Tuesday, July 10, 1945

The Senate convened at 11:00 o'clock A. M., pursuant to adjournment on Monday, July 9, 1945.

Senators Barringer, Black, Carroll and McKenzie were excused from attendance upon the session.

The following prayer was offered by the Chaplain:
