

# JOURNAL OF THE FLORIDA SENATE

Wednesday, April 25, 1973

The Senate was called to order by the President Pro Tempore for the purpose of conducting the order of business of introduction and reference of resolutions, memorials, bills and joint resolutions pursuant to Rule 4.3.

## INTRODUCTION

By Senator Weber—

**SB 940**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to alcoholic beverages; amending §561.42, Florida Statutes, revising the tied-house evil law to take away the division of beverage's authority to prohibit sales to liquor vendors under certain circumstances; allowing the extension of credit in the usual course of business; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Commerce.

By Senators Gruber and Poston—

**SB 941**—A bill to be entitled AN ACT relating to salt water game fish regulation; amending §370.1121, Florida Statutes, 1972 Supplement, providing for regulations relating to the taking of permit; providing penalties; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Natural Resources and Conservation.

By Senator Saylor (By request)—

**SB 942**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to alcoholic beverages; amending chapter 565, Florida Statutes, 1972 Supplement, to create a new section requiring liquor distributors to post price lists with the division of beverage; providing for discounts and savings of delivery allowances; prohibiting the retail sale of liquor at less than cost; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Commerce.

By Senators Scarborough, Brantley and Glisson—

**SB 943**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to water and sewer regulation; amending section 367.171(2)(b), Florida Statutes, 1971, to remove Duval County from the list of counties exempted from the provision of the chapter; repealing chapter 69-1166, Laws of Florida, relating to the authority of the consolidated City of Jacksonville to regulate private water and sewer systems having not less than twenty-five (25) connections; preserving certain jurisdiction for the regulation of private water and sewer systems having not less than twenty-five (25) connections to the City of Jacksonville and providing the terms and conditions of such jurisdiction and providing for the duration of said jurisdiction; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Governmental Operations.

By Senator Brantley—

**SB 944**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the regulation of aircraft and pilots; amending §330.46(3), F.S., by redefining "airport" as an area designed for landing aircraft; amending §330.48(1), F. S., by providing for regulation of crew flight hours; amending §330.49(1)(b), F. S., by providing that an applicant for a certificate specify the airports it intends to serve; amending §330.49(2), F. S., by providing a fee of \$100 for certificate extension applications; amending §330.49(4), F. S., by providing an annual certificate renewal fee of \$100; amending §330.49(5), F. S., by providing for notice of applications to all persons serving airports involved; amending §330.49(6)(i), F. S., by providing that the commission may consider public

convenience and necessity in issuing a certificate; substantial rewording of §330.49(7), F. S., to provide that the commission may issue certificates with or without modifications, and that when an application is denied, an identical or similar application may not be considered for six months; amending §330.49(8), F. S., by providing that all certificates list the airports to be served; creating §330.491, F. S., to provide that certificated air carriers maintain a tariff on file, to provide a filing fee of \$500 for rate applications and a filing fee of \$10 for tariff filings, to authorize the commission, after hearing, to prescribe reasonable rates to supersede rates found to be unreasonable, to authorize the commission to adopt rules governing the filing of tariffs, to provide that no rate increases may be instituted by a carrier or authorized by the commission without public hearing, to prohibit carriers from charging other than approved rates; creating §330.492, F. S., to provide for transfer of a certificate after application and approval; amending §330.52(1), F. S., by authorizing the commission to suspend a certificate where holder fails to conform to the law, commission rules and regulations, by requiring one bona fide flight per week between authorized airports to prevent certificate dormancy, by providing procedure for declaring certificate dormancy and for obtaining approval to suspend certificated operations; amending §330.52(3), F. S., by authorizing the commission to grant authority to temporarily suspend or delete a certificated route or airport; amending §330.52(4), F. S., by authorizing the commission to adopt rules applicable to carriers, provide for taking testimony and depositions, prescribe procedure, exercise all judicial powers, and issue writs to enforce commission orders or requirements, by authorizing the courts of this state to enjoin the illegal operation of air carriers at the instance of the commission; amending §330.52(5), F. S., by providing that the evidentiary rules of the circuit courts shall apply to commission hearings, except as otherwise provided by commission rule; amending §330.52(6), F. S., by authorizing parties aggrieved by actions of the commission to request reconsideration within fifteen days, deleting the requirement that the commission act on requests for reconsideration within thirty days, and providing for review of commission orders by the supreme court of Florida; and substantially rewording §330.53, F. S., to authorize the commission to disapprove, after hearing, any rate or schedule change of a carrier operating pursuant to certificate issued by the civil aeronautics board pursuant to §401 of the federal aviation act of 1958, if such a change would impose an undue burden on the traveling public, to authorize the commission to institute such disapproval action on its own motion, to authorize the commission, after hearing, to prescribe reasonable rates to supersede rates found to be unreasonable, to authorize the commission to impose a fine up to \$5,000.00 for illegal operations, providing that said fine constitutes a lien on real or personal property prior to all other liens except those for taxes due the state, and to provide for review of fines by the Florida supreme court, providing as effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

