

# JOURNAL OF THE FLORIDA SENATE

Monday, February 21, 1972

The Senate was called to order by the President at 8:30 a.m. for the purpose of conducting the order of business of introduction and reference of resolutions, memorials, bills and joint resolutions pursuant to Rule 4.3.

## INTRODUCTION

By Senator Poston—

SB 820—A bill to be entitled An act relating to public schools; providing a program of risk management for public schools; creating a public school insurance trust fund to provide loss indemnification for buildings and contents of all district school systems; creating a school risk management control committee; providing appropriations; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Public Schools and Ways and Means.

By Senator Gunter—

SB 821—A bill to be entitled An act relating to public officials; requiring disclosure of financial interests by legislators, executive and judicial officers; providing procedures; providing penalties; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Governmental Efficiency.

By Senator Brantley (By request)—

SB 822-SF—A proposal to be entitled An act relating to the construction industry licensing board.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Governmental Efficiency.

By Senator Gunter—

SB 823—A bill to be entitled An act relating to public officials; requiring disclosure of financial interests by elective state officers; providing disclosure be kept confidential unless there is an irregularity or report is not filed; providing for the establishment of a government ethics committee; providing for a hearing; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Governmental Efficiency.

By Senator Plante—

SB 824—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the business of construction or maintenance of pools; providing for the creation of a licensing board; providing definitions; providing for terms, qualifications, powers and duties of the board; providing application and certification procedures and fees therefor; providing for annual license fees; providing for maintenance of records of the board; providing penalties and exemptions; authorizing disbursement of fees collected; providing that tax collectors shall be notified; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Commerce and Governmental Efficiency.

By Senator Daniel—

SB 825—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Florida mental health act; amending subsections (2) and (13) of §8 of chapter 71-131, Laws of Florida; exempting physicians in the employment of the state or the United States from requirements of state licensing; including facilities of the United States within the definition of "treatment facility"; amending §394.457 (3) and (8), Florida Statutes, as amended by chapter 71-131, Laws of Florida; permitting the department of health and rehabilitative services to contract with facilities of the United States; designating facilities of the United States as treatment facilities; amending subsections (1) and (2), and paragraph (b) of subsection (3) of §6 of chapter 71-131, Laws of Florida; permitting designation of federal facilities as a receiving or treatment facility; permitting transfer of certain

patients from federal facilities within the state to federal facilities in other states under certain circumstances; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Health, Welfare and Institutions.

By Senator Gong—

SB 826—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the parole and probation commission; amending subsection 20.32(2), Florida Statutes; removing the requirement that appointments to the parole and probation commission be made from among the first three (3) eligible persons on the list of persons eligible for said position; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary—Criminal.

By Senator Daniel—

SB 827—A bill to be entitled An act relating to workmen's compensation; amending §440.43, Florida Statutes, to provide for penalties for employers as defined in §440.02(4), Florida Statutes, who fail to secure workmen's compensation; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary—Civil B.

By the Committee on Ways and Means—

SB 828—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the division of motor pool; amending section 287.16(1) (3), Florida Statutes, adding new subsections (10) and (11), creating and limiting executive aircraft pool, providing against the specific assignment of aircraft in the executive aircraft pool and requiring for collection and deposit of fees from persons traveling in the executive aircraft pool; providing an appropriation; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Governmental Efficiency and Ways and Means.

By Senator Pope—

SB 829—A bill to be entitled An act relating to retirement; providing that a member of the teachers' or state and county retirement systems with five (5) years of contributing service, who was not employed due to injury or illness at the time the Florida retirement system was established, and whose retirement contributions have not been refunded, may transfer to the Florida retirement system solely to retire under the disability provisions of said system if otherwise qualified; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Personnel, Retirement and Claims.

By Senator Gong—

SB 830—A bill to be entitled An act relating to private employment agencies; amending subsection (2) of section 449.022 and section 449.03, Florida Statutes, and creating subsection (2) to section 449.021, Florida Statutes; providing for an application fee to cover costs of processing; providing for payment of license fee and posting of bond upon approval of application by the department of state; providing for severability; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Commerce.

