Tuesday, April 8, 1969

## MESSAGES FROM THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

HCR 1—ORG., contained in the above message, was read the first time in full. On motion by Senator Friday, the rules were waived and HCR 1—ORG. was read the second time by title, adopted and certified to the House.

Senator Pope was recorded as voting nay.

A motion by Senator Friday was unanimously adopted that Rule 9 be amended to read as follows:

## RULE NINE

## Lobbying

9.1—All persons, except members of the Florida Legislature, or duly authorized aides designated in writing by such members, who seek to encourage the passage, defeat or modification of any legislation in the Senate or before its committees shall, before engaging in such activity, register with the Secretary of the Senate. Every registrant, in accordance herewith, shall also be required to state the extent of any direct business association or partnership with any current member of the Legislature.

9.2—Every such person shall register on forms prepared by the Secretary and shall state under oath his name and business address, the name and business address of his principal or principals, the general and specific areas of his legislative interests, and the duration of his agency.

The Secretary shall publish in the Journal, in tabulation form, a list of those filing the registration statements under this Rule together with the information contained therein, on the first Monday of the session and weekly thereafter.

No registered lobbyist shall be permitted upon the floor of the Senate while it is in session.

9.3—Any person who, on an isolated basis and without intent to continue beyond a single legislative day, merely appears before a committee or committees of the Senate in his individual capacity, or on behalf of a corporation, partnership or other business entity, with which such person is regularly associated as an employee, officer or partner without receiving additional salary or compensation, other than reasonable and ordinary travel expense, to express support of or opposition to any legislation, and who shall so declare to the Senators or committees with whom he discusses any proposed legislation, shall not be required to register as a lobbyist.

9.4—A lobbyist shall supply facts, information, and opinions of principals to legislators from the point of view from which he openly declares. A lobbyist shall not offer or propose anything to improperly influence the official act, decision, or vote of a legislator.

A lobbyist, by personal example and admonition to colleagues, shall uphold the honor of the legislative process by the integrity of his relationship with legislators.

A lobbyist shall not knowingly and willfully falsify a material fact or make any false, fictitious, or fraudulent statement or representation or make or use any writing or document knowing the same contains any false, fictitious, or fraudulent statements or entry.

9.5—A lobbyist shall submit to the Secretary of the Senate at the end of every second legislative week, commencing with the beginning of the session, a signed and certified statement listing all expenditures incurred, the purpose thereof, and sources from which funds for making such expenditures have come. At the end of each calendar quarter, between the first and the tenth day of the ensuing month, each lobbyist, as long as his activity continues, shall submit to the Secretary of the Senate like reports covering those periods in which the legislature is not in session. Within thirty days after the adjournment of the legislature, every lobbyist shall file with the Secretary of the Senate a complete and detailed statement, verified under oath by person making the same, of all expenses paid or incurred in connection with their employment as lobbyist. Said statements shall be rendered in the form provided by the Secretary and shall be open to public inspection.

9.6—A lobbyist when in doubt about the applicability and interpretation of this Rule in a particular context may submit in writing a statement of the facts involved to the Committee on Rules and Calendar and may appear in person before said Committee.

The Committee on Rules and Calendar may render advisory opinions to any lobbyist who seeks advice as to whether or not the facts in a particular case would constitute a violation of these Rules. All opinions shall delete names and be numbered, dated, and published in the Journal of the Senate.

9.7—The Secretary of the Senate shall keep a compilation of all advisory opinions of the Committee on Rules and Calendar as well as a current list of registered lobbyists and their respective reports required under these Rules, all of which shall be open to public inspection.

9.8—Separately from any prosecutions or penalties otherwise provided by law, any person determined to have violated the requirements of this Rule shall be censured, reprimanded, placed on probation or prohibited from lobbying for the duration of the session and from appearing before any committee of the Senate. Said determination shall be made by a majority of the Senate, upon recommendation of the Committee on Rules and Calendar. The Committee on Rules and Calendar, before making said recommendation, shall conduct a hearing, after notifying the person alleged to have violated this Rule and granting such person an opportunity to appear at the hearing.

