INTRODUCTION

By Senators Mathews, Whitaker, Price, Young and Hollahan—

SB 14-X(65)—A bill to be entitled An act relating to reapportionment of the Florida legislature; providing for twelve (12) legislative districts; providing that twelve (12) representatives and four (4) senators shall be assigned to each legislative district; providing procedures; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Legislative and Congressional Apportionment.

By Senator McCarty—

SJR 15-X(65)—A joint resolution proposing an amendment to Article VII of the Constitution of Florida by amending the same to provide for the legislature of the state of Florida to consist of a senate and a house of representatives; requiring submission of any apportionment or reapportionment plan to the supreme court of the state of Florida; providing for legislative apportionment; providing for census.

Was read the first time in full and referred to the Committee on Legislative and Congressional Apportionment.

By Senators Mathews, Price, Young and Whitaker—

SB 16-X(65)—A bill to be entitled An act to provide for the apportionment of the membership of the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Legislature of the State of Florida, replacing Chapter 10, Florida Statutes, providing for reapportionment after each federal decennial census of population and providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Legislative and Congressional Apportionment.

By two-thirds vote of the Senate the following bills were admitted for introduction and consideration:

By Senator Ryan—

SB 17-X(65)—A bill to be entitled An act to amend Chapter 59-1722 Laws of Florida, being an act relating to the town of Pembroke Park Broward County, Florida, by amending Section 18 to provide that the Vice-Mayor may sign checks and vouchers in the absence or disability of the Mayor; providing a new subsection to section 8 authorizing the furnishing of group insurance for employees and officers of the town and paying a portion of the premiums therefor; and providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title.

Evidence of notice and publication was established by the Senate as to SB 17-X(65).

On motions of Senator Ryan, the rules were waived by two-thirds vote and SB 17-X(65) was read the second time by title, the third time in full and passed, title as stated. The vote was: Yeas—44. Nays—None.

SB 18-X(65)—A bill to be entitled An act relating to Broward county, erosion district; amending section 10 of chapter 63-1175, Laws of Florida, by adding sub-section (n); granting the district power to provide funds to enable municipalities or other governmental agencies to pay for local erosion prevention projects; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title.

Evidence of notice and publication was established by the Senate as to SB 18-X(65).

On motions of Senator Ryan, the rules were waived by two-thirds vote and SB 18-X(65) was read the second time by title, the third time in full and passed, title as stated. The vote was: Yeas—44. Nays—None.

By Senator Carraway—

SB 19-X(65)—A bill to be entitled An act relating to county

officers, compensation, in any county of the state having a population of not less than seventy-four thousand two hundred (74,200) nor more than seventy-six thousand (76,000), according to the latest official decennial census; providing compensation that shall be paid certain county officers from January 1, 1965 to October 1, 1965; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title. On motions of Senator Carraway, the rules were waived by two-thirds vote and SB 19-X(65) was read the second time by title, the third time in full and passed, title as stated. The vote was: Yeas—44. Nays—None.
