

# JOURNAL OF THE SENATE

Wednesday, May 6, 1970

The Senate was called to order by the President at 8:30 a.m. for the purpose of conducting the order of business of Introduction and reference of Resolutions, Memorials, Bills and Joint Resolutions, pursuant to Rule 4.3.

## INTRODUCTION

By Senator Daniel—

**SB 1206**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the department of health and rehabilitative services; amending paragraph (b) of subsection 2 of section 19 of chapter 69-106, laws of Florida; and subsection 4 of chapter 69-106, laws of Florida; changing the name of the division of adult corrections to the division of corrections; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Governmental Organization.

By Senator Plante—

**SB 1207**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to contributions to candidates and public officeholders; amending section 99.161(15), Florida Statutes; requiring monthly reports of contributions and expenditures while holding office; providing a penalty; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

By Senator Poston—

**SB 1208**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to tangible personal property; providing that tax assessors shall not set a minimum level on the value at which tangible personal property is taxed; providing that the tax assessor shall not use an arbitrary limit to depreciation for the purpose of determining the assessed value of such property; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

By Senator Poston—

**SB 1209**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to reinspection of motor vehicles; amending subsection 317.131 (3), Florida Statutes, by adding paragraph (b); requiring investigating officer of accidents to affix a certificate requiring reinspection on the windshield of a damaged motor vehicle when such motor vehicle has damaged any parts subject to motor vehicle inspection; amending section 325.23, Florida Statutes; requiring the department of highway safety and motor vehicles to adopt rules and regulations for the issuance of said certificates which require reinspection; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Transportation.

By Senator Bell—

**SB 1210**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to fingerprinting; providing for reasonable and temporary detention of persons for purpose of fingerprinting and photographing where reasonably necessary to apprehend perpetrator of a felony; providing for issuance of court order by circuit court or court of record only upon sworn application; providing contents of order; providing that length of such detention be limited to not more than two hours; providing for automatic destruction of such fingerprints or photographs within thirty days absent good cause shown to court; providing all such applications and orders are confidential; exempting other lawfully authorized means of fingerprinting or photographing from operation of act; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

By Senator Deeb—

**SB 1211**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to taxation and conservation of natural resources; imposing an excise tax on the

severance of solid minerals; authorizing a credit up to one hundred percent (100%) of the cost of restoring or improving the site of the severance, but not exceeding eighty percent (80%) of the amount of tax collected; providing for dedication of the site; providing for the administration of such tax and credits by the comptroller and specific boards; providing effective dates.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Natural Resources and Conservation and Ways and Means.

**SB 1212**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to application for license of public lodging and food service establishments; amending subsection (4) of section 509.241, Florida Statutes, to delete the thirty (30) day period of grace; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Commerce and Licensed Businesses.

By Senator Daniel—

**SB 1213**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to secretaries of circuit judges; making such secretaries state employees with compensation paid by state but continuing their status as county employees for purposes of participation in insurance programs; providing for classification and pay plan; providing an appropriation; and providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Governmental Organization and Ways and Means.

By Senator Ott—

**SB 1214**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Florida department of law enforcement; amending section 23.086(5)(b), Florida Statutes; providing for the issuance of subpoenas duces tecum by the department for production of telephone and wire service records; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

By Senator Ott—

**SB 1215**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to careless driving, adding a new section to chapter 317, Florida Statutes, by defining careless driving; providing a penalty; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

By Senator Ott—

**SB 1216**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to negligence action; amending chapter 768, Florida Statutes, by adding section 768.061; providing that damages be awarded according to the comparative negligence principal; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Judiciary and Insurance.

By Senators Friday and Ott—

**SB 1217**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to driving while intoxicated or while under the influence of liquor or drugs; amending sections 186.0177, 317.201 and 860.01, Florida Statutes; adding additional substances that cause impairment of or deprive a driver of his normal faculties; providing for the temporary surrender and suspension of driver's license and his privilege to drive a vehicle upon arrest for a charge of driving while intoxicated or of driving while under the influence of liquor or drugs, or for driving while under the influence of alcoholic beverages, narcotic drugs, barbiturates or other stimulants during such time until said charge is disposed of by the court; providing for temporary work permission by the court; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

By Senators Friday and Ott—

**SB 1218**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to probation; amending sections 947.19 and 948.03(2), Florida Statutes, to permit a court to place restrictions upon a defendant's driver's license when placing such defendant on probation; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Transportation.

