

SPECIAL SESSION

JOURNAL OF THE SENATE

At a special session of the Florida Senate convened under Section 3, Article III, of the Constitution of the State, as revised in 1968, begun and held at the Capitol, in the City of Tallahassee, in the State of Florida.

Tuesday, November 17, 1970

In pursuance of the Proclamation of the Honorable Claude R. Kirk, Jr., Governor of the State of Florida, the Senate met in Special Session at 11:45 a.m., and was called to order by the President; the Secretary of the Senate, Elmer O. Friday, and the Sergeant at Arms of the Senate, LeRoy Adkison, being at their posts.

The Proclamation of the Governor convening the Senate in Special Session was read as follows:

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 3, Article III, Constitution of 1968, the Legislature has, on this date, convened for the purpose of organization and selection of officers, and

WHEREAS, it would be appropriate for the Legislature to consider properly funding the Governor-Elect during the transitional period of administrations, and

WHEREAS, I find that it is in the best interest of the citizens of the State that the Legislature be convened on this date for this purpose;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Claude R. Kirk, Jr., by virtue of the power and authority vested in me, do hereby convene a one day special session of the Legislature at the Capitol, Tuesday, November 17, 1970 to commence immediately upon the conclusion of the organizational session. This call is for the sole and exclusive purpose of considering the adoption of an appropriation for the use of the Governor-Elect during the transitional period of administrations.



IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Florida to be affixed at Tallahassee, the Capitol, this 17 day of November, 1970.

INTRODUCTION

By Senators Henderson, Broxson, Gunter, de la Parte and McClain—

SB 1-A—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the governor-elect; establishing an operating fund for the governor-elect; providing that the governor-elect may employ staff; providing an inauguration expense fund; providing for the appointment of an inauguration coordinator; providing that the department of general services shall provide office space; providing appropriations; providing an effective date.

Was read the first time by title. On motion by Senator Henderson, the rules were waived and the bill was placed on the Calendar.

On motion by Senator Henderson, the rules were waived and SB 1-A was read the second time by title.

Senator Henderson offered the following amendment which was adopted:

In Section 5, line 19, page 3, insert: The Legislative Auditing Committee, created under Section 11.40, Florida Statutes, is authorized to increase the appropriation to the operating fund and to the inauguration expense fund upon the request of the Governor-Elect.

On motion by Senator Hollahan the Senate reconsidered the vote by which the foregoing amendment was adopted this day. By permission Senator Henderson withdrew the amendment.

Senator Wilson offered the following amendment which was adopted:

In Section 5, lines 17 and 18, page 3, strike: "twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000)" and insert: fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000)

On motion by Senator Henderson, the rules were waived and SB 1-A as amended was read the third time by title, passed and ordered engrossed. The vote was: Yeas—46 Nays—None
