

JOURNAL OF THE FLORIDA SENATE

Thursday, April 26, 1973

The Senate was called to order by the President Pro Tempore for the purpose of conducting the order of business of introduction and reference of resolutions, memorials, bills and joint resolutions pursuant to Rule 4.3.

INTRODUCTION

By Senator Henderson—

SB 1046—A bill to be entitled An act relating to saltwater fishing; requiring the licensing of persons, firms or corporations engaged in the business of commercial fishing for saltwater fish in this state; providing penalties for persons, firms or corporations engaging in commercial fishing activities which violate the provisions of the act and further providing penalties for others dealing with such violators; providing for the cost of licenses issued pursuant to this act; providing records to be kept showing purchases of saltwater fish; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Natural Resources and Conservation and Ways and Means.

By Senator Henderson—

SB 1047—A bill to be entitled An act relating to disability insurance policies; amending section 627.641 (1), Florida Statutes, 1972 supplement, as created by section 1, chapter 72-82, Laws of Florida; providing additional coverage for newborn children; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Commerce.

By Senator Pettigrew—

SB 1048—A bill to be entitled An act relating to domestic relations payments; creating section 61.181, Florida Statutes, to provide for the establishment of a depository to receive and disburse such payments and for fees for receiving and disbursing domestic relations payments; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

By Senator Brantley—

SB 1049—A bill to be entitled An act relating to review of division of beverage administrative orders by the board of business regulation and the appropriate district court of appeal; amending paragraph (c) of subsection (7) of section 561.29, Florida Statutes, to provide that upon application to the board of business regulation for relief of an order of the division of beverage revoking or suspending an alcoholic beverage license, supersedeas shall be granted, as of right, for a period not to exceed sixty (60) days from the rendition of the division's order; providing for the procedure for obtaining supersedeas after said sixty (60) days from the board of business regulation and the appropriate district court of appeal; providing an effective date.

By Senator Lane (31st)—

SB 1050—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the department of professional and occupational regulation; providing a type one transfer of said department to the department of state, repealing §20.30, Florida Statutes, creating the department of professional and occupational regulation; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Governmental Operations.

By Senators Henderson and Horne—

SB 1051—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the old union bank building; directing the division of archives, history and records management of the department of state to promote the remodeling and renovating of said building; providing an appropriation therefor; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

By Senator Winn—

SB 1052—A bill to be entitled An act relating to education; amending §236.04(4)(a), Florida Statutes, 1972 Supplement, relating to determination of number of instructional units under the minimum foundation program, to provide for the establishment of criteria for categories of exceptional children; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Education.

SB 1053—A bill to be entitled An act relating to education; amending §§231.40(1)(b) and 231.43, Florida Statutes; authorizing district school boards to permit two days of sick leave annually to be used for personal reasons; providing an effective date.

SB 1054—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the division of library services; amending §§257.17, 257.18, 257.19 and 257.24, Florida Statutes; creating §§257.191 and 257.192, Florida Statutes; providing that operating grants be predicated upon local library expenditures, or upon local appropriations in the case of new libraries; providing a new formula for equalization grants; increasing from twenty thousand to fifty thousand dollars the maximum amount of establishment grants and excepting such grants from proration requirement in §257.21; providing that state funds can be used for library construction if specifically appropriated therefore; authorizing the division to accept and administer state appropriations for library construction and requiring the promulgation of regulations by the division for administering such grants and excepting §257.191 from the application of §257.21; authorizing the division to accept and administer state appropriations for program grants in accordance with the Florida long-range program for library services; providing for conflict; providing for severability; providing an effective date.

SB 1055—A bill to be entitled An act relating to hotels and restaurants; creating §509.013, Florida Statutes; providing definitions; amending §§509.032(1), (2), 509.071, 509.091, 509.101, 509.111, 509.131, 509.151, 509.161, 509.162, 509.171, 509.181, 509.191, 509.201, 509.211(6)(b),(c),(8), (11)(c), (d), 509.221(1), (2), (4)-(6), (8), (9), 509.241(1), (5), 509.261(1)(a), (b), (2), (3)(b), (c), (4)(a), (5), 509.281 and 509.292(1), (2), Florida Statutes; amending §§509.141 and 509.142, Florida Statutes, 1972 Supplement; replacing obsolete language with new definitions; revising and deleting obsolete or vague provisions; changing standards for exits from certain establishments;

changing the square footage requirement; changing the definition of public lodging establishments; correcting the definition of fresh juice; providing an effective date.

SB 1056—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the inspection of retail food stores, food processing plants and food warehouses; eliminating duplicative inspections by amending section 381.031(1)(g)3., Florida Statutes, removing authority to regulate production, handling, processing and sale of food products; amending section 381.071, Florida Statutes, by providing that chapter 500 and rules and regulations adopted thereunder shall not be superseded by chapter 381, Florida Statutes; amending section 500.20(1), Florida Statutes; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Agriculture.

By Senator Winn—

SB 1057—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the division of hotels and restaurants, amending section 509.301, Florida Statutes, amending subsections (3), (4), and (5), section 509.302, Florida Statutes, affecting the role of the director of education employed by the advisory council for industry education; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Consumer Affairs.

By Senator Winn—

SB 1058—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the capitol information center; amending section 272.11, Florida Statutes, transferring the operation of the capitol information center from the department of general services to the department of commerce; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Governmental Operations.

By Senator Scarborough—

SB 1059—A bill to be entitled An act relating to workmen's compensation; amending §440.13(1) and (2), Florida Statutes, 1971; providing that an injured employee shall have the right to select a physician reasonably necessary for medical treatment furnished by the employer; providing that the employer may exercise one (1) peremptory objection to the physician selected; providing that the division of labor and employment opportunities may order a change in remedial care for cause; providing an effective date.

