#### FRIDAY, January 14, 1870.

The Senate met pursuant to adjournment.

The Lieutenant-Governor in the chair.

The roll was called, and the following Senators answered to their names:

Messrs. Atkins, Bradwell, Crane, Crawford, Cruse, Ginn, Henderson, Hillyer, Katzenberg, Krimminger, Meacham, Moragne, McCaskill, Pearce, Purman, Smith, Smithson, Underwood, Walls, Weeks, and Wentworth—21.

A quorum present.

On motion of Mr. Henderson the reading of yesterday's journal was dispensed with.

The rule was waived, and Mr. Purman offered the following: Senate Bill No. 12:

An Act to incorporate the Florida Land, Building and Planting Association;

Which was read first time by its title and, on motion, referred to the Committee on Corporations.

#### ORDERS OF THE DAY.

Memorial to Congress relative to extending Postal Route No. 6,410, from Camp Iazard, Marion county, to Crystal River, Hernando county,

Was read third time and put upon its passage.

The vote was:

So the memorial was adopted.

Ordered that the same be certified to the Assembly.

Senate joint resolution relative to printing five hundred copies of the Governor's Message, for the use of the Executive and members of the Legislature and Cabinet,

Came up on its third reading.

By unanimous consent Mr. Henderson offered the following amendment to said resolution:

Add after the word "message," together with the reports of the Comptroller and Treasurer, and all tabular statements thereto attached;

Which was agreed to.

The resolution as amended was put upon its passage.

The vote was:

Yeas—Messrs. Atkins, Bradwell, Crane, Crawford, Cruse, Ginn, Hillyer, Katzenberg, Krimminger, Meacham, Pearce, Purman, Smith, Underwood, Walls, and Wentworth—16.

Nays—Messrs. Kendrick, Moragne, McCaskill, and Weeks—4.

So the resolution as amended was adopted.

Ordered that the same be certified to the Assembly.

The rule was waived, and Mr. Purman introduced the following:

Senate Bill No. 13:

An Act to Improve the Navigation of the Apalachicola River through Moccasin Slough, and to make appropriation therefor;

Which was read first time by its title, and on motion, referred to a special committee consisting of Messrs. Purman, Atkins, and Crawford.

The rule was waived, and Mr. Hillyer offered the following:

Senate Bill No. 14:

An Act in relation to bonds given in Criminal Cases;

Which was read first time by its title, and on motion referred to the Judiciary Committee.

The rule was waived, and Mr. Walls offered the following resolution:

Joint resolution relative to the election of United States Senator;

Which was read first time.

Mr. Moragne moved to refer the resolution to the Committee on Judiciary.

Mr. Moragne moved to lay the motion on the table.

The Senate refused to lay the motion on the table.

Mr. Purman moved that the resolution be printed and laid on the desk of each member ;

Which was agreed to.

The rule was waived, and Mr. Krimminger introduced the following :

Senate Bill No. 15 :

An Act to amend An Act entitled An Act to provide for the punishment of Crime and Proceedings in Criminal Cases ;

Which was read first time by its title, and on motion, referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

Mr. Smith moved that the sergeant-at-arms be instructed to number the chairs of the Senate Chamber from Nos. 1, to 24, inclusive, so that each Senator can have his chair numbered with the number corresponding in his desk ; and to have within the bar of the Senate twelve extra chairs, labelled, "Senate Chamber ;"

Which was agreed to.

Mr. Smith moved that the sergeant-at-arms select and fit up for the use of the Senate Judiciary Committee, one of the two rooms used by the Adjutant-General, and for the storing of arms in the Capitol building ;

Which was agreed to.

The Committee on Public Lands made the following report :

Your committee to whom was referred Senate Bill No. 2, it being An Act in relation to Homesteads, respectfully report that they have had the same under consideration, and unanimously recommend that said bill be passed.

An Act to authorize the construction of a boom across the Withlacoochee River ;

Which was read first time by its title, and, on motion, referred to the Committee on Corporations.

The rule was waived, and Mr. Hillyer offered the following :

Senate Bill No. 18 :

An Act to provide for the more efficient working of the Public Roads of the State ;

Which was read first time, and, on motion, referred to the Committee on Judiciary.
