

# JOURNAL OF THE SENATE

Monday, April 20, 1970

The Senate was called to order by Senator Friday at 8:30 a.m. for the purpose of conducting the order of business of Introduction and reference of Resolutions, Memorials, Bills and Joint Resolutions, pursuant to Rule 4.3.

## INTRODUCTION

By Senators Williams and Thomas—

**SJR 706**—A joint resolution proposing an amendment to Article VII to the Constitution of the State of Florida adding section 14, permitting the issuance, when authorized by law, of state bonds to finance the construction of water pollution control and abatement facilities to be operated by the state or by municipalities, counties, districts, authorities and other governmental agencies, to be primarily secured by a pledge of all or any part of revenues or rentals to be derived from operation of such facilities, special assessments, and other revenues legally available for such purpose, and additionally secured by the full faith and credit of the State of Florida; providing for the pledge of the full faith and credit of counties, municipalities, districts, authorities, and agencies thereof for payment of rentals to the state under lease-purchase agreements; providing for certification by a state fiscal agency, created by law that sufficient pledged revenues will be available to pay all debt service requirements for such bonds.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Constitutional Amendments and Revision and Ways and Means.

By Senators Williams and Thomas—

**SB 707**—A bill to be entitled The Florida Water Pollution Control Act of 1970; establishing a state water pollution control fund administered by the air and water pollution control board to provide grants to local agencies for sewage treatment projects eligible for federal funds; setting grant requirements; providing that the air and water pollution board approve plans, set priorities, promulgate rules and regulations, give technical assistance, cooperate with other agencies, report to the legislature, obtain federal funds, and authorize certain advances to local agencies in anticipation of federal funds; providing an appropriation; containing a severability clause; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Natural Resources and Conservation and Ways and Means.

By Senators Stone and Williams—

**SB 708**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to implementation of a School of Veterinary Medicine at the University of Florida as provided for in Chapter 241.097, Florida Statutes; providing an appropriation; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Education and Ways and Means.

By Senator Myers—

**SB 709**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to pollution; providing for the classification of the sources of air and water pollution; providing for a method of establishing minimum treatment standards for each category so developed; providing for a system of effluent fees; creating a technical advisory council; prescribing for the council's powers and duties; providing penalties; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Natural Resources and Conservation and Governmental Organization.

By Senator Barrow—

**SB 710**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to vacation certificates; providing definitions; requiring that vacation certificate companies be registered; providing for regulation by the department of business regulation; creating a bureau of vacation

gift regulation; prescribing fees; requiring bond; providing for registration of operators; establishing procedures; creating the vacation certificate trust fund; providing for certificate contents and display; providing for revocation of registration; providing an appropriation; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Commerce and Licensed Businesses and Ways and Means.

By Senator Weissenborn—

**SB 711**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to traffic control on turnpike projects; amending subsection 340.23(1), Florida Statutes, deleting the authority of the department to promulgate rules and regulations relating to vehicular speeds, loads and sizes, safety devices, and rules of the road; providing that the vehicle and traffic laws of this state shall apply on any project constructed under chapter 340, Florida Statutes; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Transportation.

By Senator Haverfield—

**SB 712**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the uniform narcotic drug law; repealing section 398.09, Florida Statutes, which provides that chapter 398, Florida Statutes, relating to the regulation of narcotic drugs, shall not be applicable to the prescribing, administering, dispensing or selling at retail of certain quantities of drugs and of certain preparations; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Health, Welfare, and Institutions.

By Senator Stone—

**SB 713**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to "Stop and Frisk"; authorizing a law enforcement officer to temporarily detain and question a person under circumstances which reasonably indicate that such person has committed, is committing, or is about to commit a criminal offense; including the possession of a narcotic drug, central nervous system stimulant, hallucinogenic drug, or barbiturate in violation of either Chapter 398 or Chapter 404, Florida Statutes; permits search of the person detained, to the extent necessary, to disclose if said person is armed, when the officer reasonably believes that said person is armed with a dangerous weapon; provides that said person shall not be detained more than is reasonably necessary for such search unless an arrest is made; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

By Senators Poston, Stone, Beaufort, Horne and Fincher—

**SB 714**—A bill to be entitled An act providing for retirement benefits for persons who have exercised the duties of the office of governor of Florida; making an appropriation; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

By Senators Ducker and Johnson—

**SB 715**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the department of natural resources, division of recreation and parks; amending section 375.031(6), Florida Statutes; providing that the division may acquire by condemnation private lands and water areas it determines necessary for public park or outdoor recreation purposes; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Natural Resources and Conservation and Judiciary.

By Senators Ducker and Plante—

**SCR 716**—A concurrent resolution commending Congress for its wisdom and foresight in passing the Endangered Wildlife Bill, H. R. 11363.

Was read the first time in full and referred to the Committee on Natural Resources and Conservation.

By Senator Boyd—

**SB 717**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to education; providing for the waiver of the required one hundred eighty (180) days minimum term for pupils; providing for the full allocation of state funds; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Education.

By Senator Henderson—

**SB 718**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to motor vehicle licenses; amending section 320.089 (1), Florida Statutes, providing a license plate to members of the Florida National Guard for a fee of five dollars (\$5); repealing section 320.089(3), Florida Statutes, which makes this section supplemental to the motor vehicle licensing laws; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Transportation and Ways and Means.

