By Senator Chiles—

SB 1415—A bill to be entitled An act relating to public education; amending section 231.29, Florida Statutes, relating to evaluation of effectiveness of all personnel in county school systems; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Education—Public Schools and Junior Colleges.

By Senator Haverfield—

SB 1416—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the department of motor vehicles, license plates; amending section 320.35, Florida Statutes; requiring all motor vehicles as de-

fined in section 320.01(1), Florida Statutes, including motor vehicles used for housing accommodations, to be registered according to law and a fee paid therefor; requiring license plates issued in connection with such registrations to be attached to the motor vehicles so registered and conspicuously displayed thereon; repealing section 320.34, Florida Statutes; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Transportation and Safety; and Finance and Taxation.

By Senators Thomas, Friday and Bafalis—

SB 1417—A bill to be entitled An act relating to Palm Beach county, fire control unit; providing appropriation; providing contingency upon which this act shall take effect.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

By Senator Deeb—

SM 1418—A Memorial urging the president and the congress of the United States of America to prohibit trade of any kind with any Communist nation.

Was read the first time in full and referred to the Committee on Apportionment, Resolutions and Memorials.

By Senators Gunter and Barrow—

SB 1419—A bill to be entitled An act making appropriations; providing moneys for the annual periods beginning July 1, 1967, and July 1, 1968, to pay salaries, expenses and operating capital outlay for a station and laboratory of the institute of food and agricultural products of the university of Florida; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

By Senator Chiles—

SB 1420—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the beverage laws; amending section 561.42(1), Florida Statutes, to provide limit on amount of credit distributor may be granted by manufacturer; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Ethics and Privileged Businesses; and Finance and Taxation.

By Senators Poston, Spencer, Fincher, Bafalis, Griffin and Clayton—

SB 1421—A bill to be entitled An act relating to motor vehicles; requiring certain persons who are in the business of driving, parking or storing motor vehicles owned by other persons or who own or operate public establishments which provide parking services or facilities to furnish proof of financial responsibility to the state treasurer; providing for the proving of financial responsibility; providing penalties; providing for the purpose of this act; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Transportation and Safety; and Judiciary "B".

By Senators Young, Deeb, Saylor, Stolzenburg, Johnson, Slade, Fisher, McClain, Henderson, O'Grady, Stockton, Plante and Cross—

SR 1422—A resolution expressing strong opposition to the proposal that the United States relinquish its sovereignty over the Canal Zone and the Panama Canal.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Apportionment, Resolutions and Memorials.

By Senator Gong—

SB 1423—A bill to be entitled An act relating to community antenna television systems; providing for the comprehensive regulation by the public service commission of persons and organizations owning, controlling, operating and managing said systems; providing for the issuance, transfer and revocation of certificates of public convenience and necessity and fees therefor; providing for the powers and duties of the commission including the fixing of rates; authorizing the exercise of the power of eminent domain; requiring commission approval of certain contracts, securities and mergers; providing

for proceedings of review; making violations a misdemeanor; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Ethics and Privileged Businesses; and Judiciary "B".

By Senator Reuter—

SB 1424—A bill to be entitled An act relating to documentary stamp taxes, sale; amending chapter 201, Florida Statutes, by adding section 201.121, requiring clerks of circuit court to act as comptroller's agent in the sale of such stamps and providing for the disposition of fees collected by said clerks incident to such sale; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Finance and Taxation.

By Senator Spencer—

SB 1425—To Be Entitled An Act making appropriations from the general revenue fund to the Florida Industrial Commission for the annual periods beginning July 1, 1967 and July 1, 1968, to administer the Minimum Wage Law; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

By Senator Stone—

SB 1426—A bill to be entitled An act relating to pilotage rates in all ports located in all counties having a population of not less than seven hundred fifty thousand (750,000) inhabitants by the last official census by adding a new section 310.111, Florida Statutes, authorizing and directing the boards of county commissioners of such counties to fix the pilotage rates for the ports located in each such county; and providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Rules and Calendar.

By Senator Stone—

SB 1427—A bill to be entitled An act relating to public lands and property under the supervision and management of the trustees of the internal improvement fund; amending section 253.126, Florida Statutes, excepting federal government from limitations and restrictions imposed upon the construction of islands or the extension or addition to existing lands or islands bordering on navigable waters; extending such exceptions to beach restoration, nourishment and preservation; deleting requirement of consent of riparian owner or that governmental agencies be the riparian owner when submerged lands are developed by governmental agencies; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Water Conservation, Salt Water and Natural Resources.

