On the 14th day of April, 1967, Honorable Claude R. Kirk, Jr., Governor of the State of Florida, transmitted to the Florida Senate a copy of an Executive Order of Suspension in the case of Jack W. Jernigan, County Surveyor of Marion County, Florida, and a letter recommending the removal of the said Jack W. Jernigan from the aforesaid office pursuant to Article IV, Section 15, Constitution of the State of Florida.

The basis of said suspension order and recommendation of removal was the indictment of the said Jack W. Jernigan on February 20, 1967, by the Federal Grand Jury in and for the Southern District of Florida, for violation of the Internal Revenue Code. The Governor charged that:

... "the indictment constitutes the commission of a felony, reflecting incompetency and misfeasance and because of such, it would be improper for him to perform the responsibilities of his office."

Your Committee has no access to the testimony which was presented to the Federal Grand Jury upon which the indictment was based.

Your Committee feels strongly that it does not have the right to pre-judge the guilt or innocence of the said Jack W. Jernigan with reference to the charge of the indictment prior to his trial. Your Committee is firmly of the opinion that if said Jack W. Jernigan is convicted it will recommend to the Senate his removal from office and also if found to be innocent your Committee would not, based on the grounds cited by the Governor, recommend removal. If the trial takes place while the Legislature is in Session your Committee will promptly make a recommendation based on the outcome of said trial.

It is therefore your Committee's recommendation that until the trial of the said Jack W. Jernigan pursuant to his indictment takes place the Florida Senate take no action on the message of the Governor recommending his removal.
