SB 132—A bill to be entitled An act providing for and relating to investigators for circuit courts of counties having a population of not less than three hundred ninety thousand (390,000) nor more than four hundred fifty thousand (450,000) according to the latest official decennial census; providing for employment, qualifications, and compensation of investigators; declaring the same to be a county purpose; providing an effective date.

INTRODUCTION

By Senator Stone—

SB 137—A bill to be entitled An act authorizing the state to appeal from a pre-trial order quashing a search warrant and/or suppressing evidence obtained by search and seizure or suppressing a confession or admission made by a defendant; prescribing the time for taking such an appeal; providing for stays pending such appeals; providing for the release on his own recognizance of each bailable defendant as to whom the cause is stayed; and prescribing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary "A".

By Senators Stone and Shevin—

SB 138—A bill to be entitled An act relating to probation of defendant in criminal cases; amending section 948.01, Florida Statutes, by renumbering present subsection (4) as subsection (5) and adding new subsection (4); permitting court, where imposing sentence to county jail, to direct defendant to be placed on probation upon completion of any portion of the term of sentence; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary "A".

SB 139—A bill to be entitled An act relating to election records; amending chapter 98, Florida Statutes, by adding section 98.182; authorizing the supervisors of elections to destroy certain election records which have been kept more than one (1) year; providing an effective date.

By Senator Gibson—

SB 140—A bill to be entitled An act relating to elections; amending section 97.081(5), Florida Statutes; providing that registration books of freeholders be kept closed at least thirty (30) days prior to a bond election; providing an effective date.

By Senator Gibson—

SB 141—A bill to be entitled An act relating to elections; amending section 101.47(12), (13), Florida Statutes; providing that the delivery of identification slips and other supplies may be by enclosing and locking in the voting machine or enclosed in a sealed container; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary "B".

SB 142—A bill to be entitled An act relating to bingo, authorizing certain civic, service, educational, fraternal, non-profit and religious organizations to conduct bingo games; prescribing manner in which games shall be conducted; providing for issuing of permits and establishing fees; providing for limitations on jackpots; providing penalties for violations; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Ethics and Privileged Businesses; and Judiciary "A".

SB 143—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the attorney general, statutory revision department; amending section 16.44(8), Florida Statutes, by removing the duty of the department to draft legislation for members of the legislature; providing an effective date.

By Senator Wilson—

SB 144—A bill to be entitled An act relating to voting, absentee ballots; amending sections 101.62, 101.63, 101.65(1) and 101.66, all Florida Statutes, to provide that application for absentee ballot may be made by oral communication to the supervisor; providing that application and ballot may be delivered at same time; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary "B".

By Senators Thomas, Friday and de la Parte—

SB 145—A bill to be entitled An act relating to hospitalization of the mentally ill; providing definitions; providing criminal penalties for wrongfully causing hospitalization; protecting good faith actions; extending voluntary procedures to facilities other than state hospitals; providing emergency and non-emergency procedures for involuntary hospitalization of the mentally ill in facilities other than the state hospitals; providing for release of involuntary patients and protection of rights of patients; providing for payment of care for patients; and providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Mental Health, Retardation and State Institutions; and Judiciary "B".

SB 146—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the inter-American center authority, beverage licenses; amending section 561.20(7), Florida Statutes, providing issuance of special licenses within confines of inter-American center; removing limitation of licenses to be issued; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Ethics and Privileged Businesses.

By Senators Hollahan and Haverfield—

SB 147—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the inter-American center authority; amending section 554.07(13), Florida Statutes, authorizing the authority to provide educational opportunities to visitors, student guides and others at interama; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary "B".

By Senators Hollahan and Haverfield—

SB 148—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the inter-American center authority; amending chapter 554, Florida Statutes, by adding section 554.201, authorizing the authority to secure public liability insurance and waiver of immunity from such liability to extent of any public liability insurance carried; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary "B".

By Senators Hollahan and Haverfield—

SB 149—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the inter-American center authority; amending section 554.11, Florida Statutes, relating to trust funds and their expenditure; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Judiciary "B"; and Finance and Taxation.

By Senator Chiles—

SB 150—A bill to be entitled An act relating to legislative staff internships; creating a sponsoring committee and defining its authorities; providing for designation of cooperating universities; authorizing programs paid from legislative expense and authorizing programs to be paid in part from donated funds; and providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Rules and Calendar; and Appropriations.

