

## CERTIFICATE

Senate Chamber,  
Tallahassee, Fla., August 1, 1927.

I, as Secretary of the Senate, do hereby certify this Journal, together with the Errata Sheet required by House Concurrent Resolution No. 20 (said errata sheet made out by myself) to be the true history of the Senate at its session of the regular sitting of the Legislature of A. D. 1927, as provided by the Constitution of the State of Florida, the said session having begun at noon, April 5, 1927, and adjourning sine die on June 3, 1927. House Concurrent Resolution No. 20 above referred to reads as follows:

“House Concurrent Resolution No. 20:

By Mr. McLeran (of Suwannee), Chairman Committee on Legislative Expense

BE IT RESOLVED, by the House of Representatives of the State of Florida, the Senate concurring: That the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives and the Secretary of the Senate be, and they are hereby authorized and directed to correct and revise the respective journals of the Senate and the House of Representatives for the last three days' legislative session, to the end that said journals as finally incorporated into the bound volumes may present a truthful and accurate account of the proceedings of the two Houses; and be it further

RESOLVED, by the House of Representatives, the Senate concurring: That the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives and the Secretary of the Senate be, and they are hereby further authorized and directed to prepare and cause to be printed with the bound volumes of the Journals of their respective Houses, an errata sheet which shall note any errors of form and substance in the said bound volumes covering the period of the entire session of 1927, and that said errata sheet when so made, attached and printed in

connection with the bound journals shall be and become a part thereof as a record of the history and proceedings of the legislative session of 1927."

I also certify that the late period of closing up the affairs of the Senate session of 1927 is due to the fact that the last installment of the bound or final journal was not delivered by the printer, to me, until July 30, 1927, and that upon this completed final journal is predicated the work of making out the demanded Errata Sheet, and that it has been impossible for me to complete my work accurately at an earlier date. Be it also remembered that the Secretary has to await the report of the Indexer as to inaccuracies of numbers and titles as a recheck for accuracy, and the Indexer has to have the last pages of Journal to proceed with indexing,

I have mailed the last day's Senate Journal to the Senators and to the members of the House of Representatives as required by House Concurrent Resolution No. 19, and I have performed all the duties entrusted to the Secretary pertaining to said session, turning over to the Secretary of State the sealed copy of the Executive Journal of the Senate with documents pertaining thereto, and all bills and duplicates thereof accounted for by the Bill Secretary of the Senate.

I thank the Senators and the Members of the House of Representatives for their uniform courtesy and consideration extended to me and my co-laborers at the desk during the trying session of 1927.