By Senators Childers, Lane (31st) and Henderson—

**SB 945**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Savings Association Act, amending Chapter 665, Florida Statutes, by adding Sections 665.701 through 665.717, Florida Statutes, authorizing the incorporation of savings and loan associations which have the power to issue capital stock; authorizing existing mutual associations to convert to capital stock associations; requiring a plan of conversion and providing guidelines for the department to follow in approving or disapproving the plan; providing for a hearing on the plan of conversion; requiring prior approval of department before acquiring control over a capital stock association; imposing restrictions on the acquisition of ownership or control of capital stock associations; providing for inconsistent provisions of this chapter; amending Section 665.021, Florida Statutes, by adding new definitions and amending existing definitions; amending Section 665.041, Florida Statutes, to refer to Section 665.701, Florida Statutes, which empowers a savings and loan association to issue capital stock; providing permissible characteristics of capital stock; providing for stockholders meetings; providing for directors and specifying their qualifications; providing for minimum capital

of new and converted capital stock associations; empowering capital stock associations to accept savings deposits; imposing limitations on dividends; reserving Sections 665.718 through 665.799 for future capital stock savings and loan association legislation; providing effective dates.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Commerce and Governmental Operations.

By Senators Childers, Lane (31st) and Henderson—

**SB 946**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to savings and loan associations; adding §665.215 granting authority to the department of banking and finance to authorize state chartered associations to exercise the same powers as federally chartered associations; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Commerce.

By Senator Gillespie—

**SB 947**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to local government; amending §163.02(2), Florida Statutes, 1971, which provides for representation on councils of local public officials, to provide that the representative of each member local government shall be the chief executive of the local government or his appointee; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Governmental Operations.

By Senator Gillespie—

**SB 948**—A bill to be entitled An act to provide for the relief of the dependent of James Hill who perished in the fire at the Division of Corrections Road Prison #32 in Jay, Florida, on July 16, 1967, providing for an appropriation and providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

By Senator Gruber—

**SB 949**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to lower Florida keys hospital district, Monroe County; providing for liens in favor of operators of hospitals in the district, upon causes of action, suits, claims, counterclaims, and demands accruing to patients therein, or their legal representatives, and upon judgments, settlements, and settlement agreements, on account of illness or injuries of such patients, for all reasonable charges for hospital care, treatment, and maintenance necessitated by such illness or injuries; providing for method of perfecting and enforcing such liens, and recovery of costs, attorney's fees, and expenses, and where suits thereon may be maintained; providing for no recovery of damages for hospital care, treatment, and maintenance, unless claimant therefor has paid costs thereof except in certain cases; providing for intervention by lienholder and verdict and judgment in favor of lienholder in certain cases; requiring claims for lien to be recorded and fees for recording; providing that no release or satisfaction shall be valid as against lien unless lienholder joins therein or executes release; providing that acceptance of release or satisfaction of any cause of action, suit, claim, counterclaim, demand, or judgment and any settlement in absence of release or satisfaction of lien shall prima facie constitute impairment of such lien, and giving lienholder right of action at law for damages on account of such impairment, and providing for recovery from one accepting release or satisfaction or making settlement; exempting from provisions of this act matters within purview of the workmen's compensation law of this state; authorizing and empowering the board of commissioners of the district to establish an employees' pension, annuity and retirement plan for officers and employees employed by the districts and qualifying therefor, and to pay the cost, or any portion thereof, from funds available to the districts from their authorized sources; providing for judicial review of decisions by the board of commissioners of the district to refuse, revoke, or suspend membership on the staff, or privileges attendant thereto; providing for jurisdiction thereof by the district court of appeal, or the supreme court of Florida, as provided by the Florida appellate rules; amending

§2, chapter 67-1724, Laws of Florida, as amended by §1, chapter 69-1322, Laws of Florida, to provide residency requirements for the board of commissioners of the district; providing an effective date.