By Senator Trask—

SB 831—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the judicial retirement system; amending §123.06(2), Florida Statutes, as amended by chapter 70-199, Laws of Florida, to define average final compensation as the best five (5) of the last ten (10)

years of service; protecting rights which the members acquired under present provisions; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Personnel, Retirement and Claims and Ways and Means.

By Senator Trask—

SB 832—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the judicial retirement system; adding subsection (3) to §123.06, Florida Statutes; providing a cost-of-living increase from July 1, 1972, for retired members and those members who retire on or after July 1, 1972; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Personnel, Retirement and Claims and Ways and Means.

By Senator Saylor—

SB 833—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the district public school system; amending §232.26, Florida Statutes, to provide that the principal or teacher in charge of a school may dismiss any pupil without an order by the school board under certain circumstances; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Public Schools.

By Senator Barron—

SB 834—A bill to be entitled An act relating to insurance; providing that the receiver of an insolvent insurer shall be entitled to recover court costs and reasonable attorney's fees in any action brought by the receiver to recover assets of the insolvent insurer in which a judgment or decree is entered in favor of the receiver; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary—Civil A.

By Senator Barron—

SB 835—A bill to be entitled An act relating to insurance; amending chapter 631, Florida Statutes, by adding new section 631.396; creating a receiver's claims trust account; providing procedures for the administration and payment of funds held in said trust account; providing that unclaimed funds held by the receiver for more than two years may be declared by the receivership court to be abandoned; providing that such abandoned funds are to be deposited in the "insurance commissioner's regulatory trust fund;" providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Commerce.

By Senator Gunter—

SB 836—A bill to be entitled An act relating to appropriations; amending section 32 of chapter 71-357, Laws of Florida, by deleting the requirement that all unencumbered moneys in excess of \$200,000.00 be transferred to general revenue.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

By Senator Haverfield—

SB 837—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Florida retirement system; amending §2(20), chapter 70-112, Laws of Florida, appearing as §121.021(20), Florida Statutes, to amend the definition of "military service"; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Personnel, Retirement and Claims.

By Senator Karl—

SB 838—A bill to be entitled An act relating to corporations; amending Chapter 608, Florida Statutes, by adding new Section 608.151; authorizing corporations to effect share transfers, share distributions or reclassification; mergers, consolidations, or reorganizations by (1) issuance of fractions of a share, (2) arrangements for sale or purchase of fractional inter-

ests, (3) payment of cash for fractional shares or (4) issuance of scrip; and providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary—Civil A.

By the Committee on Public Schools—

SB 839—A bill to be entitled An act relating to education; amending section 231.10, Florida Statutes, abolishing the teacher education advisory council and creating the Florida council on teacher education; providing for twenty-one (21) members; providing for a chairman; prescribing the procedure for appointments and terms of office; providing for reimbursement for expenses; prescribing duties of the council; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Public Schools and Governmental Efficiency.

By Senators Hollahan, Fincher and Deeb—

SB 840—A bill to be entitled An act to amend section 233.13, to provide for the furnishing of textbooks to pupils in all schools of Florida, non-public as well as public.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Public Schools and Ways and Means.

By Senators Hollahan, Fincher and Deeb—

SB 841—A bill to be entitled An act to amend section 234.01, to provide for transportation for pupils in non-public schools on the same basis as are provided for pupils in public schools.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Public Schools and Ways and Means.

By Senator Boyd—

SB 842—A bill to be entitled An Act Relating to Barbers; amending sections 476.08 (2), 476.11 (1) (a), and 476.22 (1) (b) and (c), Florida Statutes, to require applicants to have a chest X-ray, deleting the need for passing the Wasserman test; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Commerce.

By Senator Lane—

SB 843—A bill to be entitled An Act relating to frontons; amending section 551.06, Florida Statutes; increasing the tax provided for therein from three percent (3%) to five percent (5%) where there are more than one fronton located in a radius of one hundred (100) air miles of each other; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Rules, Calendar, Privileged Business and Ethics and Ways and Means.

By Senator de la Parte—

SB 844—A bill to be entitled An Act relating to restoration of civil rights; amending sections 940.01 and 940.05, Florida Statutes; providing for the automatic restoration of rights of citizenship under certain conditions; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary—Criminal.

