

By permission the following Senate Concurrent Resolution was introduced.

By Senator Sheldon—

Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 1-X—

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 3 of Article XVII, State Constitution, the Legislature at any regular, special or extraordinary session may by three-fourths vote of all members elected to each house determine that an emergency exists requiring an early decision by the Electors of the State, and

WHEREAS, it is the determination of three-fourths of the members of the Legislature of the State of Florida in extraordinary session now assembled that an emergency exists in the matter of redistricting the Senate of the State of Florida, which requires for its solution an emergency constitutional amendment under said Section 3 of Article XVII of the State Constitution.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the State of Florida:

1. That the Senate and the House of Representatives of the State of Florida in extraordinary session now assembled

have determined and do hereby determine that there exists a crisis in the State Government which is an emergency and requires the submission of an emergency constitutional amendment under Section 3 of Article XVII of the State Constitution providing for the creation of additional senatorial districts.

2. That the President of the Senate be and he is hereby authorized to appoint five Senators and the Speaker of the House of Representatives be and he is hereby authorized to appoint five members of the House; that said five Senators and five members of the House shall constitute a Committee to draft a proposed emergency constitutional amendment providing for the creation of additional Senatorial districts to meet the emergency situation now existing in the State Government which has required the calling of this extraordinary session.. Said committee shall report its proposed constitutional amendment to the Senate and to the House of Representatives at the earliest possible time.

Which was read the first time in full and went over under the rule.

Senator Gray moved that the Senate do now adjourn.

Which was agreed to and the Senate stood adjourned at 1:10 o'clock P. M., until 11:00 o'clock A. M., Thursday, June 7, 1945.
