### INTRODUCTION

By Senators Mathews, Price, Johnson (19th), McCarty and Whitaker—

SB 23-X(65)—A bill to be entitled An act to provide for the apportionment of the membership of the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Legislature of the State of Florida, replacing Chapter 10, Florida Statutes, providing for reapportionment after each federal decennial census of population and providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Legislative and Congressional Apportionment.

By Senator McCarty—

SB 24-X(65)—A bill to be entitled An act relating to legislative apportionment; amending section 10.01, Florida Statutes, providing for apportionment of the senate of the legislature of the state of Florida; creating senatorial districts with a membership of fifty (50) members; amending section 10.03, Florida Statutes, providing for the apportionment of the house of representatives of the legislature of the state of Florida by providing for a membership of one hundred (100) members; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Legislative and Congressional Apportionment.

By two-thirds vote of the Senate the following bills were admitted for introduction and consideration:

By Senator Mathews—

SB 25-X(65)—A bill to be entitled An act relating to bottle clubs, licensing, in any county of the state having a population of not less than four hundred thousand (400,000) nor more than nine hundred thousand (900,000), according to the latest official decennial census; requiring bottle clubs in such counties to obtain licenses from the state beverage department; providing for a license tax.

Was read the first time by title. On motions of Senator Mathews, the rules were waived by two-thirds vote and SB 25-X(65) was read the second time by title, the third time in full and passed, title as stated. The vote was: Yeas—44. Nays—None.

SB 26-X(65)—A bill to be entitled An act relating to extending and enlarging the corporate limits of cities in all counties in the state having a population of not less than fifty-six thousand (56,000) nor more than sixty-one thousand (61,000) according to the latest official decennial census; providing that certain legal descriptions in senate bill 1268 as enacted by the 1965 legislature are corrected; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title. On motions of Senator Daniel, the rules were waived by two-thirds vote and SB 26-X(65) was read the second time by title, the third time in full and passed, title as stated. The vote was: Yeas—44. Nays—None.

By Representative Allsworth of Broward and others—

HB 18-X—A bill to be entitled An act relating to and providing the salary of the county solicitor in any county of the state having a population of more than three hundred thousand (300,000), according to the latest official decennial census; providing the payment of said compensation shall be retroactive to January 1, 1965; providing an effective date.

By Representative Land of Orange and others—

HB 19-X—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the city of Orlando, Orange county, policemen's pension fund; amending section 5 of house bill no. 526 enacted in the regular session of the 1965 legislature; correcting error in language which refers to "fire department" rather than to "police department"; providing an effective date.