By Senators Young, Fincher and Weissenborn—

SB 151—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the federal highway safety act of 1966; authorizing the governor to contract and cooperate with federal and state agencies in obtaining the benefits of the federal highway safety act of 1966 for Florida; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Transportation and Safety; and Governmental Reorganization.

By Senators Young and Fincher—

SB 152—A bill to be entitled An act relating to drivers' licenses; amending subsection 322.27(2), Florida Statutes, relating to the point system; providing for the lowering of the maximum number of points assignable to certain violations; providing that the department of public safety shall assign the maximum points if the court having jurisdiction fails to specify the number of points on the conviction report; and providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Transportation and Safety; and Judiciary "A".

By Senators Young and Fincher—

SB 153—A bill to be entitled An act relating to drivers' licenses; amending section 322.05, Florida Statutes; raising the age for a restricted license to fifteen years; requiring the possession of an operator's permit or license for ninety days prior to obtaining a chauffeur's license; requiring a minor under sixteen years of age to be accompanied by a licensed operator or chauffeur who is at least twenty-one years of age; and providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Transportation and Safety; and Judiciary "A".

SB 154—A bill to be entitled An act relating to regulation of traffic on highways; amending section 317.234, Florida Statutes; providing for electronic, electrical, mechanical, or other

speed calculating devices; providing for power of arrest and admissibility of evidence by authorizing arrest by peace officers operating such devices whether stationed on the ground or in the air; providing for prima facie evidence; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Transportation and Safety; and Judiciary "B".

SB 155—A bill to be entitled An act relating to Florida state hospitals; repealing section 394.014, Florida Statutes, authorizing and directing the board of commissioners of state institutions to establish a branch of Florida state hospital in Hernando county; providing an effective date.

WHEREAS, Robert W. Sarnoff, President of Radio Corporation of America, has through his vision made significant advances for the betterment of the people of Florida and the people of the world, in the still developing communication resources of television and radio through innovative leadership in providing cultural and educational programming by the National Broadcasting Company, as evidenced by creation of the NBC Opera, Continental Classroom and many other informational programs, and in creation of the world organization of broadcasters to meet the problems of global television, and

WHEREAS, this great citizen's honors from colleges and universities, professional societies and civic organizations express the scope of his civic life and magnificent public service in demonstrating that the communication possibilities of today are the promises of tomorrow, and

WHEREAS, confidence has been placed in the future progress of Florida by the location of Radio Corporation of America facilities in the state, and

WHEREAS, Florida Atlantic University, a leading university in the application of television and the computer in its instructional programs and library facilities, and which has a special mandate to emphasize in its instructional programs the tools made possible through electronics, has fittingly chosen to honor Mr. Sarnoff who has contributed so much in these same areas, NOW, THEREFORE,

Be It Resolved by the Senate of the State of Florida:

That on behalf of the people of Florida this Senate expresses to Mr. Robert W. Sarnoff the most sincere appreciation of his contributions to the development of Florida and to the advancement of human knowledge and world understanding.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution, signed by the President of the Senate with the Great Seal of the State of Florida attached, be presented to Mr. Robert W. Sarnoff as a tangible token of the sentiments here expressed.

SB 163—A bill to be entitled An act relating to retirement; amending subsection (1)(b) of section 238.05 and subsection (2) of section 122.24 Florida statutes; providing that certain state university system personnel may reject participation in the teachers retirement system by electing to participate in the state and county officers and employees retirement system; providing an effective date.

SB 166—A bill to be entitled An act relating to driver education for minors; amending section 322.111, Florida Statutes; deleting the exception to the requirement of driver education for minors; providing an effective date.

SB 167—A bill to be entitled An act relating to chemical tests as to intoxication of persons operating a motor vehicle within this state; providing for implied consent; adding new sections 322.261 and 322.262, Florida Statutes; providing for suspension of drivers' licenses of persons refusing to submit to such tests; providing for presumptions of intoxication based upon the results of such tests; providing for making of rules and regulations; and providing an effective date.

SB 169—A bill to be entitled An act relating to regulation of traffic on highways; revising section 317.221, Florida Statutes; providing a change in speed limits on certain highways for certain types of vehicles; providing an effective date.

SB 170—A bill to be entitled An act relating to highway traffic, right turns on red; amending section 317.061(3)(a), Florida Statutes, relating to traffic facing a steady red signal; authorizing right turns in certain instances; providing an effective date.

SB 171—A bill to be entitled An act relating to drivers' licenses; amending sections 322.01, 322.18 and 322.21, Florida Statutes; providing for the central issuance of drivers' licenses by the department of public safety; providing for certificates of eligibility for renewal of licenses; establishing the necessary machinery therefor; and providing effective dates.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Transportation and Safety; and Judiciary "B".