By Senators Daniel and Karl—

**SB 1219**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to tax exemption of homes for the aged; amending section 192.06(14)(a), Florida Statutes, to eliminate licensing by the state board of health in certain instances; making the provisions of this act applicable to 1970 taxes; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Health, Welfare, and Institutions and Ways and Means.

By Senator Deeb—

**SB 1220**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to occupational license taxes; amending chapter 205, Florida Statutes, by adding section 205.042, providing for the issuance of county-wide municipal occupational licenses; providing for their sale by the county tax collector; establishing fees to be charged; providing for the distribution to the municipalities of proceeds received on a pro rata formula basis and for revision of such formula; providing for the validity requirements of such license within municipalities; providing for delinquency penalties and half-year fees; providing for the exemption of any municipality which collects license fees on the basis of gross receipts; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Governmental Organization and Ways and Means.

By Senator Ott—

**SB 1221**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to occupational license taxes; amending subsection 205.181(1), Florida Statutes, exempting piscicultural and fish farms from the payment of all forms of license tax when the product is being offered for sale or sold by the producer; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

By Senator Deeb—

**SB 1222**—A bill to be entitled An act adding Section 23.071(2), Florida Statutes; providing that a trainee who attends the Police Standards Council training program at the expense of a municipality, state agency, or political subdivision be obligated to that body for one year or reimburse that body for expenditures expended for such training; providing for an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

By Senator Deeb—

**SB 1223**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to construction of public lodging and public food service establishments; amending section 509.212, Florida Statutes, to authorize the director of the division of hotels and restaurants to order the discontinuance of construction when facilities are not being constructed in accordance with the laws and regulations of this state and to provide that the division shall have no fewer than five construction inspectors; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Commerce and Licensed Businesses.

By Senators Knopke and Deeb—

**SB 1224**—A bill to be entitled An act creating the Tampa Bay conservation and development study commission; prescrib-

ing the membership, appointment, powers, duties, and expiration of the commission; providing an appropriation; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Natural Resources and Conservation and Ways and Means.

By Senator Barrow—

**SB 1225**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the security of state property; amending Section 17.03, Florida Statutes, authorizing the Comptroller to have and utilize proper personnel to protect state warrants; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

By Senator Williams—

**SB 1226**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to junior colleges; providing for total state financial support for the junior college minimum foundation program, repealing sections 230.761(2) and 230.767(7), Florida Statutes, amending subsection (8) of 230.767, Florida Statutes; to remove reference to requirement for minimum financial effort and providing for clarification of procedure for adjusting minimum foundation program; amending section 230.769, Florida Statutes, by deleting requirement for junior college budgets to be reviewed by budget review board; providing legislative intent regarding the operation of junior colleges by district boards of trustees; providing an appropriation; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Education and Ways and Means.

By Senator Deeb—

**SB 1227**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the regulation of shorthand court reporting; amending section 457.051, Florida Statutes, to provide that a person shall be exempt from taking the certified shorthand reporter examination if he has been actively and continuously engaged in the practice of shorthand reporting on or before July 1, 1970; amending section 457.11, Florida Statutes, to require that a person be certified by the division of general regulation before engaging in the practice of shorthand court reporting; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Commerce and Licensed Businesses.

By Senator Williams—

**SB 1228**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to junior colleges; amending section 230.767(3), Florida Statutes, increasing the amount to be included in the junior college minimum foundation program per unit for transportation of students; providing an appropriation; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Education and Ways and Means.

By Senator Ducker—

**SB 1229**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to general drainage; amending section 298.74, Florida Statutes, relating to the drainage of lakes and the consent of owners of abutting property; eliminating minimum area of applicability; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Natural Resources and Conservation.

By Senator Deeb—

**SB 1230**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to private education; creating the board for private education; prescribing powers and duties of the board; providing for certification of private schools; providing penalties; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Education and Governmental Organization.

