

A bill to be entitled An Act to declare, designate and establish State Road designated as the Suwannee River Scenic Highway, as a part of the third preferential highway system of the State of Florida.

Was taken up and read a second time in full.

Senator Parker offered the following amendment to Senate Bill No. 771:

In Section 1, line 6, after the word "construct" and before the word "the" insert the following: "and maintain."

Senator Parker moved the adoption of the amendment.

Which was agreed to.

And the amendment was adopted.

Senator Getzen offered the following amendment to Senate Bill No. 771:

In Section 1, line 3, strike out the words Suwannee River and insert in lieu thereof the following: Parker Scenic.

Senator Getzen moved the adoption of the amendment.

Pending the adoption of the amendment, Senator Parker moved that the amendment be laid on the table.

Which was agreed to.

And it was so ordered.

Senator Parker moved that the rules be further waived and Senate Bill No. 771, as amended, be read a third time in full and put upon its passage.

Which was agreed to by a two-thirds vote.

And Senate Bill No. 771, as amended, was read a third time in full.

Upon the passage of the bill, as amended, the roll was called and the vote was:

Yeas—Mr. President; Senators Anderson, Andrews, Bell, Bradshaw, Caro, Dell, English, Futch, Gary, Getzen, Gomez, Harris, Harrison, Hinely, Hodges, Howell, Johns, King, Knabb, Parker, Swearingen, Taylor, Turner, Watson, Young—26.

Nays—Senators Chowning, Clarke, Hilburn—3.

So the bill passed, as amended, title as stated.

And Senate Bill No. 771 was referred to the Committee on Engrossed Bills.

Senator Futch moved that the rules be waived and the Senate do now reconsider the vote by which Senate Bill No. 458 passed the Senate.

Which was agreed to by a two-thirds vote.

And the Senate reconsidered the vote by which Senate Bill No. 458 passed the Senate.

By unanimous consent Senator Futch withdrew Senate Bill No. 458.

Senator Watson moved that the rules be waived and the Senate do now take up the consideration of Senate Bill No. 236 out of its order.

Which was agreed to by a two-thirds vote.

And—

Senate Bill No. 236:

A bill to be entitled An Act appropriating the sum of Ten Thousand (\$10,000.00) Dollars from the General Revenues of the State of Florida to be expended in conducting investigations in diseases directly affecting the crops now being produced in Southern Florida, in order that these diseases may be combatted and eradicated.

Was taken up and read a second time in full.

The Committee on Appropriations offered the following amendment to Senate Bill No. 236:

To amend the title:

A bill to be entitled An Act appropriating the sum of ten thousand (\$10,000.00) dollars each year, for two years, from the general revenues of the State of Florida to be expended in conducting investigations in diseases directly affecting the crops now being produced in Southern Florida, in order that these diseases may be combatted and eradicated.

Senator Watson moved the adoption of the amendment.

Which was agreed to.

And the amendment was adopted.

The Committee on Appropriations offered the following amendment to Senate Bill No. 236:

In Section 1, line 1, strike out the words: Ten thousand (\$10,000.00) dollars, and insert in lieu thereof the following: Ten thousand (\$10,000.00) dollars each year for two years.

Senator Watson moved the adoption of the amendment.

Which was agreed to.

And the amendment was adopted.

Senator Watson moved that the rules be further waived and Senate Bill No. 236, as amended, be read a third time in full and put upon its passage.

Which was agreed to by a two-thirds vote.

And Senate Bill No. 236, as amended, was read a third time in full.

Upon the passage of the bill, as amended, the roll was called and the vote was:

Yeas—Mr. President; Senators Adams, Anderson, Bell, Caro, Dell, Futch, Getzen, Harris, Harrison, Hodges, Johns, King, Knabb, Parrish, Swearingen, Taylor, Turner, Wagg, Watson, Young—21.

Nays—Senators Andrews, Bradshaw, Chowning, Clarke, Gary, Hilburn, Hinely, Howell, Neel, Parker—10.

So the bill passed, as amended, title as stated.

And Senate Bill No. 771 was referred to the Committee on Engrossed Bills.

Senator Howell moved that the Senate do now adjourn.

Which was agreed to.

And the Senate stood adjourned at 11:07 o'clock P. M., until 11:00 o'clock A. M., Friday, May 22, 1931.
