

Was read a second time, and postponed until to-morrow.

The engrossed bill to be entitled, An Act to provide for the making an enumeration of the inhabitants of the State of Florida,
