Monday, May 4, 1970

SB 1058—A bill to be entitled An act relating to Junior Colleges, using the terms Community College and Junior College interchangeably; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Education.

By Senator Deeb—

SB 1059—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the state fire marshal; transferring such office from the department of insurance and assigning it to the division of training and professional development, department of community affairs; amending the introductory paragraph of section 633.01, Florida Statutes, to conform said paragraph to said transfer; amending section 527.01 (9), Florida Statutes, to conform said section to said transfer; amending section 633.02, Florida Statutes, to provide for a chief deputy fire marshal as administrative director; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Insurance and Governmental Organization.

SB 1060—A bill to be entitled An act relating to public buildings, payment of construction cost; adding section 255.052, Florida Statutes, to increase the percentage of the contract price which contracting authority may pay contractors on the basis of work completed after fifty percent (50%) of the work is completed; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

SB 1061—A bill to be entitled An act relating to public school buildings, payment of construction cost; amending section 235.33, Florida Statutes, to increase the percentage of the contract price which school boards may pay contractors on the basis of work completed after fifty percent (50%) of the work is completed; providing an effective date.

SB 1062—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the everglades fire control district; amending subsection (15) of section 14 of chapter 69-106, Laws of Florida, to provide functions of the everglades fire control district be assigned to the division of forestry; providing effective date.

SB 1063—A bill to be entitled An act relating to compulsory school attendance, child welfare; amending section 232.06(1), Florida Statutes; providing that either a county health officer or psychological examiner designated by the school district may certify a child to be exempt from school attendance in certain cases; providing an effective date.

SB 1064—A bill to be entitled An act relating to alligators; providing that the Florida Game and Fresh Water Fish Com-

mission conduct research necessary to successfully develop the farming of alligators in captivity; providing an appropriation; providing an effective date.

SB 1065—A bill to be entitled An act relating to wildlife game management area; amending section 372.57(6), (7), (8), (9) and (12), Florida Statutes, and amending section 372.573, Florida Statutes, by adding subsections (2) and (3) to provide for purchase of land for hunting areas and other outdoor recreation purposes; increasing license fees; providing an effective date.

SB 1066—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the treasurer; amending section 18.10(1) and (2), Florida Statutes, authorizing the treasurer to assume the responsibilities of the state board of administration regarding the deposit of state money in certain banks; authorizing the investment of certain excess funds in U. S. treasury obligations; providing an effective date.

SB 1067—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the state board of administration; amending section 18.10(1), Florida Statutes, authorizing the state board of administration to invest certain excess funds in U. S. treasury obligations; providing an effective date.

SB 1068—A bill to be entitled An act relating to agricultural and vegetable seed; amending subsection (1) of section 578.27, Florida Statutes, to provide alternate members to arbitration council; providing effective date.

SB 1069—A bill to be entitled An act relating to probate law, personal representatives; amending subsection 732.45(2), Florida Statutes; providing an effective date.

SB 1070—A bill to be entitled An act to amend Chapter 550.082, Florida Statutes, by adding an additional subsection (3) thereto; providing for the allocation of dog racing dates in counties with more than one (1) dog racing track; repealing all laws in conflict herewith; providing an effective date.

SB 1073—A bill to be entitled An act amending 625.0129(1), Florida Statutes, to permit title insurers to have invested up to fifty per cent of their surplus as to policyholders in their abstract plants and equipment, loans secured by mortgages on abstract plants and equipment, and, with the commissioner's consent, in stock of abstract companies; providing an effective date.

SB 1076—A bill to be entitled An act relating to gasoline and oil inspection; amending section 525.07, Florida Statutes, to make it unlawful to break, cut, or remove the inspector's seal placed on gasoline or kerosene measuring containers; providing effective date.

SB 1079—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the motorboat registration certificate tax; amending section 371.65 (2) and (5), Florida Statutes, to provide funding for the aquatic

weed program of the division of game and fresh water fish of the department of natural resources; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Governmental Organization and Natural Resources and Conservation.

SB 1080—A bill to be entitled An act relating to citrus; amending Chapter 601 by adding Section 601.156 thereto; providing for an additional excise tax; providing for the applicability of Section 601.15 where appropriate; providing an appropriation; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Agriculture and Ways and Means.

SB 1081—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the state and county retirement system; amending section 122.05, Florida Statutes, by adding subsection (6), providing alternative bases for calculating payments made by members of the legislature; providing an effective date.

SB 1082—A bill to be entitled An act relating to special acts or laws granting special pensions; transferring administration of same to the state of Florida department of administration and assigning same to the division of personnel and retirement; providing and effective date.

SB 1083—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the state and county retirement system; repealing sections 122.36, 122.37, 122.38, 122.39, 122.40, 122.41, 122.42, 122.43, 122.44, 122.45, 122.46, 122.47, 122.48, and 122.49, Florida Statutes, which established division C of the system; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Governmental Organization and Ways and Means.

SB 1084—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the sale of liquid fuels, lubricating oils and greases; amending section 526.01, Florida Statutes, to regulate the sale of liquid fuels, lubricating oils and greases; to provide authority to issue stop sale order and disposition of products improperly labeled; providing penalty for interference with product or stop sale order; and providing effective date.