9.9—The Secretary shall provide blank affidavits for the convenience of registrants but the burden of compliance nevertheless always shall be upon the person required to register.

9.10—Committees shall be diligent to ascertain whether those who appear before them in other than an obviously individual capacity have conformed with the requirements of this Rule, and to report violations. No committeeman knowingly shall permit an unregistered lobbyist to be heard.

Senator Friday moved that Rule 2.5 relative to publication of committee meeting notices in the Calendar be waived for meetings scheduled for this date and April 9. The motion was adopted.

On motion by Senator Friday, the rules were waived and time of adjournment was extended until completion of introduction and reference of Resolutions, Memorials, Bills and Joint Resolutions.

On motion by Senator Horne, the President appointed Senators Horne, Young, Barron, Thomas and Bafalis as the committee to escort Miss Eugenia Lee Friday, Edisonia Queen of Fort Myers, and daughter of Senator Elmer O. Friday, Jr. to the rostrum where she addressed the Senate briefly.

INTRODUCTION

By Senators Myers, Shevin and Gong—

SB 1—A bill to be entitled An act creating a department of community affairs; providing for the appointment by the governor of a commissioner of community affairs; providing his powers and duties; establishing an advisory council on community affairs and providing for its membership, powers, and duties; establishing an interdepartmental committee on community services and providing for its membership, powers, and duties; providing for the transfer of the functions, powers, duties and personnel and appropriations of the division of economic opportunity; providing for the transfer of the functions, powers, duties, and personnel and appropriations of the department of civil defense; abolishing the civil defense council; providing for the transfer of the powers, functions, duties, and personnel and appropriations of the division of county finance within the office of the comptroller and of the powers and duties of the comptroller relating to county finance contained in chapters 116, 128, 129, 192, and 193, Florida Statutes; providing for the transfer of the functions, powers, duties and personnel and appropriations of the railroad assessment board and for the abolition of said board; providing for the exercise by the department of all powers of the state with regard to property taxation; providing for the transfer of the local planning assistance functions and duties of the planning department of the Florida development commission; providing for the abolition of the state housing board and for the transfer of its powers, duties, and functions; providing for the establishment of a community grant-in-aid trust fund and for the appropriation of state revenues for the support of said trust fund; providing authority to accept grants or funds; providing an appropriation; providing legislative intent; providing severability clause; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Governmental Organization and Ways and Means.

By Senators Pope and Gunter—

SB 2—A bill to be entitled An act relating to safety equipment inspection of motor vehicles; amending sections 325.12, 325.13, 325.16, and 325.24(1), Florida Statutes; providing for annual inspections; providing a schedule for reinspections; enlarging the time within which repairs may be made; increasing inspection fees; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Transportation.

By Senators Pope, Deeb and Saylor—

SB 3—A bill to be entitled An act relating to Sunland Training Centers; repealing section 393.014, Florida Statutes, directing the transfer of patients presently residing at the Dorr Field facility; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Health, Welfare, and Institutions.

By Senator Mathews—

SB 4—A bill to be entitled An act relating to municipalities and counties, future development; empowering the governing authorities of the several incorporated municipalities and counties of the state, individually or jointly, to plan for future development, to adopt, amend or revise comprehensive plans to guide future development, implementing such comprehensive plans to authorize incorporated municipalities and counties, individually or jointly, to enact and enforce zoning and subdivision regulations and to adopt and enforce building, plumbing, electrical, gas, fire, safety, and sanitary codes; stating the purpose and intent of the act; defining certain terms used in the act; setting out the areas and jurisdictions which may qualify to use the provisions of the act; providing for the establishment, composition, terms of office, officers, powers and duties, procedures and maintenance of planning commissions and their staffs; setting out the method of adoption and the legal status of a comprehensive plan; providing for review and amendment of a comprehensive plan; setting out the scope of regulatory authority through zoning as a means of comprehensive plan implementation; setting procedures for the establishment of zoning districts; providing for the method of amendment of a zoning ordinance; providing for the establishment, composition, terms of office, officers, powers and duties, procedures and maintenance of boards of adjustment and their staffs; providing for review by the courts of decisions