By Senator Daniel—

SB 845—A bill to be entitled An act relating to taxation, intangible personal property tax; providing a service charge on collection for expenses; amending subsection (7)(a) of section 199.052, Florida Statutes; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

By Senator Poston—

SB 846—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Florida highway code; creating §335.070, Florida Statutes; providing for establishment of minimum design, construction and maintenance standards; providing for an advisory committee; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Transportation and Governmental Efficiency.

By Senator Poston—

SB 847—A bill to be entitled An act relating to traffic safety; creating §334.170, Florida Statutes, providing a requirement for each county and city having over fifty thousand inhabitants to employ engineers for traffic safety purposes; providing for use of gas tax funds for such purposes; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Transportation and Ways and Means.

By Senator McClain—

SB 848—A bill to be entitled An act providing for an appropriation from the general revenue fund of the State of Florida to the Tampa port authority; providing for the repayment; providing for an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

By Senator Johnson (29th)—

SB 849—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the prevention of certain communicable diseases; providing that the division of health shall regulate the sale and distribution of household pet turtles and household pet turtle eggs; providing for the establishment of testing and standards; providing for destruction of contaminated turtles or eggs; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Health, Welfare and Institutions.

By Senator Johnson (29th)—

SB 850—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the continual evaluation of the needs of the aged; creating the committee on aging; providing for the membership, duties, and powers of the committee; providing that members shall be paid travel and per diem expenses; providing for committee reports; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Governmental Efficiency and Ways and Means.

By Senator Karl—

SB 851—A bill to be entitled An act relating to employment agencies; amending sections 449.01(3) and (9), 449.02(1), 449.022(3) and (5), 449.025, 449.026(1), 449.04, 449.05(5), (7), (8), and (9), and 449.17, Florida Statutes; creating sections 449.01(18), (19) and (20), and 449.02(3), Florida Statutes; amending the definitions for model agency and agency employee; creating definitions for acceptance of employment, permanent position, and temporary position; providing for an administrative penalty; adding further prohibited practices for the violation of which a license may be denied, revoked, suspended, or an administrative fine assessed; providing that certain information be printed on contracts or receipts; limiting the period of obligation of an applicant to an employment agency; providing for a late license renewal penalty; requiring that records be maintained for one year instead of three years; providing for advance fees; requiring the use of receipts; providing for refund of fees under certain conditions; setting forth obligations of an employment agency to an applicant discharged for certain reasons from a position after paying a fee; increasing the size of the advisory council and providing for at least one member to represent the general public; repealing section 449.05(6) relating to referral cards; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Commerce.

By Senator Myers—

SB 852—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the public health; creating the Uniform Food Inspection Reorganization Act; providing for a uniform program of food inspections for the protection of public health; setting forth legislative findings and declaration of purposes; delineating the responsibilities of the department of business regulation, department of agriculture and consumer services and department of health and rehabilitative services; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Health, Welfare and Institutions and Governmental Efficiency.

By Senator Williams—

SJR 853—A JOINT RESOLUTION proposing an amendment to Section 9 of Article XII of the State Constitution relating to bonds.

—was read the first time and referred to the Committees on Transportation and Ways and Means.

By Senator Williams—

SB 854—A bill to be entitled An act relating to education, public schools; providing for a maximum local effort for the minimum foundation program for fiscal year 1972-73; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Public Schools and Ways and Means.

By Senators Henderson, Boyd, Horne, Gong, Karl and Graham—

SB 855—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the state theater of Florida, known as the Asolo Theater; providing an appropriation therefor; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

By Senators Barrow, de la Parte, Thomas, Myers, Trask, Williams and Daniel—

SB 856—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the auditor general; creating section 11.49, Florida Statutes; creating the division of public assistance fraud; requiring the auditor general to make investigations on his own initiative or whenever required by the legislative auditing committee; providing rights, privileges, and powers; providing an appropriation; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Governmental Efficiency and Ways and Means.

By Senator Lane—

SB 857—A bill to be entitled An act relating to Broward County, Florida; amending section 1 of chapter 1191, Laws of Florida, 1957, as amended by chapter 61-1944, Laws of Florida; providing that the board of county commissioners is authorized to include in its annual budget and to appropriate whatever sums are necessary for the Broward County Traffic Association, Inc., a non-profit corporation of Florida; providing an effective date.

