INTRODUCTION

On motion of Senator Poston, SCR 5-X(67) was admitted for introduction and consideration by the required two-thirds vote of the Senate.

By Senators Poston and Hollahan—

SCR 5-X(67)—A concurrent resolution expressing appreciation to the Associated General Contractors of America for presenting distinctive name tags to the members of the Florida Legislature.

WHEREAS, the Florida Legislature was convened in extraordinary session on January 9, 1967, and

WHEREAS, both the Florida Senate and the Florida House

of Representatives have seated a number of members who have not enjoyed the privilege of previous service in either of said bodies, and

WHEREAS, The Florida chapters of the Associated General Contractors of America, Inc., have presented each member of the Florida Legislature with distinctive plastic name tags, which help to readily introduce each such member to his colleagues as well as to members of the public, and

WHEREAS, the members of the Florida Senate and the Florida House of Representatives wish to express their appreciation to those responsible for this thoughtful gesture; NOW, THEREFORE,

Be It Resolved by the Senate of the State of Florida, the House of Representatives Concurring:

That the entire membership of the Florida Legislature expresses its sincere appreciation and thanks to the Florida Chapters of the Associated General Contractors of America, Inc., for its thoughtful service to the Florida Legislature in providing each member with a distinctive personal name tag, for use during the extraordinary session of the said Legislature convened on January 9, 1967.