Evidence of notice and publication was established by the Senate as to SB 949.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Rules and Calendar.

By Senator Johnston—

**SB 950**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to workmen's compensation; amending section 440.36, Florida Statutes, by creating a new subsection (4) to require insurance carriers writing workmen's compensation insurance to file notice of policies written or renewed within ten days; renumbering and amending subsequent subsections to provide a manner in which to comply with the filing requirement and to provide a penalty for failure to timely file notice; provides an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Commerce and Judiciary.

By Senator Johnston—

**SB 951**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to workmen's compensation; amending section 440.43, Florida Statutes, providing for the enjoining of an employer who has failed to secure workmen's compensation coverage from employing individuals or conducting business; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Commerce and Judiciary.

By Senator Graham—

**SB 952**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to public assistance; amending §409.195, Florida Statutes, to provide for the noninclusion of increased social security benefits in determination of the amount of financial assistance; providing for retroactive effect to July 1, 1972; directing the comptroller to issue warrants; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

By Senator Saunders—

**SB 953**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the capitol center; providing that the department of general services shall develop a capitol center parking plan and an advanced project analysis for underground parking; providing for report to legislature; providing an appropriation; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

By Senators Graham and Horne—

**SB 954**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the flood plain of the Kissimmee River, designating an area to be known as the Kissimmee River Flood Plain Area, Florida; creating section 373.140, Florida Statutes; indicating intent to restore, preserve, protect and conserve water and other natural resources of flood plain area; providing description of general area; providing procedures for definitive location of area; authorizing acquisition of area; providing for exercise of power or eminent domain within Kissimmee River Flood Plain Area; providing an appropriation for acquisition of area; providing severability; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

By Senator Pettigrew—

**SB 955**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to court reporters; creating sections 29.011, 29.012, 29.013, 29.014, 29.015,

29.016, 29.017, Florida Statutes; providing for number, duties, salary and administration of official court reports; providing for costs of transcripts and transcripts as prima facie evidence; providing for assessment of costs and payment of costs to state for court reporter's attendance; repealing sections 29.02, 29.03, 29.05, 29.06, 29.07, 29.09, and 29.10, Florida Statutes, section 29.01, Florida Statutes, 1972 Supplement, as amended by chapter 72-404, Laws of Florida, and section 29.04, Florida Statutes, 1972 Supplement, as amended by chapters 72-351 and 72-404, Laws of Florida, relating to official court reporters; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

By Senator Pettigrew—

SB 956—A bill to be entitled An act relating to municipal courts; creating section 43.40, Florida Statutes, requiring municipalities to advise chief judge of circuit as to existence and caseload of municipal court; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

By Senators de la Parte, Sayler, Winn and Brantley—

SB 957—A bill to be entitled An act to adjust the salary of the sheriff of each county to equal the compensation received in any calendar year by the clerk of the circuit court, tax assessor or tax collector of such county, and providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Governmental Operations.

By Senator Lane (31st)—

SB 958—A bill to be entitled An act relating to pari-mutuel dog racing and jai-alai; repealing §550.083(2), Florida Statutes, 1971, which makes an exception in favor of certain permittees with respect to the aggregate number of racing or exhibition days available to them and the choice of racing or exhibition dates; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Commerce.

By Senator Johnson—

SB 959—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the furnishing of textbooks; amending Sec. 233.13, Florida Statutes, 1971, to provide for the furnishing of textbooks to pupils in all schools of the state, nonpublic as well as public; amending Sec. 233.43(1), Florida Statutes, 1971, to provide for requisitions for additional books needed for pupils in public and nonpublic schools; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

By Senator Firestone—

SB 960—A bill to be entitled An act creating the Florida mobile home commission; providing for fifteen (15) members and the method of appointment thereof; providing for the duties and responsibilities of said commission; providing for public hearings; providing an appropriation; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

By Senator Scarborough—

SB 961—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the solicitation of charitable funds; amending §§496.02(1) and (5), 496.03(1)(f) and (2), 496.031(1) and (2), 496.04, 496.041(2) and (4), and 496.13(5) (as amended by chapter 71-136, Laws of Florida) and (6)(a), all Florida Statutes; adding subsection

