

JOURNAL OF THE FLORIDA SENATE

Monday, April 19, 1971

The Senate was called to order by the President at 8:30 a.m. for the purpose of conducting the order of business of Introduction and reference of Resolutions, Memorials, Bills and Joint Resolutions, pursuant to Rule 4.3.

INTRODUCTION

By Senator Stolzenburg—

SB 775—A bill to be entitled An act relating to taxation; method of fixing millage; amending chapter 200, Florida Statutes, by adding sections 200.031, 200.041 and 200.051, to provide that the governing and budget-making authorities of counties, tax districts and other tax levying agencies shall decrease the millage required of such county or district in proportion to the increase of the general level of assessed valuation of property; authorizing a ten percent (10%) increase in millage; providing for further millage increases in emergencies subject to limitations and review by a county budget commission or a county review commission; providing for verification of budgets and millage increases; authorizing the creation of a county review commission in certain counties and providing for performance of duties by the county officers constituting such review commission; specifying millages to be excluded from the reductions required by this act; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

By Senators Poston and Hollahan—

SB 776—A bill to be entitled An act regulating the location, construction, operation and expansion of electrical generating plants, vesting jurisdiction over such plants in the Trustees of the Internal Improvement Trust Fund; providing definitions; providing for a declaration of public policy and legislative intent consistent with the policy of protection of the environment and natural resources of the State of Florida; providing for the issuance of permits; establishing procedures for enforcement; providing penalties; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Natural Resources and Conservation.

By Senator Karl—

SB 777—A bill to be entitled An act relating to unemployment compensation; amending subsections (5), (7) and (13) of section 443.03, F.S., to redefine "employment", "employer", and "wages"; adding subsection (5) to section 443.04, F.S., to provide for extended benefits; amending section 443.05, F.S., to revise benefit eligibility conditions; adding subsections (4) and (5) to section 443.08, F.S., to provide for financing certain benefits; amending section 443.09, F.S. to conform coverage termination provisions; amending subsections (2) and (3) of section 443.10, F.S., to include provisions for extended benefits; amending subsection (5) of section 443.12, F.S., to provide for advisory councils; amending paragraph (a) of subsection (11) of section 443.12, F.S., to require of this state certain state-federal cooperation; amending subsection (1) of section 443.14, F.S., to remove requirement of separate bank account; amending subsection (1) of section 443.18, F.S., to require participation in certain reciprocal arrangements; and providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary—Civil B.

By the Committee on Universities and Community Colleges—

SB 778—A bill to be entitled An act abolishing the board of regents placing the division of universities directly under the state board of education; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Governmental Efficiency.

By Senator Wilson—

SB 779—A bill to be entitled An act relating to marriage; amending chapter 741, Florida Statutes, by adding section 741-

065, providing that certain persons cannot marry without court approval; providing that certain marriages conducted in other states shall not be recognized in Florida; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary—Civil A.

By Senator Daniel—

SB 780—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the fine arts council of the department of state; amending §20.10(8) and (9)(a) and (c), and 265.29, Florida Statutes; renaming said council fine arts and humanities council; providing the secretary of state shall fill vacancies on the council and may remove any member of the council for cause; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Governmental Efficiency.

By Senator Daniel—

SB 781—A bill to be entitled An act relating to governmental reorganization; transferring from the board of trustees of the internal improvement trust fund to the division of corporations of the department of state all powers, duties and functions relating to patents, trademarks or copyrights under §§286.021 and 286.031, Florida Statutes; adding subsection (12) to §20.10, Florida Statutes, and amending §§20.27, 286.021 and 286.031, Florida Statutes, 1970 Supplement, to effect such transfer; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Governmental Efficiency.

By Senator Daniel—

SB 782—A bill to be entitled An act relating to snack bars, cafeterias and vending machines located in state buildings; providing that the division of building construction and maintenance of the department of general services shall have the powers, duties and functions to establish regulations to be followed by vendors and operators in state buildings, to allocate and lease space and to charge fees to vendors and operators, to establish a bureau of food management service, and to establish a "food management trust fund" to be comprised of lease and vending fees and other funds; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Governmental Efficiency.