of boards of adjustment; setting out the scope of regulatory authority to adopt and enforce regulations for land subdivision as a means of comprehensive plan implementation; authorizing the adoption of subdivision regulations; providing procedures for approval of subdivision plans and plats; providing penalties for transfer of lots in unapproved subdivisions; authorizing the reversion of subdivided land to acreage and setting procedures therefor; authorizing the adoption and enforcement of building, plumbing, electrical, gas, fire, safety, and sanitary codes and authorizing the adoption of such codes by reference as a means of comprehensive plan implementation; providing that this act is to be liberally construed to accomplish its stated purposes; providing that an incorporated municipality or county, jointly or individually, must take formal action to proceed under this act before utilizing the authority conferred by this act; providing that regulations and codes adopted by an incorporated municipality or county under previous legislative authority shall remain in effect until superseded by regulations and codes adopted under authority of this act; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Governmental Organization.

By Senators Bafalis and Shevin—

SB 5—A bill to be entitled An act relating to public education, courses of study, and instructional aids; amending section 233.061, Florida Statutes, to place a stronger emphasis on the need for instruction in drug abuse; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Education.

By Senators Bafalis and Shevin—

SB 6—A bill to be entitled An act relating to narcotic drugs; amending section 398.22(1)(d) and (e), Florida Statutes, to reduce from twenty-one (21) to eighteen (18) the maximum age of persons to whom the selling of narcotic drugs requires the extraordinary penalties of paragraph (d) and to extend the prohibition against the suspending or deferring of sentence and the granting of probation to first convictions for the selling of narcotic drugs to persons under the age of eighteen (18).

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Health, Welfare, and Institutions and Judiciary.

By Senators Bafalis, Shevin and Scarborough—

SB 7—A bill to be entitled An act relating to drug abuse; amending section 404.15, Florida Statutes, to require mandatory imprisonment of persons convicted of selling drugs to persons under age eighteen (18) and to prohibit the suspending or deferring of sentence or the granting of probation to persons so convicted.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

By Senators Bafalis and Shevin—

SB 8—A bill to be entitled An act relating to drug abuse; amending chapter 404, Florida Statutes, by adding section 404.045 authorizing the Florida Board of Pharmacy after notice and hearing to designate nonprescription drugs that are subject to abuse and providing that drugs so designated shall thereafter be dispensed only by licensed pharmacists.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Health, Welfare, and Institutions.

By Senators Bafalis and Shevin—

SB 9—A bill to be entitled An act relating to narcotic drugs; amending section 398.09, Florida Statutes, to provide that the medicinal preparations listed therein may be sold to persons aged twenty-one (21) or over without a prescription, but only by a licensed pharmacist and that they may be sold to persons under age twenty-one (21) only on prescription; authorizing registered pharmacists to refuse to dispense such drugs when not intended for a lawful purpose; requiring sales of such drugs to be recorded under supervision of State Board of Health.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Health, Welfare, and Institutions and Judiciary.

By Senators Bafalis and Shevin—

SB 10—A bill to be entitled An act relating to pharmacists, drug dispensing; amending section 465.18, Florida Statutes, by renumbering present subsection (3) as subsection (4) and adding new subsection (3) to prohibit the dispensing of certain drugs by mail unless a prescription is personally presented by the consumer or his agent; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Health, Welfare, and Institutions and Judiciary.