(6) to §496.02, subsection (3) to §496.03, subsection (4) to §496.031, subsections (6), (7), (8), (9), (10) and (11) to §496.11, and subsection (7) to §496.13, all Florida Statutes; creating §496.021, Florida Statutes; amending the definitions of "charitable organization" and "professional solicitor"; defining "gross contributions"; granting the department of state regulatory powers over licensing, authority to promulgate regulations, and standing to maintain legal actions; specifying registration fee; requiring identification for those soliciting; adding requirement for licensee not to have been convicted for violation of this chapter; providing for employee's certificate and fee therefor; increasing professional solicitor's license fee from fifty dollars (\$50) to five hundred dollars (\$500); clarifying those exempted from registration fee; clarifying those claiming exemption from registration and requiring a ten dollar (\$10) fee for original registration of exemption; requiring independent members of federated organizations to pay a filing fee when they receive funds from sources other than the federated organization or a government agency; providing for the filing of certain information by charitable organizations; prohibiting telephone solicitation by professional solicitors; limiting professional solicitors' fees to twenty-five percent (25%) of the gross contributions solicited by them, which include all fund raising costs; limiting to not more than twenty-five percent (25%) of its gross the amount a charity may expend for fund raising; restricting use of words "charity," "charitable," and "police"; redefining criminal penalties; granting the department of state the right to seek arrest warrants; providing for conflict; providing for severability; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

By Senator Pettigrew—

SB 962—A bill to be entitled An act relating to local government; amending chapter 125, Florida Statutes, by adding a new part III; providing for a county administrator in all non-charter counties with a population in excess of 100,000 according to the latest official census of the state; providing definitions and legislative purpose; providing for appointment, vacancy, qualification and compensation of a county administrator; providing powers and duties; providing for board directives and limiting directives from individual board members; superceding laws in conflict; providing severability; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Governmental Operations.

By Senator Henderson—

SB 963—A bill to be entitled An act relating to funeral directors and funeral establishments; requiring itemization of billing; requiring submission of itemized billing to buyers at time of initial contact; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Consumer Affairs.

By Senators Childers, Lane (31st) and Henderson—

SB 964—A bill to be entitled An act relating to Savings and Loan Associations; amending section 665.361(1), Florida Statutes, to make bankers acceptances which are eligible for purchase by federal reserve banks permissible investments for associations; amending section 665.361(2), Florida Statutes, to make clear that certain corporate obligations are permissible investments; amending section 665.191, Florida Statutes, to repeal the requirement that an association close its books on June 30 of each year; amending section 665.441, Florida Statutes, to correct a statutory reference therein; amending section 665.101, Florida Statutes, authorizing reasonable charges for early withdrawals of classified savings accounts; amending section 665.231(5), Florida Statutes, increasing the dollar amount of inducements that can be given by associations to fifteen dollars (\$15.00) if approved by the department; adding new section 665.442, Florida Statutes, empowering an association to establish and operate facilities so authorized by the department other than a home office or branch office; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Commerce.

By Senator Pettigrew—

**SB 965**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to local government; amending chapter 163, by adding a new part VII; providing for the creation of multi-county planning commissions; providing definitions and legislative purpose; providing for membership, appointment, vacancy and compensation; providing powers and duties; providing for development of comprehensive plans and implementation and amendment thereof; providing for review of local governmental plans and programs; providing for use of the commission in federal and state programs; providing for staffing and methods to avoid duplication with other agencies; providing review and comment on requests for state and federal financial assistance; providing for cooperation with other agencies; providing for reports, fiscal year, budget and audits; providing for authorization to assume certain service powers; providing limitations, procedures and adoption by all affected units of local governments; providing review of budgets and long-term financial plans of certain special districts; providing a mechanism to fund such agencies pursuant to state appropriation; providing severability; repealing chapter 160, Florida Statutes, and providing for transfer of regional planning councils so established by a type three transfer to the multi-county planning commission; providing procedures; providing effective dates.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Governmental Operations and Ways and Means.

By Senator Johnson—

**SB 966**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to marriage; declaring all marriages performed subsequent to the dissolution or divorce of a previous marriage by a court in another country, valid from the date of performance of the marriage, if both parties to the previous marriage were either present or represented by separate counsel at those proceedings; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

By Senator Johnson—

**SB 967**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to veterans and their dependents; adding subsection (4) to ss240.052, Florida Statutes, as amended by chapter 70-51, Laws of Florida, to provide that such persons attending institutions in the state university system under the federal educational assistance acts shall have an extra sixty (60) days for payment of registration fees; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Commerce.