By Senator Henderson—

**SB 1231**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to inland lakes of less than seven hundred fifty (750) acres; defining certain nuisances related to water pollution and shore erosion; providing a procedure for landowners to petition the board of county commissioners to abate water pollution and shore erosion; authorizing boards of county commissioners to enact ordinances to abate such nuisances; providing an exception for ponds of one hundred fifty (150) acres or less owned by one owner; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Natural Resources and Conservation.

By Senator Knopke—

**SB 1232**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the department of natural resources; requiring persons who engage in dredge or fill activities to obtain a permit from the department of natural resources; requiring monthly reports; authorizing establishment of rules and regulations; prescribing penalties; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Natural Resources and Conservation.

By Senator Deeb—

**SB 1233**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to sanitary regulations of public lodging establishments; amending subsection (3) of section 509.221, Florida Statutes, to delete the requirement that all operating windows in rooms used for sleeping rooms in public lodging establishments be properly screened and each such room contain at least one window which is so arranged as to provide easy access to the outside of the building or courts; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Commerce and Licensed Businesses.

By Senator Deeb—

**SB 1234**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to public food service establishments; repealing subsection (2) (b) (5) of section 509.241, Florida Statutes, which exempted movie theaters from licensing snack bars; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Commerce and Licensed Businesses and Ways and Means.

By Senator Broxson—

**SM 1235**—A memorial to the Congress of the United States urging Congress to adopt the proposal initiated by the late Senator Everett M. Dirksen limiting the appellate jurisdiction of the Supreme Court regarding obscenity and allowing the states to decide what constitutes obscenity within their respective boundaries.

Was read the first time in full and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

By Senator Broxson—

**SCR 1236**—A concurrent resolution urging the United States Supreme Court to reconsider its definition of obscenity.

Was read the first time in full and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

By Senator Broxson—

**SB 1237**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to educational assessment; directing the commissioner of education to develop or cause to be developed an evaluation procedure designed to assess objectively the educational programs offered by the public schools of this state.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Education.

By Senators Deeb and Barron—

**SB 1238**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to liability insurance; amending part X of chapter 627, Florida Statutes, by

adding section 627.0853, to provide, in any civil action where a liability insurer has been joined as an additional party defendant in any suit for damages brought against its insured for damages proximately caused by the latter's negligence, that the plaintiff shall be entitled to require the insurer to disclose the applicable policy limits, but that at the trial on the merits there shall be no reference to insurance, insurance coverage, or joinder in the suit; providing a separate trial on the issue of insurance coverage; providing for entry of judgment; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Insurance and Judiciary.

By Senator Mathews—

**SB 1239**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Jacksonville Expressway Authority, amending the provision relating to the membership of the five member governing body in order to provide for the fifth member when there is no State Road Department; deleting inappropriate language, and providing for the expiration of terms of office.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Transportation and Governmental Organization.

By Senator Lane—

**SB 1240**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the division of universities of the department of education authorizing Florida Atlantic University to establish an institute of advanced professional studies in the city of Fort Lauderdale.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Education.

By Senator Shevin—

**SB 1241**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to divorce; providing for additional compliance with Chapter 88, Florida Statutes; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

By Senator Bafalis—

**SB 1242**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the state revenue commission; providing an appropriation for the employment of one hundred (100) additional tax examiners; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

By Senator Shevin—

**SB 1243**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to corporations; amending section 608.32, Florida Statutes, prescribing the contents of annual reports required to be filed by corporations; providing that if a corporation changes ownership in excess of ten per cent (10%) of the issuance of outstanding stock, it shall file an amended report; providing that railroad, pullman, telephone, telegraph, insurance, banking and trust companies, building and loan associations, co-operative associations and corporations not for profit shall furnish the information required in subsection 1(a) through (h) to the Secretary of State and the Attorney General; providing that the Secretary of State or Attorney General may demand a corporation to produce any agreement under which any trust or other fiduciary claims to hold ownership in the corporation; providing method for dissolution if demand not met; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

By Senator Myers—

**SB 1244**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to program budgets, amending section 23.014, Florida Statutes, to provide for use of the first year of the six year development program; amending section 216.141, Florida Statutes, to add cost procedures; amending sections 216.151(2), 216.151(3), 216.162(1) Florida Statutes, to include a program section and to change the legislative budget submission date; amending

section 216.162(2) to provide for program section translation procedures; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Governmental Organization and Ways and Means.

