### INTRODUCTION

By Senator Mathews—

SJR 3-X(65)—A joint resolution proposing an amendment to article VII of the constitution of Florida by amending the same to provide for the legislature of the state of Florida to consist of a senate and a house of representatives; requiring submission of any apportionment or reapportionment plan to the supreme court of the state of Florida; providing for legislative apportionment; providing for census.

Was read the first time in full and referred to the Committee on Legislative and Congressional Apportionment.

By Senators Hollahan and Haverfield—

SB 4-X(65)—A bill to be entitled An act relating to legis-

lative reapportionment; amending sections 10.01, 10.02, 10.03, and 10.04, Florida Statutes; providing for the reapportionment of the membership of the senate and the house of representatives of the legislature of the state of Florida; providing for creation of election districts; providing for determination of election districts in certain instances by the board of county commissioners of counties affected thereby; providing for an election; providing for reapportionment in 1973 and every ten (10) years thereafter by the cabinet; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Legislative and Congressional Apportionment.

By Senator Gautier—

SB 5-X(65)—A bill to be entitled An act providing for the apportionment of the membership of the legislature of the state of Florida; providing for one (1) house of not more than one hundred (100) members apportioned among the counties according to population; repealing sections 10.01, 10.02, 10.03 and 10.04, Florida Statutes; providing transitory and implementing provision; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Legislative and Congressional Apportionment.

By Senator Gautier—

SJR 6-X(65)—A joint resolution proposing an amendment to Article VII of the State Constitution relative to census and apportionment.

Was read the first time in full and referred to the Committee on Legislative and Congressional Apportionment.

By Senators Mathews and Price—

SJR 7-X(65)—A joint resolution proposing an amendment of article VII of the constitution of the state of Florida; providing for apportionment of the Florida legislature; providing for submission to the electors.

Was read the first time in full and referred to the Committee on Legislative and Congressional Apportionment.

On motion of Senator Johnson (6th), the Senate stood adjourned at 11:22 A. M. until 11:00 A. M., June 10, 1965.
