

JOURNAL OF THE SENATE

Wednesday, April 15, 1970

The Senate was called to order by the President at 8:30 a.m. for the purpose of conducting the order of business of Introduction and reference of Resolutions, Memorials, Bills and Joint Resolutions, pursuant to Rule 4.3.

INTRODUCTION

By Senator Henderson—

SB 622—A bill to be entitled An act relating to boating safety; amending section 371.54, Florida Statutes, by adding paragraph (5); providing for flags to be used by skin and scuba divers; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Natural Resources and Conservation.

By Senators Thomas and Weissenborn—

SB 623—A bill to be entitled An act relating to sanitary sewage disposal units; requiring that future construction of ocean outfall sewage disposal systems provide for secondary sanitary waste treatment and in addition thereto, advanced sanitary waste treatment as deemed necessary by the department of air and water pollution control; requiring existing ocean outfall sewage disposal systems to provide for secondary sanitary waste treatment and in addition thereto, advanced sanitary waste treatment as deemed necessary by the department of air and water pollution control, by January 3, 1974; providing a penalty; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Natural Resources and Conservation.

By Senator Chiles—

SB 624—A bill to be entitled An act relating to credit unions; amending section 657.06(3)(a), Florida Statutes, reducing examination fees for credit unions with assets over \$1,000,000.00 and further reducing examination fees for credit unions with assets over \$5,000,000.00; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

By Senator Hollahan—

SB 625—A bill to be entitled An act relating to limitation of prosecutions; amending section 932.06, Florida Statutes, extending the statute of limitations for persons allegedly participating in offenses with certain public officials; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

By Senator Hollahan—

SB 626—A bill to be entitled An act to amend chapter 123, section 123.06, subsection 2, Florida Statutes; providing that average final compensation as used in determining retirement benefits for supreme court justices, district court of appeals judges and circuit court judges shall mean the average cash compensation received from the state and county as salary for the best five (5) of the last ten (10) years of service; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

By Senators Horne and Weissenborn—

SB 627—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Florida Agricultural and Mechanical University; creating a repository of

source materials on Afro-American history and culture; providing authority to receive available funds; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Education.

By Senator Horne—

SB 628—A bill to be entitled An act making appropriations; providing moneys for the 1969 special session of the legislature and for the travel expenses and per diem of witnesses appearing before legislative committees; providing for the allocation of said appropriations; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

By Senator Gunter—

SB 629—A bill to be entitled An act relating to transportation brokers; amending section 323.31(1), Florida Statutes; requiring certificates of public convenience and necessity instead of licenses and providing certificates for certain persons already operating as brokers; amending and renumbering subsection (3) of section 323.31, Florida Statutes, as subsection (2); increasing certain standards for certificates, reducing the renewal fee, and providing a basis for the issuance of certificates by the commission; renumbering subsection 323.31(2), Florida Statutes, as subsection (3) and amending certain provisions for public hearings; adding subsection (4) to section 323.31, Florida Statutes, and renumbering and amending existing subsections (4) and (5) as (5) and (6), respectively; providing for the contents of a certificate, revocation and cancellation of certificates, and hearings on revocation, cancellation, or suspension; amending and renumbering subsection (6) of section 323.31, Florida Statutes, as subsection (7); prohibiting assignment of certificates without commission approval; renumbering subsections (7), (8), and (9) of section 323.31, Florida Statutes, as subsections (8), (9), and (10), respectively, and adding a new subsection (11) providing a definition of "public interest"; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Transportation and Ways and Means.

By Senators Pope and Mathews—

SR 630—A Resolution In Memoriam Harry James Kicliter.

Was read the first time by title and placed on the Calendar.

By Senators Johnson and Horne—

SR 631—A Resolution in commendation Honorable George Harrold Carswell.

Was read the first time by title and placed on the Calendar.

By Senator Shevin—

SB 632—A bill to be entitled An act relating to Florida air and water pollution control act; amending sections 403.061, 403.121, 403.131, 403.141, 403.161, 403.182, 403.201, 403.212, and 403.231, Florida Statutes, providing multiple enforcement procedures at all levels, including class actions and individual actions by citizens; imposing criminal and civil penalties, including treble damages; revoking present permits and variances; providing requirements for permits and variances; providing that no variance shall extend beyond June 1, 1975; establishing a self-reporting system for person causing or permitting pollution; providing for a timetable for full compliance; repealing section 403.151, Florida Statutes; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Natural Resources and Conservation and Governmental Organization.

HB 1562—A bill to be entitled An act relating to married women's property; amending sections 694.04, 708.08 and 708.09, Florida Statutes; repealing sections 693.01, 693.02, 693.03, 693.04, 693.05, 693.13, 693.14, 708.01, 708.02, 708.03, 708.04, 708.06, and 708.07, Florida Statutes; conforming the general law of the state to Section 5 of Article X of the State Constitution, which abolishes the distinction between the property rights of married men and women; eliminating provisions requiring a husband to join in the conveyance of his wife's property; repealing section 62.021, Florida Statutes, relating to the free dealer law; providing an effective date.
