The following prayer was offered by the Chaplain:

INTRODUCTION OF BILLS AND JOINT RESOLUTIONS

S. B. No. 1-X—A bill to be entitled An Act to apportion the

representation of the State of Florida in the House of Representatives of the State of Florida; imposing certain duties upon the Governor of the State of Florida and the Commissioner of Agriculture of the State of Florida in connection therewith.

Which was read the first time by title only.

Senator Beacham moved that the rules be waived and Senate Bill No. 1-X be placed on the Calendar of Bills on Second Reading, without reference.

Which was agreed to by a two-thirds vote and it was so ordered.

By Senator Beacham—

S. B. No. 2-X—A bill to be entitled An Act to apportion the representation of the State of Florida in the Senate of the State of Florida.
