FRIDAY, JANUARY 22, 1875.

The Senate met pursuant to adjournment.

The President *pro tem.* in the chair.

The roll was called and the following Senators answered to their names:

Not a quorum present.

Mr. McKinnon moved a call of the Senate;

Which was agreed to.

The roll was called and the following Senators answered to their names:

Mr. President, Messrs. Brantley, Cottrell, Crawford, Fortner, Hendry, Knight, Lykes, McAuley, McKinnon, and Smith—11.

The Secretary of the Senate was ordered to furnish the Sergeant-at-arms with a list of the absent members, which was done, and the Sergeant-at-arms was instructed to compel the attendance of the absentees.

The Sergeant-at-arms returned to the bar of the Senate and stated that Mr. Wallace was confined to his bed by sickness; that he was unable to find Mr. Johnson, and that the other absentees were not in the city.

Which was agreed to, and the President declared the Senate adjourned until to-morrow at 10 o'clock A. M.