By Senators Stone and Shevin—

SB 1428—A bill to be entitled An act relating to trading stamp exchanges; amending section 559.01, Florida Statutes, by adding subsection (4); amending chapter 559, Florida Statutes, by adding section 559.041, providing for registration of trading stamp exchanges; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Judiciary "A"; and Finance and Taxation.

By Senator Haverfield—

SB 1429—A bill to be entitled An act amending chapter 65-1090, Laws of Florida, 1965, empowering every municipality in the state having a population in excess of 250,000 inhabitants according to the last official census or attaining said population according to any future official census to create a downtown development authority; providing for the appointment of members to the authority; providing that appointed members of the board of any authority shall reside in or have their residence, place of business in, or public office within the municipality in which the municipality creating the authority shall be located; providing for the issuance of revenue bonds by an authority to pay the cost of constructing office buildings, including land and any other necessary or desirable appurtenances thereto, such revenue bonds to be secured by lease

rentals or other revenues; conferring the power of eminent domain and with respect to the issuance of revenue bonds validating the creation of any authority heretofore created; and providing for the authority to borrow money on short-term basis to pay expenses of operation; providing for a severability clause; providing that this act shall take effect immediately upon its becoming law.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Urban Affairs and Local Government; and Finance and Taxation.

By Senator Mathews—

SB 1430—A bill to be entitled An act relating to motor vehicle licenses; amending subsection (1) of section 320.07, Florida Statutes, to provide for payment of annual registration fee during period 1964-1970; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Finance and Taxation.

By Senators Cross and O'Grady—

SB 1431—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the state comptroller; amending section 17.17, Florida Statutes, by adding subsection (2) requiring the comptroller to file a supplemental annual report to the governor listing all state employees and indicating the amounts disbursed to each during the year for compensation and travel expense; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Governmental Reorganization and Appropriations.

By Senator Thomas—

SB 1432—A bill to be entitled An act relating to cosmetology, persons qualified to receive certificate as master cosmetologist, manicurist or pedicurist; amending section 477.06 (1), Florida Statutes, by adding paragraph (g) providing alternative requirements for certification as master cosmetologist; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Governmental Reorganization; and Health and Welfare.

By Senator Slade—(By Request)—

SB 1433—A bill to be entitled An act relating to redevelopment of slum and blighted areas; preparatory development plans; formation, composition, interest and terms of redevelopment commission; powers of redevelopment commission; sale, lease, transfer and assignment to private developers; restrictions on sales, assignments and leases; preparation and adoption of redevelopment plans, providing for notice and public hearings; approval by city council; modification of plan; temporary renting and leasing; right of eminent domain; blighted area in more than one municipality; grant of funds by municipality; records and reports; right of governor to exercise authority granted city council; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Urban Affairs and Local Government; and Judiciary "A".

By Senator Stockton—

SB 1434—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the excise tax on documents; amending chapter 201, Florida Statutes, by adding section 201.105, exempting quit claim deeds given in lieu of mortgage foreclosure; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Finance and Taxation; and Judiciary "B".

By Senator Bell—

SJR 1435—A joint resolution proposing an amendment to Article IX of the constitution of the state of Florida relative to the annual ad valorem taxes assessed and levied against any property in Monroe county subject to ad valorem taxation, by adding thereto additional section number 18 to provide in Monroe county, state of Florida, the maximum amount to be assessed and levied against property in Monroe county subject to ad valorem taxation for all county or municipal purposes, including taxes assessed and levied for the county, county school board, school districts, special tax school districts, or

any other taxing districts or authorities or any municipality within the county, and to provide a method by which the qualified electors within any taxing district or authority may elect to exceed the maximum amounts set forth in this amendment.

Was read the first time in full and referred to the Committees on Rules and Calendar; and Finance and Taxation.

By Senators Askew and Broxson—

SB 1436—A bill to be entitled An act to authorize and empower the board of regents of Florida and the board of public instruction of Escambia county jointly and severally, to construct a teaching facility on the campus of the university of West Florida where students in the university of West Florida who are preparing to become public school teachers may acquire classroom experience; authorizing and empowering the board of public instruction of Escambia county and the board of regents to carry out programs necessary for the construction of said teaching facility; authorizing the board of public instruction of Santa Rosa county to share in the construction of said teaching facility; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Education—Higher Learning and Appropriations.

By Senator Stockton—

SB 1437—A bill to be entitled An act repealing sections 231.54, 231.55, 231.56, 231.57, 231.58 and 231.59, Florida Statutes, relating to professional teaching practices and establishing a professional practices commission, providing authority to establish a code of ethics, providing for the financing of said commission; and providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Education—Public Schools and Junior Colleges.