SB 172—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the regulation of motor vehicles, trucks; amending chapter 317, Florida Statutes, by adding section 317.602 to require owners, licensees and drivers of trucks hauling sand, gravel, dirt, and marl to have the trucks equipped with and covered by tarpaulins or similar covers when on public highways; and providing an effective date.

SB 174—A bill to be entitled An act relating to regulation of traffic on highways; amending subsection 317.371(4), Florida Statutes, relating to use of directional signals when starting from a parked position; repealing subsection 317.291(3), Florida Statutes; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Transportation and Safety; and Judiciary "B".

SB 175—A bill to be entitled An act relating to regulation of traffic on highways; amending chapter 317, Florida Statutes; providing for all school buses to meet the requirements of chapter 234 under regulations prescribed by the department of public safety; providing for physical requirements for school bus drivers; providing for annual inspection of school buses; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Transportation and Safety; and Education-Public Schools and Junior Colleges.

SB 176—A bill to be entitled An act relating to transportation of school children; amending section 234.041, Florida Statutes, relating to the endorsement of the certificate of title in the sale of any school bus; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Transportation and Safety; and Education-Public Schools and Junior Colleges.

By Senators Young and Fincher—

SB 177—A bill to be entitled An act relating to regulation of traffic on highways; amending section 317.032, Florida Statutes, relating to the sale and use of certain traffic-control devices; authorizing the state road department to permit traffic-control devices not in conformity with the uniform system; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Transportation and Safety; and Public Roads and Highways.

By Senators Young, Fincher and Weissenborn—

SB 178—A bill to be entitled An act relating to regulation of traffic on highways; amending section 317.021, Florida Statutes, relating to a manual for a uniform system of traffic-control devices; authorizing the road department to revise and update the same; authorizing the road department to call upon various governmental agencies for assistance in so doing; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Transportation and Safety; and Public Roads and Highways.

SB 179—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the driver license compact; amending chapter 322, Florida Statutes; providing for an interstate exchange of information concerning convictions of offenses related to the operation of motor vehicles; providing for administration of such exchange program; and providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Congressional Liaison, Intergovernmental and Veterans Affairs and Communications; and Transportation and Safety.

SB 180—A bill to be entitled An act relating to investment of funds by state board of administration; amending section 215.44, Florida Statutes, to authorize the board of administration only to invest agency funds and trust funds as limited by any trust agreement; amending section 215.47, Florida Statutes, to revise and broaden the types of securities in which investments may be made; amending section 215.48, Florida Statutes, by deleting the requirement of subsequent ratification by an agency on whose behalf the board of administration has acted; amending section 215.49, Florida Statutes, to require each agency to transfer funds to the board of administration for investment and to notify board of securities in each fund; amending section 215.50, Florida Statutes, relating to custody of securities, collection of income thereon, and deleting reference to prorating income; amending sections 215.52 and 215.53, Florida Statutes, by deleting the reference to section 215.54, Florida Statutes; amending sections 239.34 and 529.072, Florida Statutes, relating to investment of the ex-confederate soldiers' and sailors' home endowment trust fund and state park moneys; repealing sections 122.14, 215.54, 253.64, 284.09, 321.16, 339.01, 339.02, 339.03, 344.27 and subsection 236.601(6), Florida Statutes; providing an effective date.

SB 181—A bill to be entitled An act to amend Section 193.201, Florida Statutes, creating county agricultural zoning boards; providing that boards of county commissioners, tax assessors and agricultural agents shall be members thereof; providing boards to zone all agricultural lands in county on an annual basis; providing for a return of agricultural lands; providing for reclassification of lands zoned agricultural and standards therefor; providing definitions of agricultural lands; providing factors to be used in assessing agricultural lands.

Dear Sir:

Pursuant to the authority vested in me as Governor of Florida under the provisions of Article III, Section 28, of the Constitution of this State, I hereby transmit to you, with my objections, Senate Bill No. 218, enacted by the Legislature of 1965, and entitled:

"AN ACT RELATING TO STRUCTURAL PEST CONTROL; AMENDING SECTION 482.132, FLORIDA STATUTES, PROVIDING FOR THE QUALIFICATION FOR CERTIFICATE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE."

I am informed by the introducer of this legislation that the omission of a conjunctive word in the bill renders the same contrary to his intention. Accordingly, he has asked that I withhold my approval from Senate Bill No. 218.

For this reason I am withholding my approval from Senate Bill No. 218, and do hereby veto same.
