INTRODUCTION OF RESOLUTIONS, MEMORIALS, BILLS AND JOINT RESOLUTIONS

Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 32-X(56):

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR
A RECESS OF THE EXTRAORDINARY SESSION
OF THE LEGISLATURE.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF

FLORIDA, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING:

That this extraordinary session of the Legislature which is mandatorily required to reapportion the representation in the Legislature of the State of Florida by the provisions of Article VII, Section 3 of our Constitution, do stand recessed at the hour of 10:00 o'clock A. M., June 7, 1956, and do reconvene at the hour of 4:00 o'clock P. M., Tuesday, November 13, 1956.

Which was read the first time in full.

Senator Melvin moved that the rules be waived and Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 32-X(56) be read the second time in full and put upon its adoption.

Which was agreed to by a two-thirds vote.

And Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 32-X(56) was read the second time in full.

The question was put on the adoption of the Concurrent Resolution.