By Senator Daniel—

SB 783—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Department of Commerce; amending Section 288.10, Florida Statutes, to create advisory councils for advertising, economic development, tourism, international trade and marketing; providing for the term of office and manner of selection; providing for the payment of per diem and expenses for attendance at meetings; providing their functions and duties; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Governmental Efficiency.

By Senator Daniel—

SB 784—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the department of business regulation; amending subsection (1) of section 399.01, Florida Statutes, to transfer all powers, duties and functions relating to the enforcement of the elevator inspection law under Chapter 399, Florida Statutes, from the division of general regulation to the division of hotels and restaurants; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Governmental Efficiency.

By Senators Horne, Boyd, Daniel, Saunders, Arnold, Thomas and Pope—

SB 785—A bill to be entitled An act relating to state public officers and employees; providing recomputation of retirement

benefits to persons over sixty-five (65) years of age with ten (10) years of creditable service; amending chapter 112, Florida Statutes, by adding section 112.363; providing an appropriation; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Personnel, Retirement and Claims and Ways and Means.

By Senators Horne, Boyd, Daniel, Saunders, Arnold, Thomas and Pope —

SB 786—A bill to be entitled An act relating to state public officers and employees; providing recomputation of retirement benefits to persons over sixty-five (65) years of age with ten (10) years of creditable service; amending section 112.362, Florida Statutes; providing an appropriation; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Personnel, Retirement and Claims and Ways and Means.

By Senators Horne, Thomas, Boyd, Daniel, Saunders, Arnold, and Pope—

SB 787—A bill to be entitled An act relating to retirement system for school teachers; amending section 238.07(16)(a)4-(b), Florida Statutes, relating to retired members; providing an effective date.

By Senator Horne—

SB 788—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the highway patrol; amending section 321.05; declaring members of the Florida highway patrol to be law enforcement officers of the state; authorizing members of the patrol to apply for, serve, and execute search warrants, arrest warrants, capias and other process of the court; deleting certain provisions prohibiting search and seizure; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary—Criminal.

SB 789—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the department of state; providing for an increase in fees to be paid to the department of state; amending section 15.09(1)(a)(b), Florida Statutes, amending section 15.091, Florida Statutes, amending section 48.091(2), Florida Statutes, amending section 48.161(1), Florida Statutes, amending section 495.031(6), Florida Statutes, amending section 495.071(1), Florida Statutes, amending 495.081, Florida Statutes, amending section 506.08, Florida Statutes, amending section 604.11(2), Florida Statutes, amending section 608.05, Florida Statutes, amending section 608.37(1)(2), Florida Statutes, amending section 609.02, Florida Statutes, amending section 613.02(1), Florida Statutes, amending section 617.015, Florida Statutes, amending section 617.11(1), Florida Statutes, amending section 618.04(8)(b), Florida Statutes, amending section 618.05, Florida Statutes, amending section 620.02(2)(b), Florida Statutes, amending amending section 620.44, Florida Statutes, amending section 679.402(6), Florida Statutes; providing for an increase in the fee authorized to be paid to the department of state or other officers; providing for a trust fund; providing for the deposit of the increase authorized by this act to be deposited in said trust fund; providing for the use of said trust fund; providing for an effective date.

SB 790—A bill to be entitled An act relating to unemployment compensation; amending subsection (5) of Section 443.03, Florida Statutes, to redefine employment to include services performed by employees of the state; providing an effective date.

SB 791—A bill to be entitled An act relating to unemployment compensation; amending subsection (2) of section 443.04, Florida Statutes, by providing a formula for relating maximum weekly benefit amount to a State average weekly wage, and providing an effective date.

SB 792—A bill to be entitled An act relating to unemployment compensation; to repeal subsection (8) of section 443.06, Florida Statutes, providing for disqualification for benefits upon receipt of or eligibility for pension income; and providing an effective date.

SB 793—A bill to be entitled An act relating to unemployment compensation; amending section 443.15(1)(b), Florida Statutes, to increase the penalty for delinquent reports; and providing an effective date.

SB 794—A bill to be entitled An act relating to unemployment compensation; amending section 443.06(1), Florida Statutes, providing for disqualification for benefits for voluntarily leaving employment without good cause; and providing an effective date.

By Senator Karl—

SB 795—A bill to be entitled An act relating to unemployment compensation; amending section 443.08(2)(a) and (b), Florida Statutes, to provide for contribution rates of certain employers; amending section 443.08(3)(h), Florida Statutes, to prescribe conditions for reductions in contribution rates; and providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary—Civil B.

