To His Excellency George F. Drew, Governor of Florida:

SIR: I have the honor to furnish you my report as Comptroller for 1879.

Of the amount of warrants issued in 1879, it will be seen that \$2,144.72 were for private reliefs, &c., passed during the session of 1879, but pertaining to prior years, leaving the amount applicable to the expenses of the year 1879 \$197,216, 11, as stated. The estimate made of appropriations necessary for 1879 to the last Legislature, for ordinary State expenses, was \$223,873.00. The whole amount of warrants issued during the year, including reliefs and other expenses not included in the estimate, was \$199,360.83.

The \$132,000 of 7 per cent. bonds of 1857, mentioned in my report of 1877, as held by the Indian Trust Fund, are still in that position, with interest accrued up to January 1, 1880, \$165,760.00.

It is hoped and believed that the State's claim growing out of Indian hostilities, which is now being prosecuted at Washington by Col. W. K. Beard, agent for the State, may be successful and more than offset this claim.

There also accompanies this report the usual tabular statement required by law to be published, showing the gross and net amount of all State taxes assessed for the year 1879 in each of the counties of the State, and the gross and net amount of all State taxes upon licenses.

There is also communicated the condition of the accounts of accounting officers with the State, appointed since the incoming of the present administration. A statement of the conditions of accounts with previously appointed officers was rendered in the report of the Comptroller made to the Legislature January 1st, 1879. Most of those accounts were placed in suit as directed by law, and no material change in them exists sufficient to justify a repetition of them in the present report. A detailed report of these accounts, and the extent to which settlements have been made, will be presented to the next Legislature. Those marked with a star in the present report are

new appointments made in 1879. They serve to illustrate how uncollected revenues of former years are brought forward and charged to new officers, thus debiting them with large amounts on entering upon their duties.

The total of balances due by former officers, as referred to in the preceding paragraph, and more recently made out, amounts to \$219,143.78.

Although this report purports to be made up to the 31st of December, 1879, and the receipts into the Treasury and warrants issued within the year are up to that period, as the exact condition of the accounts of officers could be more correctly given by including the entries occurring in the interval while the financial reports are being prepared, and as the Comptroller's report is dated on the 1st of March, 1880, the balances are stated as they appear on the books at that time.

#### BALANCES DUE BY ACCOUNTING OFFICERS.

In reference to these balances, as was stated in connection with the more complete list published with the report to the Legislature in 1879, they do not always show moneys collected and not paid over to the State. The majority of the cases are the other way. In some, the amounts are those uncollected on old books turned over to Collectors, with which they are charged, credits on which they will be entitled to in adjusting their accounts. A circular has been sent to Clerks and Sheriffs citing the law under which they are required to report, collect, and pay over fines and forfeitures, and which it is hoped may facilitate the settlement of accounts of Sheriffs in future.