By Senator Bafalis—

**SB 1245**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to municipal employment of retired firemen and policemen who are sixty-five (65) years or older in fire or police departments; providing for qualifications of such persons; providing for maximum wage; providing for maximum work pay; providing for participation in employee benefits; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Governmental Organization and Ways and Means.

By Senator Bafalis—

**SB 1246**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to charging fees for admission to state parks; amending Section 592.072(1) Florida Statutes, by providing that all persons sixty-five (65) years of age or over shall be admitted without charge to all state parks upon proof of age and provided the vehicle carries a current Florida license tag; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Natural Resources and Conservation and Ways and Means.

By Senator Shevin—

**SB 1247**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the suppression of criminally operated businesses; amending Chapter 932, Florida Statutes, by adding section 932.61, providing that an officeholder, member of the board of directors, managing agent or a stockholder whose interest is in an amount in excess of ten per cent (10%) of the total value of shares outstanding of a corporation or other business association dissolved under sections 932.58 or 932.59, Florida Statutes, shall be prohibited from holding a similar position or any of the above-mentioned positions in another corporation or business association within the state; providing for judicial review; providing for an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

By Senator Bafalis—

**SB 1248**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to insurance; amending section 627.01081, Florida Statutes, by adding section (4) to provide waiver of pre-existing physical condition if a medical examination is not required; providing pre-existing condition be made a part of the policy; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Insurance.

By Senator Knopke—

**SB 1249**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to factory built housing; providing for the duties and powers of the division of technical assistance of the department of community affairs; providing for the inspection and approval of factory built housing; providing penalties; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Commerce and Licensed Businesses and Governmental Organization.

By Senator Saylor—

**SB 1250**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to public employees; amending chapter 112, Florida Statutes, by adding part VI; providing the right of all public employees to a fair and equitable grievance procedure; providing prescription of a uniform grievance procedure by the state division of personnel and retirement; defining "appellate body"; prohibiting coercion, discrimination, or reprisal by any public employer; providing for representation in grievance procedure; providing that violation of this part is a misdemeanor; providing that any conflicting laws, ordinances, rules and regulations, collective

bargaining agreements, or memoranda of agreement are repealed and null and void; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

By Senator Shevin—

**SB 1251**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to penalty for failure to file a report; amending section 608.35, Florida Statutes, by adding subsection (3), providing that any person who falsifies the annual report shall be guilty of a felony and upon conviction be punished by imprisonment of not more than five years and by fine not more than \$1,000.00.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

By Senator Shevin—

**SB 1252**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to dissolution of a corporation or cancellation of its permit for failure to make an annual report and pay capital stock tax; amending section 608.36, Florida Statutes, by adding subsections (2), and (3) and making the present subsections (2), (3) and (4) of section 608.36, Florida Statutes, (4), (5), and (6), respectively, providing that the Secretary of State or the Attorney General upon the failure of the corporation to file the report as provided in section 608.32 may demand that such report be filed; such demand to be made in writing and in the event that demand is made pursuant to subsection (2) of this section and under provisions of section 608.32(5) and the corporation fails to comply within thirty days after such written request has been made upon it, then the Secretary of State or Attorney General, upon showing of a demand, may have a corporation dissolved or its permit canceled for failure to file same; dissolution or cancellation shall be in the same manner as provided by the state revenue commission, providing an effective date.

**SB 1253**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to education; amending section 235.04, Florida Statutes, by adding thereto a provision authorizing school boards to convey with or without consideration, school lands to other public boards or agencies for public education purposes; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Education.

By Senator Scarborough—

**SB 1254**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the banking code; amending section 659.17, Florida Statutes, by adding subsection (7); providing certain limitations on dealer paper used for financing mobile and modular homes; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Commerce and Licensed Businesses.

