INTRODUCTION

By Senators Weissenborn, Hollahan, Poston, Shevin and Stone—

SB 665—A bill to be entitled An act relating to taxation, assessments; creating Section 193.251, Florida Statutes, relating to the manner in which the tax assessor shall note and record changes in assessment rolls and providing that all changes be signed and dated, and providing for documentary changes and establishing a penalty for violation; and providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Finance and Taxation; and Judiciary "B".

By Senators Weissenborn, Hollahan, Poston and Stone—

SB 666—A bill to be entitled An act relating to taxation, assessors, to amend Chapter 193, Florida Statutes, creating Section 193.231, Florida Statutes, providing for reward in the

amount of half of the back taxes recovered to persons who give information pertaining to property not on the assessment roll, resulting in recovery of back taxes under Section 193.23, Florida Statutes.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Finance and Taxation; and Judiciary "B".

By Senators Weissenborn, Hollahan and Shevin—

SB 667—A bill to be entitled An act relating to taxation, personal property assessments, assessors; providing subpoena power to compel taxpayers to furnish books and records for assessment purposes, by amending Chapter 200, Florida Statutes, by creating Section 200.041, and providing for the jurisdiction of any state court in the county to enforce the same, and a penalty for contempt.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Finance and Taxation; and Judiciary "B".

By Senators Weissenborn, Hollahan, Poston, Shevin and Stone—

SB 668—A bill to be entitled An act relating to taxation, assessments, notice by tax assessors of changes in assessments to taxpayers, and providing for effective date, and creating Section 193.261, Florida Statutes.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Finance and Taxation; and Judiciary "B".

By Senators Weissenborn, Hollahan, Poston, Shevin and Stone—

SB 669—A bill to be entitled An act relating to assessment of personal property, to amend Chapter 200, Florida Statutes, by creating Section 200.081, Florida Statutes, to provide a maximum assessment by the tax assessor on personal property of furnishings and household goods located in a single family residential dwelling, except upon physical examination or taxpayer's return, and providing for an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Finance and Taxation; and Judiciary "B".

By Senators Weissenborn, Hollahan, Poston, Shevin and Stone—

SB 670—A bill to be entitled An act providing an additional method of relief to owners of homestead properties from over-assessment thereof by tax assessors, notwithstanding other provisions of Chapter 193; and providing for extending the time to challenge the property assessment on homestead property.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Finance and Taxation; and Judiciary "B".

By Senators Weissenborn, Fincher, Spencer, Shevin, Hollahan, Stone, Gong, Poston and Haverfield—

SR 671—A resolution expressing deep sympathy and regret over the passing of Theodore (Ted) Semple.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Apportionment, Resolutions and Memorials.

By Senators Spencer, Shevin and Fincher—

SB 672—A bill to be entitled An act relating to sentences in capital criminal cases, amending chapter 921, Florida Statutes, by adding section 921.26; providing for reduction of all death sentences to sentences of life imprisonment; providing for revocation of such reduced sentence for conviction of subsequent capital offense prior to expiration of first sentence; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary "B".

By Senator Stolzenburg—

SM 673—A memorial to the congress of the United States to provide for the retention for the states where collected of five per cent (5%) of all federal taxes, except excise taxes, collected therein, for the remittance of said percentage of taxes collected to the appropriate state officer, and for the use by the states for general state purposes of amounts so retained and remitted.

Was read the first time in full and referred to the Committees on Apportionment, Resolutions and Memorials; and Finance and Taxation.

By Senators Saylor, Young, Horne and Fisher—

SB 674—A bill to be entitled An act relating to aircraft, operation; amending section 860.13, Florida Statutes, making it unlawful to operate an aircraft while under the influence of alcoholic beverages, narcotic drugs, barbiturates or other stimulants; amending chapter 860, Florida Statutes, by adding section 860.131, making reckless operation of an aircraft unlawful; providing penalties; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Transportation and Safety; and Judiciary "A".

By Senator Haverfield—

SB 675—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the department of public safety; providing for a highway patrol examining station to be located in Dade county; providing for acquisition of property for said station; providing an appropriation therefor; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Transportation and Safety; and Appropriations.

By permission, Senator Haverfield withdrew SB 676 from the Senate.