By Senator Ware—

SB 796—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Florida highway code; amending section 339.24(1), Florida Statutes; and adding subsection (4) to said section; providing for cooperation in road or street beautification programs by the division of road operations, boards of county commissioners, and municipal corporations; providing that division of road operations shall not destroy trees or shrubbery within rights-of-way of roads or streets in areas within the jurisdiction of such counties or municipalities; providing exceptions; providing that the division of road operations shall not prohibit the planting of trees or shrubbery by county or cities within rights-of-way of certain roads and streets; providing exceptions; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Transportation.

SM 797—A Memorial to the Congress of the United States to request that Kennedy Space Center be the site for construction of the space shuttle.

Was read the first time in full and referred to the Committee on Rules, Calendar, Privileged Business and Ethics.

By the Committee on Health, Welfare and Institutions—

SB 798—A bill to be entitled An act removing disqualification of felons from employment by the state or any of its agen-

cies except law enforcement agencies, removing disqualification of felons whose civil rights have been restored for trade, occupational or professional license or certificate solely by reason of the prior conviction of a felony, permitting denial of employment or license if felony for which convicted directly relates to position or license sought, providing administrative procedure for violation, repealing section 112.01 Florida Statutes and any other act or parts of acts in conflict herewith, providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Governmental Efficiency.

By Senator Bell—

SB 799—A bill to be entitled An act relating to universities and junior colleges; amending section 239.582, Florida Statutes, to apply only to students charged or adjudicated guilty of a felony under chapter 398 or chapter 404, Florida Statutes; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Universities and Community Colleges.

By Senator Lewis (43rd)—

SB 800—A bill to be entitled An act relating to persons convicted of the felony of possessing cannabis; providing relief of such persons upon enactment of a law making the crime a misdemeanor; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary—Criminal.

By Senator Lewis (43rd)—

SJR 801—A joint resolution proposing an amendment to section 1, article X of the constitution of the state of Florida, relating to amendments to the constitution of the United States.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary—Civil A.

By the Committee on Governmental Efficiency—

SB 802—A bill to be entitled An act relating to communications systems and services; amending subsections (2), (6), (9), and (12) of section 287.25; amending section 287.25 further by adding subsection (20); and amending section 287.26, Florida Statutes; providing additional clarification of duties and responsibilities of the division of communications, department of general services, specifying the division of communications' authority to approve communications plans and programs and their implementation; to approve communications equipment and facilities for all state agencies regardless of source of funds; further authorizing the division of communications, department of general services, to enter into contracts or agreements for all state agencies and for political subdivisions of the state; to standardize policies and procedures for the use of all state communications services, equipment, and facilities; further authorizing the division of communications, department of general services, to apply for, receive, and hold for all agencies, federal communications commission authorizations, licenses, and allocations of channels and frequencies; and authorizing the

division to approve all items related to communications before being budgeted, purchased, leased, or otherwise acquired; adding the word "television" to the definition of communications or communications systems; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Governmental Efficiency.

SB 803—A bill to be entitled An act amending section 193.65 (1), Florida Statutes, to require the school boards to pay the commissions to the tax assessor on all non-voted school millage; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Governmental Efficiency.

By the Committee on Governmental Efficiency—

SB 804—A bill to be entitled An act amending section 194.015 (1), Florida Statutes, pertaining to the composition of the board of tax adjustment; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Governmental Efficiency.

By the Committee on Governmental Efficiency—

SB 805—A bill to be entitled An act relating to drivers license reexamination fees; amending section 322.121(2), Florida Statutes; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Governmental Efficiency and Ways and Means.

By the Committee on Governmental Efficiency—

SB 806—A bill to be entitled An act relating to vacancies on community health boards; amending section 394.70(1)(e), Florida Statutes; providing an effective date.

SB 808—A bill to be entitled An act relating to workmen's compensation; amending §440.11, Florida Statutes, appearing as subsection (1) of §440.11, Florida Statutes, 1970 Supplement, relating to the exclusiveness of an employer's liability to secure payment of compensation relating to medical services, disability and death, to provide that such liability shall also be exclusive of such employer's liability to any third party tortfeasor; providing an effective date.
