SENATE BILLS ON THIRD READING

Senate Joint Resolution No. 13-X and Senate Bill No. 17-X were taken up in their order and the consideration thereof was informally passed.

SENATE BILLS ON SECOND READING

S. B. No. 8-X—A bill to be entitled An Act to apportion the representation of the State of Florida in the Senate of the State of Florida.

Was taken up in its order.

Senator Johns moved that the rules be waived and Senate Bill No. 8-X be read the second time by title only.

Which was agreed to by a two-thirds vote.

And Senate Bill No. 8-X was read the second time by title only and placed on the Calendar of Bills on Third Reading.

Senate Joint Resolutions Nos. 14-X and 15-X, Senate Bill No. 16-X and Senate Joint Resolution No. 18-X were taken up in their order and the consideration thereof was informally passed.

Senator Baynard moved that the rules be waived and when the Senate adjourns today it adjourn to reconvene at 4:00 o'clock P. M., Monday, July 9, 1945.
