

TUESDAY, May 24, 10 o'clock, A. M., 1870.

The Senate met pursuant to adjournment.
 The Senate was called to order by the Secretary.
 The roll was called, and the following Senators answered to their names:
 Messrs. Atkins, Bradwell, Cruse, Ginn, Henderson, Katzenberg, Krimminger, Meacham, Moragne, Smith, Smithson, Vaughan, Weeks, and Wentworth—14.
 The Secretary announced that there was a quorum present.
 On motion of Mr. Henderson, Mr. Krimminger took the chair.
 Mr. Krimminger in the chair.
 On motion of Mr. Wentworth, the Senate took a recess till 12 o'clock, Meridian.

TWELVE O'CLOCK, MERIDIAN.

The Senate resumed its session.
 Mr. Krimminger in the chair.
 The roll was called, and the following Senators answered to their names:
 Messrs. Atkins, Bradwell, Crawford, Cruse, Ginn, Henderson, Katzenberg, Kendrick, Krimminger, Meacham, Moragne, McCaskill, Pearce, Purman, Smith, Smithson, Vaughan, Walls, Weeks, and Wentworth—20.
 A quorum present.
 Mr. Smith offered the following resolution:
Resolved, That the Sergeant-at-Arms be directed to remove from the Senate Chamber, and keep under arrest, until further orders, the gentleman sitting on the left of Mr. Krimminger, presiding *pro tem*.
 Mr. Wentworth offered the following as a substitute:
Resolved, That the Senate do not recognize the appointment of E. C. Weeks as Lieutenant-Governor, or his right to preside over this body.
 Upon which the yeas and nays were called for.
 The vote was:
 Yeas—Messrs. Atkins, Bradwell, Crawford, Cruse, Ginn, Henderson, Katzenberg, Kendrick, Krimminger, Meacham, Moragne, McCaskill, Purman, Smith, Smithson, Vaughan, Walls, Weeks, and Wentworth.—19.
 Nays—None.

So the substitute offered by Mr. Wentworth was adopted. Whereupon Mr. Weeks retired from the Senate Chamber.
 The journal of yesterday was read and approved.
 Mr. Crawford moved that the Senate do now proceed to the election of a President *pro tem*.
 Mr. Walls moved to lay the motion on the table;
 On which the yeas and nays were called for.
 The vote was:
 Yeas—None.
 Nays—Messrs. Atkins, Crawford, Ginn, Henderson, Katzenberg, Krimminger, Moragne, McCaskill, Smithson, and Weeks—10.
 The Senate refused to lay the motion on the table.
 Mr. McCaskill moved the call of the Senate;
 Which was agreed to.
 The following Senators answered to their names:
 Messrs. Atkins, Crawford, Ginn, Henderson, Katzenberg, Krimminger, Moragne, McCaskill, Smithson, and Weeks—10.
 The chair announced that there was no quorum.
 The Sergeant-at-Arms was dispatched after the absent members.
 During the absence of the Sergeant-at-Arms, Mr. McCaskill offered the following resolution:
Be it Resolved by the Senate, the Assembly concurring, That this General Assembly do now adjourn *sine die*.
 Mr. McCaskill withdrew his motion, and on motion of Mr. Katzenberg the Senate adjourned till 4 o'clock, p. m.

FOUR O'CLOCK, P. M.

The Senate met as per adjournment.
 Mr. Krimminger in the Chair.
 Mr. McCaskill moved a call of the Senate;
 Which was agreed to.
 The following Senators answered to their names:
 Messrs. Crawford, Ginn, Henderson, Katzenberg, Kendrick, Krimminger, Moragne, McCaskill, Smithson, Vaughan, and Weeks—11.
 The Sergeant-at-Arms was dispatched after absent members.
 On motion of Mr. Henderson, further proceedings under the call of the Senate was dispensed with, and the Senate adjourned until to-morrow 4 o'clock, p. m.
