## INTRODUCTION OF RESOLUTIONS, MEMORIALS, BILLS AND JOINT RESOLUTIONS

By Senator Pope—

S. B. No. 1—A bill to be entitled An Act to amend the charter of the City of St. Augustine, Florida, by providing for election of city commissioners every two years, and changing the terms of office to provide that at each such election the two high men shall be elected for a term of four years, and the third high man shall be elected for a term of two years, and providing further that this Act shall not in any manner affect the term of office of any of the present commissioners.

Which was read the first time by title only.

Proof of publication of Notice was attached to Senate Bill No. 1 when it was introduced in the Senate, and evidence that such Notice has been published was established by the Senate, as required by Section 21, Article III of the Constitution of the State of Florida.

Senator Pope moved that the rules be waived and Senate Bill No. 1 be read the second time by title only.

Which was agreed to by a two-thirds vote.

And Senate Bill No. 1 was read the second time by title only.

Senator Pope moved that the rules be further waived and Senate Bill No. 1 be read the third time in full and put upon its passage.

Which was agreed to by a two-thirds vote.

And Senate Bill No. 1 was read the third time in full.

Which was agreed to by a two-thirds vote and it was so ordered.

Senator Melvin moved that the Senate adjourn.