By Senator Broxson—

**SB 1255**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to motion pictures; prohibiting motion pictures rated "X" or "R" from being previewed during a showing of a motion picture rated for general audiences; making violation a misdemeanor; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Commerce and Licensed Businesses.

By Senator Broxson—

**SB 1256**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to community schools; providing for matching funds for community schools; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Education and Ways and Means.

By Senator Johnson—

**SB 1257**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to state roads; making it unlawful to hitchhike on state roads; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Transportation.

By Senator Broxson—

**SB 1258**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to operation of Florida welcome stations; amending paragraph (d), item 329, section 1 of chapter 69-100, Laws of Florida; providing authority for department of commerce (formerly development commission) to suspend operation of a certain welcome station; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Transportation.

By Senator Shevin—

**SB 1259**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the inspection of books to be kept by a corporation; amending subsection (1) of section 608.39, Florida Statutes, to provide that the Attorney General may inspect stock books, in order to determine the accuracy of any report filed pursuant to sections 608.32, 608.35 and 608.36, Florida Statutes, or to secure the information required to be furnished under section 608.32, Florida Statutes, providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

By Senator Mathews—

**SM 1260**—A memorial to the Congress of the United States urging the early adoption of a program of Federal Revenue Sharing with the States of revenue derived from Federal taxation of income.

Was read the first time in full and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

By Senator Horne—

**SB 1261**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to thoroughbred horse racing; amending sections 550.40, 550.41, 550.42, and section 550.44, Florida Statutes; providing for a spring and fall thoroughbred horse racing season; authorizing the state racing commission to issue additional licenses for such spring and fall thoroughbred racing season; providing for the time of operation for spring and fall thoroughbred horse racing; providing for taxes, commission, breakage on spring and fall thoroughbred horse racing; providing for a minimum purse per race of two thousand dollars (\$2,000); providing for allocation and re-allocation of racing periods; providing for application of section 550, Florida Statutes; repealing conflicting laws; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Commerce and Licensed Businesses and Ways and Means.

**SB 1262**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to exceptional child education; making appropriations for state educational consultants for the deaf, blind, and gifted; providing for a state depository to purchase and distribute braille books, large print books and related materials for visually handicapped students; providing for specialized leadership personnel for the implementation of a hearing conservation program in the public schools of the state; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Education and Ways and Means.

By Senator Sayler—

**SB 1263**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to exemptions from ad valorem taxation; amending chapter 196, Florida Statutes; providing a procedure for exemptions from ad valorem taxation of such portions of any property used predominantly for educational, literary, scientific, religious or charitable purposes; repealing sections 196.201, 196.211, 196.22, and 196.30, Florida Statutes; amending section 196.191, Florida Statutes;

establishing criteria for granting exemptions; adding new sections prescribing duties and procedures of the tax assessor and the board of tax adjustment; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

By Senator Johnson—

**SB 1264**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to tenure; providing that tenure shall not be granted to or held by any person classified otherwise than teacher; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Education.

By Senator de la Parte—

**SB 1265**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to planning and budgeting; amending subsection (2) of section 216.181, Florida Statutes, by providing that the director may waive requirements for submission of operating budgets during the 1970-71 fiscal year and substituting in lieu thereof other procedures; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

By Senator Friday—

**SB 1266**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to civil procedure; amending section 45.031, Florida Statutes, providing a judicial sales procedure; changing the time for sales, permitting the time to be enlarged by court order and eliminating a time for redemption in judgments and orders; requiring the forms prescribed by the statute to carry a court caption as provided in the rules of civil procedure; amending the method of assessing deficiency judgments; repealing section 702.02, Florida Statutes; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

By Senator Knopke—

The Committee appointed to wait upon the astronauts reappeared escorting astronauts Charles Conrad, Jr., Captain, USN, and Alan L. Bean, Captain, USN, who were greeted by the Speaker and presented to the joint assembly by the President. Following an address by the astronauts, the committee escorted them from the rostrum and from the House chamber.

On motion by Senator Friday, the Senate withdrew from the joint session and resumed its session at 1:38 p.m. A quorum present.

The Senate adjourned at 1:42 p.m. to reconvene at 8:30 a.m., Thursday, May 7, 1970.