By Senators Horne, Barron, Friday, Mathews, Hollahan, Thomas, Boyd and Edwards—

SB 677—A bill to be entitled An act amending sections 30.36-30.41 Florida statutes, renaming and reconstituting the Florida sheriffs bureau as the Florida state bureau of investigation, defining its powers, duties and responsibilities, providing an appropriation and an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Governmental Reorganization.

By Senators Bafalis, Thomas, Barrow, Barron and de la Parte—

SB 678—A bill to be entitled An act relating to pharmacists; amending section 465.071(1), Florida Statutes, to provide an additional method of qualifying for the board of pharmacy examination by certain applicants; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Health and Welfare.

By Senators Cross and Gibson—

SB 679—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Suwannee River Authority; providing an appropriation from the general revenue fund of the state to mark shoals, clear logs, and snags from certain sections of the Suwannee River; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

By Senator Mathews—

SB 680—A bill to be entitled An act relating to confirmation of appointments by the senate; amending section 112.071 (1), (b), Florida Statutes, to provide that appointments made by the governor requiring senate confirmation shall, when the senate is in vacancy, be sent to the secretary of the senate; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Rules and Calendar.

By Senator Mathews—

SB 681—A bill to be entitled An act relating to workmen's compensation review by providing for the establishment of a commission of compensation review to hear and decide reviews relating to claims under the Florida workmen's compensation law, and by providing for the elimination of review of orders of deputy commissioners by the Florida industrial commission; and by providing that review from such orders shall be to the commission herein created, and providing for promulgation and adoption of rules by the commission; and providing for the designation, appointment, and compensation of trial commissioners; amending chapter 440, Florida Statutes; providing

for full time review and trial commissioners; and providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Insurance and Judiciary "B".

By Senator Mathews—

SB 682—A bill to be entitled An act relating to common trust funds established by banks and trust companies and investments of such common trust funds and mingling of funds; amending section 660.12, Florida Statutes, to eliminate the prohibition against investment of common trust funds in mortgages; and providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Banking, Securities and Loans.

By Senator Mathews—

SB 683—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the definition of the term "dealer" within the contemplation of the uniform sale of securities law; amending section 517.02(4), Florida Statutes, to enlarge the exclusions from the term "dealer" by excluding banks or trust companies authorized to exercise trust powers in this state which perform certain services as agent or in other fiduciary capacities; and providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Banking, Securities and Loans.

By Senators Gunter and Thomas—

SB 684—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Florida citrus code; amending chapter 601, Florida Statutes, by adding section 601.991, making it unlawful to serve or vend citrus substitutes in public places, unless notice of the substitute is prominently displayed; requiring individual labeling; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Citrus.

By Senators Gunter, Gibson, Horne, Boyd, de la Parte, Knopke, Thomas and Hollahan—

SB 685—A bill to be entitled An act relating to agricultural and livestock exhibition buildings for the purpose of fairs; providing an appropriation; and providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Agriculture and Livestock; and Appropriations.

By Senator Edwards—

SB 686—A bill to be entitled An act designating and naming an interstate rest facility on interstate 4 in Seminole county as the Richey Green interstate rest facility; providing for suitable plaques to be erected thereon by the state road department; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Public Roads and Highways.

By Senator Edwards—

SB 687—A bill to be entitled An act prohibiting corporations which shall have refused to pay any of its notes or other obligations when due from making certain transfers to any officer or director or stockholder of such corporation and specifying circumstances under which any such prohibited transfer shall be void and providing for personal liability of directors or officers of a corporation violating provisions of the act; amending section 608.55, Florida Statutes, by eliminating certain provisions thereof; and providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary "B".

By Senators Clayton, Horne and O'Grady—

SB 688—A bill to be entitled An act relating to limitation of prosecutions; amending section 932.05, Florida Statutes, to provide that the limitation on prosecution provided therein shall not apply to embezzlement by a fiduciary until after discovery of the offense; providing effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary "A".

By Senator Stone—

SJR 689—A joint resolution proposing an amendment to section 7 of Article X of the State Constitution, relating to the exemption of homesteads from taxation.

Was read the first time in full and referred to the Committee on Rules and Calendar.