By Senators Horne, Gong and Gunter—

SB 11—A bill to be entitled An act relating to elections; amending chapter 97, Florida Statutes, by adding a new section numbered 97.100; providing for electors who have moved within the state to vote absentee in the county of former residence; amending subsection (3) of section 101.62, Florida Statutes, and section 101.64, Florida Statutes, providing for a change in the application for absentee elector's ballot and elector's certificate.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

By Senators Horne, Myers, Poston and Gong—

SB 12—A bill to be entitled An act relating to legal holidays; amending section 683.01(1), Florida Statutes, to provide that Washington's Birthday, Memorial Day, Columbus Day, and Veterans' Day shall be observed on specified Mondays; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

By Senator Poston—

SB 13—A bill to be entitled An act relating to construction contracts; placing limitations on indemnification agreements; declaring contracts violating this law to be void; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

By Senator Poston—

SB 14—A bill to be entitled An act relating to mechanic's liens; amending section 713.50, Florida Statutes, providing that the method of enforcement of all mechanic's liens on real property shall be as provided in chapter 713, part I, Florida Statutes; repealing sections 713.51, 713.52, 713.54, 713.74 and 713.75, Florida Statutes; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

By Senator Poston—

SB 15—A bill to be entitled An act relating to tangible personal property taxes; amending section 200.06, Florida Statutes; providing a minimum tax assessment basis for depreciated property; providing method for depreciating property; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

By Senator Myers—

SB 16—A bill to be entitled An act relating to dispensing opticians; amending chapter 484, F. S., by adding a new section; regulating practice with respect to contact lenses; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Health, Welfare, and Institutions.

By Senator Myers—

SB 17—A bill to be entitled An act to provide exemption from liability for members of committees of professional societies, hospitals, sanitoriums, nursing homes, rest homes, or a medical staff of any other organization formed to maintain standards; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

By Senator Stone—

SB 18—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the rehabilitation of alcoholics; amending subsection 396.021(3), Florida Statutes, to change the designation of "administrator" of the rehabilitation center to "director"; directing the statutory revision department to effectuate such change throughout chapter 396, Florida Statutes; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Health, Welfare, and Institutions.

By Senator Myers—

SB 19—A bill to be entitled An act relating to pesticides; amending sections 487.021 through .061, 487.081 and 487.091, F.S.; providing definitions; prohibiting certain acts; regulating the sale, use or possession of certain highly toxic pesticides; providing for the registration of manufacturers, distributors and pesticides; provides for consultation and advice by the pesticide technical committee in making rules and regulations; providing that the pesticide technical committee shall be composed as provided in section 570.52, F.S.; providing exemptions; providing for evidence of negligence; adding a new section to chapter 487, F.S.; delineating areas of jurisdiction; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Health, Welfare, and Institutions and Judiciary.

By Senator Myers—

SB 20—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the practice of landscape architecture; amending section 481.141, Florida Statutes, to extend the time in which certain qualified persons may apply for registration without examination; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

By Senators Myers and Shevin—

SB 21—A bill to be entitled An act relating to drugs; amending section 500.04, Florida Statutes, by adding subsection (13) to prohibit the forgery of a prescription for any habit-forming, toxic, harmful or new drug; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

By Senators Myers and Shevin—

SB 22—A bill to be entitled An act relating to obscene, harassing and threatening telephone calls; making such calls a crime and providing penalty; amending section 365.16 Florida Statutes, defining an obscene or harassing telephone communication; making such calls a misdemeanor and providing punishment; providing for an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

By Senator Myers—

SB 23—A bill to be entitled An act adopting the uniform anatomical gift law; authorizing the gift of all or part of a human body after death for specified purposes; providing specific procedures, rights and duties; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Health, Welfare, and Institutions and Judiciary.

By Senator Myers—

SB 24—A bill to be entitled An act relating to construction of a regional laboratory building; authorizing the state board of health to construct a regional laboratory building in Dade county; prescribes for certain fees to be included in con-

struction cost; authorizing the state board of health to accept grants and gifts, or property; providing an appropriation, providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Health, Welfare, and Institutions and Ways and Means.

By Senator Stone—