By Senator Firestone—

**SB 968**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to handguns; creating section 790.13, Florida Statutes; requiring a seventy-two hour delay before delivery of a handgun; providing penalties; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

By Senator Brantley—

**SJR 969**—A joint resolution proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the state of Florida; amending section 10 of Article 7; relating to joint ownership, construction and operation of electrical energy generating or transmission facilities.

—was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Governmental Operations.

By Senators McClain and Lane (23rd)—

**SB 970**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to transportation; dedicating the causeway and bridge connecting Hillsborough and Pinellas counties, designated as state road 60 as

"Davis Causeway;" Authorizing the department of transportation to erect the appropriate markers; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Transportation and Commerce.

By Senator Lane (23rd)—

**SB 971**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to legal holidays; creating §683.12, Florida Statutes, making parade day of the county fair a legal holiday in Hillsborough County; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Agriculture.

By Senators Sims, Johnston, Winn, Gruber, Vogt, Lane (31st), Myers, Glisson, Lane (23rd), Ware, Plante, Deeb, Sayler, Sykes, Gillespie, Henderson, Lewis, Stolzenburg, Horne, Smathers, Pettigrew, de la Parte, Zinkil, Firestone, Johnson, Wilson, Peterson, Brantley, McClain, Saunders, Childers, Scarborough, Barron, Trask, Weber, Poston and Graham—

**SR 972**—A resolution expressing the sentiments of the people of Florida that North Vietnam give a full and satisfactory accounting of the 1400 men still classified as missing prior to the United States granting any assistance to rebuild North Vietnam.

—was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

By the Committee on Education—

**SB 973**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to education; providing for state assistance to school districts for school plant and debt service needs; defining terms; authorizing the state board to require relocatable school facilities or to approve annual costs of rental or leased facilities; exempting school facility construction from county, district, municipal or local building codes and ordinances; requiring quarterly reports and authorizing disbursement of state funds; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

By the Committee on Education—

**SB 974**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to early childhood education for exceptional children; expressing the intent of the legislature; amending §232.01(1), Florida Statutes; authorizing training of personnel; authorizing employment of staff; providing an appropriation; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

By the Committee on Education—

**SB 975**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to schools; creating section 232.46, Florida Statutes, protecting privileged communications between students and school guidance counselors, specialists in school psychology, and visiting teachers concerning drug problems, including alcohol problems, of students; providing immunity from disclosure in administrative, judicial, or legislative proceedings; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Education.

By Senator McClain—

**SB 976**—A bill to be entitled An Act relating to chemical tests for intoxication; amending Section 322.261(1)(b), Florida Statutes, to provide that blood shall be withdrawn; adding Section 322.261(2)(f) providing penalty for failure to withdraw

blood specimen; adding Section 322.261(2)(g) providing for peace officer to witness withdrawal of blood and to testify to such in court; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

By Senator McClain—

SB 977—A bill to be entitled An act relating to Florida Human Relations, amending §13.201, F. S., prohibiting discrimination against physically handicapped; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

By Senators Vogt and Smathers—

SB 978—A bill to be entitled An act relating to education; providing for state assumption of underfunding of the federal impact program; providing an appropriation; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

By Senator Horne—

SB 979—A bill to be entitled An act relating to higher education; authorizing and directing the board of regents to open a continuing education center in Leon County to be operated by Florida state university; providing an appropriation; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

By Senator Poston—

SCR 980—A concurrent resolution urging Congress to pass an Act calling for uniform reflectorized markings on all road cars operating in the United States of America.

—was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Transportation.

By Senator Pettigrew—

SB 981—A bill to be entitled An act relating to local government; amending title XI, Florida Statutes, by adding a new chapter 126, Florida Statutes; providing general provisions to be followed in adopting a county charter; providing optional forms for county government under a county charter; providing executive and legislative responsibilities under a charter; providing for certain taxing powers and recognition in state revenue sharing laws; providing for adoption and amendment of an administrative code; providing for civil service rights and obligations; providing a limitation on charter adoption and prohibition of special laws in conflict therewith; providing severability; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

By Senators Brantley and Scarborough—

SB 982—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Jacksonville Port Authority; governmental subdivisions, other entities and permittees; granting perpetual easement to parcel of land in Township 2 South, Range 26 East, City of Jacksonville, Duval County, Florida; for public works and uses; dedication of easement; amending section 253.12, Florida Statutes by adding subsections (9), (10) and (11); providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Natural Resources and Conservation.

By Senators Graham and Pettigrew—