By Senators Saylor, McClain, Fisher, Lane and Bell—

SB 690—A bill to be entitled An act relating to abortion; amending section 782.10, Florida Statutes; defining unjustified abortion; defining justifiable abortion; providing for consents and physicians' certification; licensed hospital and failure to comply; providing that abortion certificates filed with state board of health not subject to public inspection; providing for exceptions for prevention of pregnancy under certain circumstances; amending section 797.01, Florida Statutes; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Health and Welfare; and Judiciary "A".

By Senator Gibson—

SB 691—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Suwannee River authority; amending chapter 57-700, Laws of Florida, by adding section 7A to authorize said authority to make investigations in connection with water pollution on or adjacent to the Suwannee River and its tributaries, to enforce all state laws relating to water pollution on said waters and to institute and maintain legal proceedings to enforce said section; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Rules and Calendar.

By Senator Henderson—

SB 692—A bill to be entitled An act relating to motor vehicle license plates; amending section 320.06, Florida Statutes, to prescribe permanent color combinations for license plates; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Transportation and Safety.

By Senators Broxson, Askew, Mathews, Clayton, Gunter and Plante—

SB 693—A bill to be entitled An act relating to elections; amending section 101.35(1), Florida Statutes; providing for preparation of voting machines; providing for notice of sealing; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary "B".

By Senator Thomas—

SB 694—A bill to be entitled An act relating to submerged lands, biological surveys; amending section 253.12; providing that prior to the sale of sovereignty tidal and submerged lands by the trustees of the internal improvement trust fund, the board of conservation shall make a study and recommendations which shall be binding on the trustees; amending sections 253.122 and 253.124, Florida Statutes, to provide a similar procedure pursuant to the setting of bulkhead lines and the granting of fill permits; providing that the trustees may approve or reject applications approved by local governing bodies; amending section 253.123 to prohibit the removal of sand, rock or earth from navigable waters and submerged lands channelward of bulkhead lines with certain exceptions; providing penalties; amending section 253.126, Florida Statutes; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Water Conservation, Salt Water and Natural Resources.

By Senator Thomas—

SB 695—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the regulation of public utilities supplying water and sewer service, or both, to the public for compensation; amending section 367.01, subsection (7) of section 367.02, sections 367.03, 367.04, 367.05, 367.06, 367.07, 367.09, 367.11, 367.12, 367.14, 367.15, 367.17, 367.20, and 367.22, Florida Statutes, for the purpose of defining the public utilities affected by this act; prescribing the jurisdiction, powers and duties of the Florida public service

commission with reference to the regulation of public utilities; requiring public utilities to obtain certificates of public convenience and necessity from the commission and prescribing the procedure therefor and the requirements thereof; prescribing the duties of public utilities concerning rates and service; establishing the procedure for fixing and changing the rates to be charged for services furnished by said public utilities; requiring the commission to review all rate increases previously granted under existing laws within a specified period; providing for judicial review of commission orders; prescribing penalties for violations of this act; requiring persons to testify before the commission and providing for immunity from prosecution for certain incriminations; declaring the regulation of said public utilities to be in the public interest and their regulation an exercise of the police power of the state; repealing all laws in conflict herewith; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Ethics and Privileged Businesses; and Judiciary "B".

WHEREAS, the new Florida Baptist College chartered in April, 1967, and to be built in Palm Beach Gardens, Palm Beach County, will be a vital addition to higher education in Florida, and

WHEREAS, the College will become a cultural beacon on the lower East Coast of Florida, and

WHEREAS, the College will be built in the best American free-enterprise tradition, and

WHEREAS, colleges are known for providing assistance to governments, civic groups and other organizations, and

WHEREAS, it is a recognized fact that additional higher educational facilities are desperately needed, and

WHEREAS, the College will become a new multi-million dollar industry, and

WHEREAS, no local, state or federal taxes will be used to build or operate the College, NOW, THEREFORE,

Be It Resolved by the Senate of the State of Florida:

That the Florida Senate commends, recognizes and salutes the Florida Baptist Convention and the Board of Trustees of the College for the outstanding work they are doing to create and found this new institution of higher learning.

Was read the first time by title. On motions by Senator Thomas, SR 696 was read the second time in full and unanimously adopted.

