REPORT OF COMMITTEE

The Committee on Legislative and Congressional Apportionment recommends the following pass:

SB 10-X(65) with 4 amendments

The bill was placed on the Calendar.

On motion of Senator Williams, SB 10-X(65) was recommitted to the Committee on Legislative and Congressional Apportionment.

On motion of Senator Williams, the Committee on Legislative and Congressional Apportionment was granted an additional day for the consideration of all bills and joint resolutions now referred to the Committee.

INTRODUCTION

By Senator McCarty—

SJR 20-X(65)—A joint resolution proposing an amendment to Article VII of the Florida Constitution; providing for apportionment of the Florida legislature and a special election; providing for submission to the electors; providing for census.

Was read the first time in full and referred to the Committee on Legislative and Congressional Apportionment.

By Senator McCarty—

SB 21-X(65)—A bill to be entitled An act relating to legislative apportionment; amending section 10.01, Florida Statutes, providing for apportionment of the senate of the legislature of the state of Florida; creating forty-nine (49) senatorial districts with a membership of forty-nine (49) members; amending section 10.03, Florida Statutes, providing for the apportionment of the house of representatives of the legislature of the state of Florida by providing for a membership of ninety-two (92) members; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Legislative and Congressional Apportionment.

By two-thirds vote of the Senate the following bill was admitted for introduction and consideration:

By Senator Mathews—

SB 22-X(65)—A bill to be entitled An act providing that in all counties of the state having a population of four hundred fifty thousand (450,000) or more according to the last federal state-wide decennial census and not having home rule under the constitution, any child shall be admitted at the beginning of the school term or at any time during the first month of the school year for whom the sixth anniversary of his or her birth shall occur on or before the next succeeding December 31, and providing for an effective date.

Was read the first time by title. On motions of Senator Mathews, the rules were waived by two-thirds vote and SB 22-X(65) was read the second time by title, the third time in full and passed, title as stated. The vote was: Yeas—44. Nays—None.