By Senator Bishop—

**SB 719**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to retirement system for state and county officers and employees; amending section 122.08(9), Florida Statutes, relating to certain retirement benefit options for surviving spouse of deceased member; removing time limitation for application of section; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

By Senator Wilson—

**SB 720**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to motor vehicles; repealing section 320.59, Florida Statutes, relative to liability to guests or passengers in motor vehicles; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Judiciary and Insurance.

By Senator Hollahan—

**SB 721**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to disclaimer of interests; amending chapter 731, Florida Statutes, by adding section 731.37; providing for disclaimer of interests in property of a decedent in whole or in part; specifying scope of right to disclaim; providing for disclaimer on behalf of incompetents and deceased persons; providing for disposition of disclaimed interests; providing for filing and recording of disclaimer and specifying time therefor; providing for service of disclaimers; providing for waivers and bars to the right to disclaim; specifying effect of spendthrift restraints and spouse's consent; saving all rights existing apart from this act; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

By Senator Hollahan—

**SB 722**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to food and lodging; amending section 509.151 and adding section 509.152, Florida Statutes, relating to obtaining food, lodging, or other accommodations or services with intent to defraud at hotels, motels and similar facilities and increasing the penalty provisions; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

By Senator Hollahan—

**SB 723**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to death benefits; providing for payment of proceeds of life, health,

accident, endowment, and annuity insurance policies, proceeds of an employees' trust, or other death benefits, to a trustee named in a revocable or irrevocable trust or to a trustee named in a will; providing for disposition of proceeds to an executor or administrator where there is no trustee to receive proceeds; providing that proceeds payable to trustee shall not be part of decedent's estate and may be commingled with other trust assets; providing that such act does not affect validity of trusts established before the effective date of this act; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Insurance and Judiciary.

By Senator Hollahan—

**SB 724**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to nontestamentary disclaimers; amending chapter 689, Florida Statutes, by adding section 689.21; providing for disclaimer of interests in property passing by nontestamentary transfer in whole or in part; specifying scope of right to disclaim; providing for disclaimer on behalf of incompetents and deceased persons; providing for disposition of disclaimed interests; providing for filing and recording of disclaimer and specifying time therefor; providing for service of disclaimers; providing for waivers and bars to the right to disclaim; specifying effect of spendthrift restraints and spouse's consent; saving all rights existing apart from this act; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

By Senator Hollahan—

**SB 725**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to purchasing; providing that the division of purchasing may delegate authority relating to purchasing to any state agency, retaining authority for supervision thereof; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Governmental Organization.

By Senators Askew, Broxson, Saunders and Mathews—

**SCR 726**—A concurrent resolution commending Susan Holloway and recognizing her scholastic achievement, poise, appearance and outstanding ability in being selected as Florida's First Lady of Youth for 1970.

Was read the first time in full and placed on the Calendar.

By Senator Friday—

**SB 727**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to fire prevention; providing that it shall be unlawful for any person to smoke, carry or possess any lighted match, pipe, cigar or cigarette or carry or use any portable open flame in certain portions of buildings wherein certain highly flammable materials or products are sold at retail or kept, stored or displayed for sale at retail; providing for the erection and placement by the owner or manager of such portions of buildings of NO SMOKING signs; providing for the number, manner and wording of such signs; providing penalties for violation of act; providing that all inconsistent laws are repealed; providing a severance clause; and providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Commerce and Licensed Businesses.

By Senator Friday—

**SB 728**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to administrative procedure act; amending section 120.26(4), Florida Statutes, adding new subsection (5) to said section and renumbering subsequent subsections accordingly; permitting filing of exceptions only to the recommended order of a hearing examiner or member of the agency; authorizing the filing of a petition for rehearing to the agency order in certain circumstances; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

By Senator Saunders—

**SB 729**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to municipal electric plants; amending chapter 172, Florida Statutes, by

adding section 172.011 to provide for the powers of municipalities in the extension and execution of the purposes of chapter 172, Florida Statutes, to a limited area outside of corporate limits; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Commerce and Licensed Businesses and Governmental Organization.

By Senator Saunders—

**SB 730**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to municipal electric utilities; creating the municipal electric cooperative act; providing purposes, legislative findings and legislative intent; providing authority for municipalities to organize municipal electric cooperatives, to enter cooperative agreements for the construction of electric generating facilities, the interchange of electrical energy and the transmission of electrical energy over the transmission lines and facilities of public utilities as defined in chapter 366, Florida Statutes; providing authority to construct, maintain and operate electric transmission and distribution lines throughout the state; providing eminent domain power for the exercise of the powers and purposes of the act; providing authority for municipalities to organize nonprofit corporations under chapter 617, Florida Statutes; providing authority for municipalities to exercise general municipal powers and the powers conferred by this act through municipal electric cooperatives organized under chapter 617, Florida Statutes; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Commerce and Licensed Businesses and Governmental Organization.

By Senator Saunders—

**SB 731**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to rural electric cooperatives; amending section 425.03, Florida Statutes, redefining rural area; defining urban area; amending section 425.04 (4), Florida Statutes, relating to powers of cooperatives, to extend the prohibition against providing service in certain areas to include urban areas; amending chapter 425, Florida Statutes, by adding section 425.041, providing conclusive presumptions with respect to the definition of urban area and prohibiting service by rural electric cooperatives in that area without waiver from a central station electric power facility; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Commerce and Licensed Businesses.