SB 697—A bill to be entitled An act to create and establish the department of alcoholic beverages; providing an executive board; providing for headquarters and office space; authorizing a seal; providing for employment of a director; providing for bond; transferring property, supplies and equipment to new department; preserving pending causes, proceedings, existing notices, orders, certificates, permits and licenses; transferring employees; preserving application of chapter 110, Florida Stat-

utes; amending section 561.01, Florida Statutes, by adding subsections (15) and (16); amending sections 561.02 and 561.05, Florida Statutes; adding sections 561.011, 561.061 and 561.111, Florida Statutes; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Ethics and Privileged Businesses; and Governmental Reorganization.

By Senators Weissenborn, Hollahan and Shevin—

SB 698—A bill to be entitled An act relating to taxation, assessors, prohibiting assessor, deputy assessor or employee from receiving remuneration for services rendered to any person, firm or company controlling or managing property in the county and providing a penalty, by creating Section 193.77 of the Florida Statutes.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Ethics and Privileged Businesses.

By Senator Reuter—

SB 699—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the state road department, bridge designation; providing that the bridge constructed across the Indian river at the city of Cocoa be named the "Hubert Humphrey Bridge"; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Public Roads and Highways.

By Senator Fincher—

SB 700—A bill to be entitled An act relating to summer thoroughbred horse racing; amending sections 550.084, 550.085, 550.086, 550.087 and 550.088, all Florida Statutes; changing racing dates, fixing tax, commission and breakage, fixing racing dates, fixing daily purses and fixing allocation of certain racing days respectively; creating section 550.091, Florida Statutes, regulating breeders' awards; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Ethics and Privileged Businesses; and Finance and Taxation.

By Senators Fincher and Shevin—

SB 701—A bill to be entitled An act providing that no reporter be required to make known the source of any information secured while any reporter is engaged in the work of, or connected with or employed by any newspaper or any press association, or any radio broadcasting station, or any television station; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary "A".

By Senator Fincher—

SB 702—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the secretary of state; amending chapter 15, Florida Statutes, adding a new section 15.15, providing for the secretary of state to publish in his discretion a summary of all instruments filed; providing for the establishment of a fee for such services; providing for any fees collected to be deposited in the general revenue fund; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary "B".

By Senator Stone—

SB 703—A bill to be entitled An act relating to medical assistance for the needy; amending chapter 409.45, Florida Statutes; providing for the state department to provide medical services; creating a medical assistance advisory committee; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Health and Welfare; and Appropriations.

By Senators Stone and Johnson—

SB 704—A bill to be entitled An act relating to teachers' retirement system; amending section 238.01(15), Florida Statutes, to define average final compensation for teachers retiring because of disability; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Retirement and Claims; and Appropriations.

MOTIONS RELATING TO COMMITTEE REFERENCE

The motion by Senator Ott that SB 677 be withdrawn from the Committee on Governmental Reorganization and re-referred to the Committee on Anti-Crime failed.

Senator Askew raised a point of order concerning the committee reference of SB 677. The Chair ruled the point was well taken and SB 677 was also referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

On motions by Senator Haverfield, by two-thirds vote, SB 123 was withdrawn from the Committee on Judiciary "B" and from the Senate.

On motion by Senator Askew, the Committee on Appropriations was granted an additional 15 days for the consideration of all Bills now in the Committee.

On motion by Senator Horne, the Committee on Judiciary "B" was granted an additional 10 days for the consideration of all Bills now in the Committee.

On motion by Senator Hollahan, the Committee on Governmental Reorganization was granted an additional 5 days for the consideration of Senate Bills 292 and 291.

Unanimous consent was granted Senator Pope to take up out of order—

HB 482—A bill to be entitled An act authorizing the Board of County Commissioners of St. Johns County, Florida, to fix, change and post the speed or wake zones for all boats or other water traffic, other than a seaplane, on the waters of St. Johns County, Florida; providing a penalty for violation thereof; providing for the posting of signs of such speed or wake zones, and providing for an effective date.

On motions by Senator Pope, the rules were waived and HB 482 was read the second time by title, the third time in full and passed, title as stated. The vote was: Yeas—47 Nays—None

(j) That he has submitted a sworn statement of contributions and expenditures incurred prior to the time of qualifying and since the last preceding general election. Such statement shall be filed at the time and with the officer before whom said person qualifies as a candidate.

A printed copy of the statement is required to be furnished to the candidate by the executive committee of said party and said sworn statement shall be substantially in the following form:
