THURSDAY, APRIL 6, 1911.

The Senate met pursuant to adjournment.

The President in the chair.

The roll being called, the following Senators answered to their names:

A quorum present.

Prayer by the Chaplain.

Mr. Johnson moved that the reading of the Journal be dispensed with.

Which was agreed to.

The Journals of April 4 and April 5 were corrected.

Mr. Humphries moved to take up and consider the report of the Committee on Rules.

Which was agreed to.

The report was taken up.

Mr. Hudson offered the following amendment to the report of the Special Committee on Rules. Strike out the word "nine" in the third line of the paragraph following the list of committees on page 9 of Journal, and insert in lieu thereof the following: "Eleven."

Which was agreed to.

Mr. Hudson moved to consider the rules as reported and amended by sections.

Which was agreed to.

Pending the reading of the rules a communication was received from the Attorney General.

Rule No. 1 was read.

Mr. Hudson moved that Rule No 1 be adopted.

Which was agreed to.

Mr. Hudson moved that Rules Nos. 2, 3 and 4 be adopted.

Which was agreed to.

Rule 5 was read.

Mr. Calkins offered the following amendment to Rule No 5, as amended:

After the word adjourn in line 2 of Rule 5, insert the following: "To adjourn to a day certain, or that when the Senate adjourn it shall be to a day certain; to take a recess; to proceed to the consideration of executive business."

Mr. Calkins moved to adopt the amendment.

Which was agreed to.

Mr. Dayton moved that Rule 5 as amended be adopted.

Which was agreed to.

Mr. Hudson moved that Rules No. 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12 and 13 be adopted.

Rules 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12 and 13 were adopted.

Rule No. 14 was read.

Mr. Hudson moved that Rule No. 14 be adopted.

Which was agreed to.

Mr. Hudson moved to adopt Rules No. 15, 16, 17, 18 and 19.

Which was agreed to.

Rule No. 20 was read.

Mr. Hilburn offered the following amendment to Rule 20:

Strike out all of that part of Rule 20 commencing with and including the last paragraph thereof on page 9 and extending down to and including the last paragraph of said rule and insert in lieu thereof the following:

"All applications to the Senate for clerical aid to any committee shall be referred to the Committee on Legislative Expenses for investigation and report whether or not the proposed clerical aid is necessary for the dispatch of the public business.

"The chairman of any committee which has been authorized to appoint a clerk shall as soon as the appointment is made, certify the appointment and the name of the clerk with the date of his appointment to the Chairman of the Committee on Legislative Expenses, and the compensation of such clerk shall begin on the date that such certificate is filed with the chairman of the latter committee. All expenses incurred by any special committee shall be certified, with the items thereof, under oath to the Chairman of the Committee on Legislative Expenses, who shall keep on file all certificates made to him under this rule."

Pending the consideration of which, by consent, Mr. Massey offered the following amendment to Rule 20 in report of Committee on Rules:

Strike out the word "Clerks" after the words "engrossing and enrolling," and insert in lieu thereof the following word: "Secretaries."

Mr. Massey moved the adoption of the amendment.

Which was agreed to.

The question recurred upon the amendment offered by Mr. Hilburn.

Mr. Zim offered the following amendment to the amendment, Rule 20 of the Senate: Strike out the words "typewriters and shall also be experienced stenographers" in the sixth line of the paragraph at the end of page 9.

Which was withdrawn.

Mr. Stokes offered the following amendment to amendment of Rule 20, add the following: "Provided, that three of said clerks shall be competent typewriters and stenographers."

Mr. Stokes moved the adoption of the amendment to the amendment.

Which was agreed to.

Mr. Dayton moved to adopt the amendment to Rule 20, as amended.

Which was agreed to.

Mr. Adkins moved that Rule No. 20, as amended, be adopted.

Which was agreed to.

Mr. Hudson moved that Rules Nos. 21, 22, 23, 24 and 25 be adopted.

Rule No. 26 was read.

Mr. Malone offered the following amendment to Rule No. 27:

Strike out the words in the first paragraph of the rules as follows: "All questions arising on such reports shall be decided without debate."

Mr. Malone moved the adoption of the amendment.