Evidence of notice and publication was established by the Senate as to SB 857.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Ways and Means and Rules, Calendar, Privileged Business and Ethics.

By Senator Daniel—

SB 858—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the department of revenue; amending §20.21(2), Florida Statutes, to establish five divisions within the department; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Governmental Efficiency.

By Senator Knopke—

SB 859—A bill to be entitled An act relating to Hillsborough County, additional alcoholic beverage license; authorizing the issuance of a club liquor license to the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States, Hatton-Gillett Post 121; providing limitations affecting transfer and service; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Rules, Calendar, Privileged Business and Ethics.

By Senator Henderson—

SB 860—A bill to be entitled An act relating to disposition of unclaimed property; amending subsection (1) of §717.18, Florida Statutes, to authorize the department of banking and finance to withhold from sale abandoned property which is deemed to be of benefit to the people of this state; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Governmental Efficiency.

By Senator Knopke—

SB 861—A bill to be entitled An act relating to topographic mapping; amending §373.012(1), Florida Statutes, to eliminate the requirement that ten thousand dollars be set aside from the internal improvement trust fund to be used for topographic mapping in the state; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Natural Resources and Conservation.

By Senator Horne—

SB 862—A bill to be entitled An act relating to motor vehicle licenses; amending section 320.031(2), Florida Statutes, prescribing the cost of mailing license plates; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Transportation and Ways and Means.

By Senator Myers—

SB 863—A bill to be entitled An act relating to department of health and rehabilitative services, division of mental health, regarding emergency commitment of alcoholics; providing that section 396.092 become inoperative between the time that this act becomes effective and July 1, 1973; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Health, Welfare and Institutions.

By Senator Myers—

SB 864—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the claims against officers or employees of the state or its subdivisions, amending chapter 768, Florida Statutes, by adding section 768-151; authorizing the defense of tort claims against officers or employees of the state and its subdivisions; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Personnel, Retirement and Claims.

SB 865—Withdrawn prior to introduction.

By Committee on Health, Welfare and Institutions—

SB 866—A bill to be entitled An act relating to boarding homes for the elderly; amending chapter 509.303, Florida Statutes, to provide minimum standards for boarding homes for the elderly; providing legislative intent; providing definitions; providing for minimum standards, rules and regulations; requiring a certificate for boarding homes for the elderly as an addendum to the original license; providing for application for, issuance and renewal of such certificates; providing for the licensure of the manager of such homes; providing a cooperative procedure for aiding boarders incapable of independent living;

prohibiting persons refused a license to be connected with a certified home; providing existing homes reasonable time to comply with rules, regulations and standards; providing for revocation or suspension of licenses and certificates; providing for inspection of premises; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Health, Welfare and Institutions and Ways and Means.

By Senator Gong—

SB 867—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the department of state, amending paragraph (g) to 608.03(2), Florida Statutes, relating to the formation of corporations and the contents of the articles of incorporation providing that there shall be at least one director for every corporation; amending paragraph (f) to 608.05(4), Florida Statutes, relating to filing fees and taxes for corporations, providing for the reduction from seventy-five cents (\$.75) to fifteen cents (\$.15) upon each share of no par value stock in excess of twelve hundred fifty (1250) shares and not in excess of ten thousand (10,000) shares; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Judiciary—Civil A and Ways and Means.

By Senator Johnson (34th)—

SB 868—A bill to be entitled An act relating to sale of securities; amending sections 517.08(6) and 517.12(6) as amended by chapter 71-96, Laws of Florida, 1971 regular session and section 517.09(6), Florida Statutes, providing a fee; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Commerce and Ways and Means.

By Senator Lane—

SB 869—A bill to be entitled An Act relating to damages in medical malpractice actions; providing that any advance made by any person or his insurer to an injured person or to his heirs or dependents, shall not be construed as an admission of liability by the person claimed against; providing that any payment so made shall constitute a credit deductible from the final settlement; providing that the person making the advance shall notify recipient of the applicable statute of limitations; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary—Civil A.