SB 1086—A bill to be entitled An act relating to agriculture; to provide enabling legislation for the marketing, handling, and distributing of soybeans grown in Florida, and providing for the regulation of handlers, distributors, producers and others; establishing standards in relation to such regulation; providing for hearings on and the issuance, administration and enforcement of marketing agreements and marketing orders in connection

with the regulations aforesaid; providing for referendum on marketing orders; prescribing the powers, duties and jurisdiction of the department of agriculture and consumer services and advisory council in relation thereto; prescribing remedies, rights, duties and penalties with respect to violations of this act or any marketing order promulgated thereunder; providing for assessments to be levied and collected by the department of agriculture and consumer services of Florida so as to pay the expenses incurred in the formulation, issuance, administration and enforcement of such marketing orders; providing an effective date.

SB 1087—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the highway patrol auxiliary; amending 321.24(2), Florida Statutes, providing auxiliaries serving under the direction and supervision of the director or a member of the Florida highway patrol shall have the power to bear arms; providing an effective date.

SB 1089—A bill to be entitled An act relating to state universities and junior colleges; providing for the repeal of section 239.582, Florida Statutes, which is chapter 69-366 of Laws of Florida, 1969; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Education.

By Senator Knopke—

SB 1090—A bill to be entitled An act relating to flood control districts, water quality; amending sections 378.01(3), (4) and (5) and 378.16(1), Florida Statutes, to authorize the districts to prescribe certain standards, and to engage in activities relating to water quality and use; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Natural Resources and Conservation.

By Senator Knopke—

SB 1091—A bill to be entitled An act relating to pilot commissioners and pilots; amending section 310.01, Florida Statutes, to provide for appointment of a local board of pilot commissioners for each port of the state, including inland waterways; creating the state board of pilot commissioners and providing for its membership, appointment, powers, and duties; requiring a state licensed pilot to be aboard every cargo vessel entering or leaving a port; requiring the state board to submit an annual report to the governor and the legislature; requiring the state board to formulate plans to prevent and minimize cargo spills; amending section 310.18, Florida Statutes, to authorize employment of local director and other employees; amending section 310.20, Florida Statutes, to increase penalty for violation of rule or regulation of local board; amending section 310.21, Florida Statutes, to authorize local director to examine vessel; amending section 310.26, Florida Statutes, to delete amount of shipping required for payment of percentage of pilotage fees to local board; amending section 310.27, Florida Statutes, to delete exception of legal fees for services of local pilot commissioners; repealing sections 310.03, 310.04, 310.041, 310.05, 310.07, 310.08, 310.10, 310.11, 310.14, 310.15, 310.16, 310.17, 310.19, 310.23, 310.24, 310.25, 311.01, 311.02, 311.03, 311.04, and 311.05, Florida Statutes, which pertain to examination and licensing of pilots by pilot commissioners, numbers of apprentices in each port, suspension of pilots and revocation of licenses, records of pilot commis-

sioners, fees for licensing pilots, rates of pilotage, minimum tonnage of pilot boats, registration of pilot boats, unregistered vessels and penalties, piloting in certain ports on certain boats and penalty, rules and regulations of boards of pilot commissioners, examinations of cargo, attendance at sales of cargo, duties of auctioneers, and regulation of the size and kind of boats to be used by bar pilots; providing an effective date.

SB 1092—A bill to be entitled An act relating to elections, registration books; amending chapter 98, Florida Statutes, by adding section 98.0811, prescribing an alternate procedure for removing names from registration books; providing an effective date.

SB 1093—A bill to be entitled An act relating to flood control districts; amending section 378.15, Florida Statutes, by adding section 378.15(6), Florida Statutes, to enable flood control districts to maintain peace and order on district lands and protect the works of the district, by authorizing the appointment of a chief enforcement officer and by granting the board power to vest designated employees with law enforcement powers and duties; amending chapter 378, Florida Statutes, by adding section 378.152, Florida Statutes, to provide for the powers and duties to be confined to carrying out 378.15(6), Florida Statutes; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Natural Resources and Conservation and Judiciary.

SB 1094—A bill to be entitled An act relating to aquatic weed control; providing a short title; providing a declaration of public policy; providing definitions; creating a bureau of aquatic plant control in the game and fresh water fish commission in the department of natural resources to exercise exclusive authority with regard to the control of aquatic weeds; providing for administration by an aquatic plant control council; providing for interagency membership of the council; providing for the powers and duties of the bureau, council and commission; providing for matching funds to local aquatic weed control programs; providing for a research and development advisory committee; amending section 403.271, Florida Statutes, and transferring said section to chapter 372, Florida Statutes, to transfer authority relating to the issuance of permits for importation and transfer of aquatic plants from the department of air and water pollution control to the game and fresh water fish commission; providing an effective date.

SJR 1096—A joint resolution proposing an amendment to Section 6 of Article VII of the State Constitution, providing a cutoff date of January 1, 1971, on establishment of homestead exemptions.

SB 1104—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the department of state; amending section 265.15, Florida Statutes, authorizing Stephen Foster memorial commission to operate land and water conveyances and sell souvenirs and Fosteriana in

keeping with the theme of the Stephen Foster era; and providing an effective date.

SB 1105—A bill to be entitled An act relating to consumer protection; requiring manufacturers of consumer goods to provide local repair service or pay established local rates for warranted repairs; requiring replacement or refund of purchase price when repairs are not made; providing an effective date.

SB 1106—A bill to be entitled An act relating to millage limitation for participation in minimum foundation program to the extent necessary to replace decrease in funds from Public Law 874; amending Section 236.251 (3); repealing all laws or parts of law in conflict herewith; providing an effective date.

SB 1107—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Florida Commission on human relations; removing the lieutenant-governor as chairman of the commission; naming the secretary of the department of community affairs as chairman of the commission; amending subsection 3(d) of chapter 69-287, Laws of Florida (1969); providing an effective date.