By Senators Poston, Hollahan, Stone, Fincher and Spencer—

SB 1438—A bill to be entitled An act relating to injuring or tapping telegraph or telephone or certain other lines; amending section 822.10, Florida Statutes, to include electric power lines; eliminating the two hundred dollar (\$200.00) damage provision; increasing the penalty for violations; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Judiciary "B"; and Ethics and Privileged Businesses.

Senator Boyd presiding.

By Senator Stone—

SB 1439—A bill to be entitled An act relating to beach and shore preservation; making an appropriation to the board of conservation for matching of funds from local sources; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Water Conservation, Salt Water and Natural Resources; and Appropriations.

By Senator Chiles—

SB 1440—A bill to be entitled An act amending section 122.12, Florida Statutes, by adding subsection (3) to permit the surviving spouse of a deceased officer or employee to receive credit for the tenure and contributions of the deceased, if such spouse is also an officer or employee eligible for participation in the retirement system; and providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Retirement and Claims; and Appropriations.

By Senator Hollahan—

SB 1441—A bill to be entitled An act relating to banks, branch banks and bank facilities; amending section 658.02, Florida Statutes; amending section 659.06(1) (a); amending section 659.06(1)(b) and 659.06(2) and renumbering the same as sections 659.069(1) and 659.069(2), Florida Statutes; amending chapter 659, Florida Statutes by adding new sections 659.061, 659.062, 659.063, 659.064, 659.065, 659.066, 659.067, 659.068, authorizing the establishment of branch banks and bank facilities in counties with a population of 100,000 or more and the acquisition of branch banks in counties with a population of 20,000 or more; providing a procedure for estab-

lishing and acquiring branch banks and bank facilities, providing fees and penalties, restrictions on location, opening and closing dates, thereof; and providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Banking, Securities and Loans; and Judiciary "B".

By Senators Stone and Shevin—

SB 1442—A bill to be entitled An act relating to trading stamps; amending section 559.03, Florida Statutes, to require trading stamps to reflect the month and year of issuance; amending chapter 559, Florida Statutes, by adding section 559.051, to provide that trading stamps not redeemed within two (2) years shall belong to the state to be deposited in the state school fund; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Judiciary "A"; and Finance and Taxation.

By Senators Hollahan, Spencer, Shevin, Fincher, Elrod, Weissenborn, Lane and Thomas—

SB 1443—A bill to be entitled An act relating to licensing of motor vehicles; amending section 320.08(5), Florida Statutes, to include motor vehicles integrally and permanently equipped with cranes and to fix the license fee thereof; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Finance and Taxation.

By Senators Stone and Shevin—

SB 1444—A bill to be entitled An act relating to trading stamps; amending chapter 559, Florida Statutes, by adding section 559.07; providing for free transferability of trading stamps between rightful owners without loss of redemption rights; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary "A".

By Senator Stockton—

SB 1445—A bill to be entitled An act relating to regulation of shrimp in all counties in the state lying contiguous to the St. Johns river or along the Atlantic coast from the Georgia line southward to and including Brevard county; declaring shrimp regulation in such counties to be a public need; providing for such shrimp regulation to be dependent upon the results of regular sampling in the waters of the counties concerned; providing for issuance of permits; providing for public notification of shrimp regulation; providing for the continuance of live bait shrimp operations under close supervision; providing penalty for violations; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Water Conservation, Salt Water and Natural Resources; and Judiciary "B".

By Senator Horne—

SB 1446—A bill to be entitled An act relating to compensation of county judges; repealing section 145.061, Florida Statutes; amending chapter 44, Florida Statutes, providing for a uniform compensation based on population; fixing the compensation of county judges of the state; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

By Senator Slade—

SB 1447—A bill to be entitled An act increasing the present rate and removing certain exemptions from sales, use and other privileged taxes so as to provide funds for the reduction of ad valorem taxes levied for school purposes; providing for amendments to sections 212.02; 212.03 (1), (3); 212.04 (1); Section 212.05 Subsections (1), (2), (3) and (4); 212.06 Subsection (1); Section 212.08 (3) (a) (b) and (c); 212.08 (4), (5), (6), (7), (8e), (8f); 212.12 Subsections (1), (9), (10); 212.20 (1), Florida Statutes, relating to sales, use and other privileged taxes so as to accomplish the above purposes; providing for the distribution and appropriation of funds collected thereunder to the general revenue fund and to the Board of Public Instruction of the several counties; providing that the several counties shall reduce the ad valorem taxes in proportion to the monies returned

thereto by this act; providing for the procedure to be followed in reducing ad valorem taxes; providing duties of the State Revenue Commission, Budget Commission and Boards, the Treasurer, Comptroller and other State and County offices and departments and agencies thereof; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Finance and Taxation.