By Senators Ott and Stolzenburg—

SB 870—A bill to be entitled An act relating to eggs; amending section 583.01 (4), (7), (9) and (12), 583.02, 583.07, and 583.10 (1) and (2), Florida Statutes; defining shell eggs, egg yolks and egg whites; requiring labeling and proper identification; providing methods of payment of inspection fees; repealing section 583.01 (18), Florida Statutes; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Agriculture.

By Senator Myers—

SB 871—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the beverage law and the limitation upon the number of licenses issued; adding subsections (2)(c), (2)(d) and (2)(e) to 561.20, Florida Statutes; providing the inclusion of apartment hotel in the definition of hotel and the inclusion of apartment motel in the definition of motel; providing that a hotel, motel or motor court obtaining or having a license exempt from the limitations of 561.20 (1) shall not lose that exemption solely because the form of ownership is condominium or cooperative; providing that in the case of condominium ownership of a hotel motel or motor court, the license shall upon request of the condominium association be issued to that association; providing that county and municipal zoning laws, rules, ordinances and regulations shall not be inconsistent with this act, in their enactment, enforcement or interpretation; amending subsection (2) (b) which makes prior law applicable to certain home rule counties, in-

stead of subsection (2)(a), to clarify that subsection (2)(b) excludes only subsection (2)(a) from applying to such home rule counties, and not the entire section as amended by this act; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Rules, Calendar, Privileged Business and Ethics.

By Senator Fincher—

SB 872—A bill to be entitled An act relating to safety equipment inspection of motor vehicles; amending section 325.19(1), Florida Statutes, as amended by chapter 70-351, Laws of Florida; providing that mufflers be inspected; amending section 325.24(1), Florida Statutes, providing that the delinquent fee be increased from one dollar (\$1.00) to five dollars (\$5.00); providing that the department shall set standards and regulations; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Transportation and Ways and Means.

By Senators Saylor and Knopke—

SM 873—A memorial to the Congress of the United States urging the designation of approximately sixteen thousand, nine hundred acres of the Chassahowitzka National Wildlife Refuge as "wilderness" under the Wilderness Act of 1964.

—was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Governmental Efficiency.

By Senator Fincher—

SB 874—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the regulation of traffic; amending section 316.002, Florida Statutes, to add a new subsection expressing the legislative intent that the department of transportation shall have original jurisdiction for the placement and maintainance of traffic control devices and limiting county and municipal jurisdiction in this respect to the streets and highways within their respective boundaries; amending subsection 316.006(2) and (3), Florida Statutes, by changing original jurisdiction to read jurisdiction of the placement and maintainance of traffic control devices by counties and chartered municipalities; amending section 316.016, Florida Statutes, to authorize and direct the division of Florida highway patrol to enforce all traffic laws of this state on all streets and highways throughout the state and providing that the act shall not limit or obstruct county sheriff's offices or municipal police departments in similar enforcement within their respective boundaries; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Transportation.

**Explanations of Vote**

SB 289 was before us today for the second time this session. I voted against it previously and submitted a statement in the Journal as to my reasons. I am still of the opinion that we should not be legislating as to what sex acts two consenting non-married persons can or cannot engage in, but after further reflection, and after we did not muster the necessary two-thirds vote of the Senate to amend that portion out of the bill, I decided to vote for the bill because of the necessity to reenact the other provisions of the bill (which provisions had previously been stricken from our statutory law by the courts because of the vagueness of the prior statutes.)

*Lee Weissenborn, 42nd District*

I have recorded my vote as “yes” on SB 289 because I think the state should speak clearly against deviant sexual acts which overtly affect society. Acts such as child molestation and deviant acts upon non-consenting persons are clearly crimes and should be dealt with as such. But I have serious objection to the latter part of the bill subsection (5) which declares as a crime private acts between two consenting adults of the opposite sex—a man and a woman—performed in the privacy of their own homes. We should not declare such private acts as crimes; because of the sweeping breadth of the language used in this bill, I question the constitutionality of subsection (5).

SB 553—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the killing of a law enforcement officer, peace officer, prison guard, fireman, justice or judge; providing for the death penalty in convictions of first degree murder; and the jury recommendation; prohibits the granting of parole or probation for convictions where the death penalty is not imposed; prohibits the granting of parole or probation for those convicted of lesser degrees of murder; providing an effective date.
