

JOURNAL OF THE FLORIDA SENATE

Tuesday, February 15, 1972

The Senate was called to order by the President at 8:30 a.m. for the purpose of conducting the order of business of introduction and reference of resolutions, memorials, bills and joint resolutions pursuant to Rule 4.3.

SB 678—A bill to be entitled An act relating to exemptions from ad valorem taxation; creating §196.200, Florida Statutes; providing additional provisions for exempting real property used by homes for the aged; establishing procedures and criteria for granting exemptions; establishing a maximum exemption; providing a definition; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

By Senators Knopke and Sayler—

SB 679—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the regulation of motorboats; amending §371.021(2), (9) and (11)(b), §371.031(1), §371.041, §371.051(1)(a), (2), (4) and (5), §371.57(3)(a), §371.64, and §371.75(1), Florida Statutes; amending §371.65(1)—(4), (6) and (7), Florida Statutes, as amended by chapter 70-336, Laws of Florida; providing changes in definitions; providing for the deletion of references to chapters 370 and 372, Florida Statutes; providing for deletion of references to the commission; providing for registration of all motorboats; providing a change in the time for registration; providing that class 2 motorboats be furnished with additional safety equipment; providing new classifications of motorboats; providing an appropriation and a change in distribution of fees; repealing §371.021(8), Florida Statutes, the definition of commission; repealing §371.051(3) and (10), Florida Statutes, relating to application for registration certificates; providing an effective date.

SB 680—A bill to be entitled An act relating to free county libraries, operating grants; amending section 257.17, Florida Statutes, by removing the limit of fifty thousand dollars of state funds for county operating grants during any one year; providing an effective date.

By Senators Graham, Gunter and Gong—

SB 681—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the state treasurer; amending §18.11, Florida Statutes, to provide that United States government guaranteed student loans and small business administration loans posted as security for deposit of public funds shall be retained by the bank posting such security; requiring a monthly statement of accounting to be given the state treasurer; providing an effective date.

SB 686—A bill to be entitled An act for relief of Blake Hunt, father and natural guardian of William F. Hunt, a minor, providing for an appropriation to compensate him for personal injury and mental anguish suffered by his said minor son, William F. Hunt, as a result of the negligence of the personnel employed by the Department of Education of the State of Florida; providing an effective date.

SB 687—A bill to be entitled An act relating to Chapter 470, Florida Statutes; directing the statutory revision department to change certain terminology in the funeral directors and embalmers law; providing an effective date.

SB 699—A bill to be entitled An act relating to declarations of trust; amending §689.075(1) and (2), Florida Statutes, as amended by chapter 71-126, Laws of Florida; amending §689.075(4), Florida Statutes; creating §689.075(5), Florida Statutes; providing a list of reasons that shall not cause an otherwise valid trust to be held invalid; providing for the deletion of any reference to the execution of a trust in accordance with the formalities of the execution of wills; providing that such execution shall be in conformity with certain requirements; providing for applicability to certain trusts already executed; providing an effective date.

SB 701—A bill to be entitled An act relating to acknowledgment and proof of instruments affecting real and personal property; amending §695.03 (1) and (2), Florida Statutes, as amended by chapter 71-53, Laws of Florida, providing that acknowledgment or proof in this state may be made before a clerk or deputy clerk of a court of record; providing that when a notary public out of this state does not affix a seal, a certificate of proper authority is sufficient; providing an effective date.

SB 702—A bill to be entitled An act relating to condominiums; amending §711.08(1), Florida Statutes, as amended by chapter 70-273, Laws of Florida, providing that a lawfully authorized agent of the persons having record title to such land may submit the same to condominium; providing an effective date.

By Senator Ware—

SB 703—A bill to be entitled An act relating to estates by survivorship; amending §689.15, Florida Statutes; providing that a joint tenancy with right of survivorship may be created; providing an alternative method of creating the estates; validating conveyances heretofore executed; providing an effective date.

SB 704—A bill to be entitled An act relating to death certificates; amending §382.081 (1) (a), Florida Statutes, to provide that the certificate of death shall include the name and residence address of the surviving spouse or of the nearest living relative; providing an effective date.

SB 705—A bill to be entitled An act relating to child labor; amending §450.011, Florida Statutes, providing definitions; amending §§450.021, 450.111 and 232.07, Florida Statutes, clarifying minimum age for specified employment, the type of employment certificates to be issued, and the prerequisites for each; amending §450.151, Florida Statutes, limiting the crime to obscene, immoral or dangerous employment and increasing the age to eighteen; amending §450.161, Florida Statutes, specifying minimum age for certain employment; amending §450.081(4), Florida Statutes, providing for the inclusion of the hour of employment limitation, previously contained in §450.031, Florida Statutes; repealing §§450.031, 450.041 and 450.071, Florida Statutes, relating to street trades, messengers and employment in pool rooms; providing an effective date.