By Senator de la Parte—

SB 1448—A bill to be entitled An act relating to careless driving; adding sections 317.2111, Florida Statutes, to define and provide a penalty for the same; amending section 317.041, Florida Statutes; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary "B".

By Senators Chiles and Gong—

SJR 1449—A joint resolution proposing an amendment to Article III of the State Constitution by adding a new section; to provide that the legislature shall prescribe a code of ethics for its members, its employees, and for the elected officeholders, appointees, and employees of the state.

Was read the first time in full and referred to the Committees on Rules and Calendar; and Ethics and Privileged Businesses.

By Senator de la Parte—

SB 1450—A bill to be entitled An act relating to motor vehicles, unintentional deaths; amends chapter 317 to provide a penalty for persons convicted of causing a death while operating a motor vehicle unlawfully; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary "B".

By Senator Haverfield—(By Request)—

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the state road department is hereby directed to erect appropriate markers to designate said bridge as the "William E. Dean Memorial Bridge."

SR 1514—A resolution commending Jake Boyd, of Palm Beach county for unusually effective public service for more than four decades.

Be It Resolved by the Senate of the State of Florida:

Section 1. The senate of the state of Florida takes this occasion by formal resolution to commend to the state the life and achievements of Jake Boyd, who has devoted nearly half a century to unselfish and progressive public service to the people of Palm Beach county and of south Florida. The senate takes note of the following facts which are only the highlights of his distinguished career, but which illustrate the public character of this man:

(1) As county engineer for Palm Beach county from 1926 to 1953, Jake Boyd developed the master road network for the county, later adopted by the state road department, and was instrumental in planning the first roads into the Lake Okeechobee region.

(2) He was largely responsible for the construction of Palm Beach International Airport, having begun flying in 1933 and continuing until 1959. In that time he also designed and supervised construction of Lantana and Pahokee airports.

(3) In assisting his county and his people to recover from the aftermath of the 1926 real estate boom, Jake Boyd planned an erosion control project stretching from Lake Worth Inlet to South Lake Worth Inlet, planned ten (10) miles of bulkhead and groins along Palm Beach's ocean front and designed a sand transfer plant north of Palm Beach Island which has served as a pattern in the field of beach erosion control ever since.

(4) Jake Boyd was town manager of Palm Beach from 1953 to 1959, launching in the process the first wholly successful sanitary ocean outfall in Florida, which also serves as a pattern elsewhere.

(5) Jake Boyd made outstanding contributions in flood control engineering and was with the Okeechobee Flood Control board that helped implement programs started by President Herbert Hoover to prevent recurrence of the Lake Okeechobee flood of 1928. He provided engineering services for the board from 1933 until 1942 during which time the board guided the construction of Hoover Dyke from Fisheating Creek to the St. Lucie Canal.

(6) Jake Boyd, at the age of 40, entered the United States Navy in 1942, rising from lieutenant commander to captain in the navy's civil engineering corps, serving in the invasion of Attu, in the Aleutians and later in the South Pacific.

(7) Since retiring from active engineering, Jake Boyd nevertheless has continued to make his mark on the welfare pattern of Palm Beach county. He has been chairman of West Palm Beach's committee charged with making a park out of the city's fourteen thousand-acre wilderness area, work for which now is in progress. This, by itself, could become one of the county's best outdoor recreational areas.

Section 2. Finally, this senate, including many members who have been personal friends and acquaintances of Jake Boyd can point with pride to the record of civic achievement that Jake Boyd has acquired by a lifetime of devotion to the public interest, and its members commend this record to the study of all those who seek a pattern for a useful and satisfactory career in public service.

WHEREAS, Mr. Harling began work on the Bloomington Pantagraph, a newspaper owned by the family of Adlai Stevenson, as a composing room employee in 1924 and soon afterwards switched to the sports and news departments and became City Editor and Legislative Correspondent in the Illinois Legislature, and

WHEREAS, Mr. Harling came to Pensacola in 1945 and

began covering such governmental bodies as the city council, county commission, school board, and island authority, and, since 1947, sessions of the Legislature, and

WHEREAS, Mr. Harling was recognized by his colleagues of the legislative press through their successive selection of him as director, vice chairman, and president of their organization, and

WHEREAS, Mr. Harling was appointed by the Governor in 1965 to the Judicial Council of Florida, diligently serving that group of lawyers, laymen and judges in its program for the betterment of the administration of justice, NOW, THEREFORE,

Be It Resolved by the Senate of the State of Florida, the House of Representatives Concurring:

THAT the Legislature extend its best wishes to Maurice F. Harling on the occasion of his completion of coverage of eleven regular Sessions of the Legislature, and express its hope that the future holds for him the life which he has earned by his professional objectivity, his friendship for all men of good will, and his sincerity of purpose.