SB 1060—A bill to be entitled An act to be called the Public Employees Relations Act relating to state, county, municipal, and all other public employees in the State; amending chapter 447, Florida Statutes, by adding Part II; providing right to organize and bargain collectively as to terms and conditions of employment; providing method of bargaining procedure; creating and providing administration by the Florida public employees relations commission within the department of administration; defining rights of public employees and employers; providing payroll dues deduction; providing rules and procedures for registration, recognition, and certification of employee organizations and bargaining agents; providing payment of fees and expenses in collective bargaining process; providing grievance procedures; providing procedures for resolution of impasse; establishing unfair labor practices by employers and employee organizations; providing procedures to resolve unlawful actions and practices, penalties and remedies; providing injunctive relief; providing effect on merit and civil service systems and state and local control of same; providing for a local option; providing for severability; amending section

230.22(1), Florida Statutes, relating to general powers of school boards; providing for repeal of chapter 72-275, Laws of Florida; providing repeal of section 839.221, Florida Statutes; providing an effective date.

SB 1062—A bill to be entitled An act relating to industrial development authorities; amending §§159.26, 159.27(5), Florida Statutes, and adding subsection (7) to said section; amending §159.29, Florida Statutes; amending §3(2), (5) of chapter 70-229, Laws of Florida, appearing as §159.44(2) and (5), Florida Statutes, 1970 Supplement; providing legislative intent; providing revised and additional definitions; providing additional criteria and requirements; providing an effective date.

SB 1063—A bill to be entitled An act relating to deposits of public money outside of the state treasury; revolving funds; adding a new subsection to section 18.101, Florida Statutes; providing for the quarterly reporting of clearing account and revolving fund balances to the state treasurer; providing an effective date.

SB 1064—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the conduct of elections and the duties of the clerks of the circuit courts; transferring those duties of the clerks of the circuit courts related to conducting elections to the supervisors of elections by amending §99.092, Florida Statutes, relating to the list of candidates submitted to the department of state; amending §99.151, Florida Statutes, relating to the custodian of the certificates of nomination; amending §99.061, Florida Statutes, relating to the place for payment of filing fees, remittance of same to the secretary of state and notification to the candidate of errors; amending §99.161, Florida Statutes, relating to the filing of campaign reports; repealing §99.111, Florida Statutes, relating to the clerk of the circuit court's notification to the supervisor of elections; amending §103.111, Florida Statutes, relating to the duties of the state and county executive committees; providing severability; providing an effective date.

SB 1065—A bill to be entitled An act relating to state employees, creating section 112.044, Florida Statutes, requiring as a condition of employment that persons appointed to certain classes of positions and types of employment shall be fingerprinted; providing that any such person who refuses to be fingerprinted as required by this section shall be ineligible for employment; requiring that the department of administration and the department of law enforcement shall establish and implement procedures for the fingerprinting of such employees; providing that the administrative expenses of such services to the various state agencies shall be charged to the agencies on

a pro rata basis by the department of law enforcement in accordance with a formula for reimbursement as approved by the department of administration; providing an effective date.

SB 1066—A bill to be entitled An act relating to insurance; amending section 627.732(1), Florida Statutes, 1971; providing definitions of "motor vehicle," "private passenger motor vehicle," "commercial motor vehicle," and "other mobile equipment;" repealing section 627.734(3), Florida Statutes, 1971; amending section 627.735(1); providing for suspension of operator's license and registration and providing a misdemeanor of the second degree; adding section 627.742, Florida Statutes, 1971; providing certain benefits for occupants of a "commercial motor vehicle" injured in an accident in Florida or others struck by said "commercial motor vehicle" in Florida; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Commerce.

By the Committee on Health and Rehabilitative Services—

SB 1067—A bill to be entitled AN ACT relating to housing; creating a division of housing in the department of community affairs; providing for the powers, duties, and responsibilities of the division of housing; transferring the responsibilities of the department of highway safety and motor vehicles for the regulation of the construction of mobile homes to the department of community affairs and assigning same to the division of housing; providing a severance clause; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Health and Rehabilitative Services.

By Senator Deeb—

SB 1068—A bill to be entitled An act relating to identification cards for older Americans; providing for the department of highway safety and motor vehicles to issue driver's license type identification cards; creating section 322.181, Florida Statutes; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Transportation.

By Senator Deeb—

SB 1069—A bill to be entitled An act relating to insurance; amending §284.01, .02, .04 and .08, Florida Statutes, extending the provisions of the Florida fire insurance trust fund to local governments, should they elect to participate; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Governmental Operations.

By Senator Pettigrew—

SB 1070—A bill to be entitled An act relating to witnesses; amending §914.04, Florida Statutes, providing immunity to witnesses in certain prosecutions in order to compel testimony; providing a mechanism to assure statewide clearance of instances where testimony is sought to be compelled; providing conditions when an order to compel testimony may be requested; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Criminal Justice.

By Senator Pettigrew—

SB 1071—A bill to be entitled An act relating to bribery and corrupt practices; amending Chapter 838, Florida Statutes; providing for the control of bribery and corrupt practices; providing for definitions; making it unlawful to commit bribery

in official and political matters; making it unlawful to make threats and retaliation in official and political matters; providing for unlawful rewarding for past behavior; providing for restrictions on gifts or gratuities to public servants; providing for tampering with public records or information; providing for bribery in athletic contests; providing severability; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Criminal Justice.

By Senator Pettigrew—

SB 1072—A bill to be entitled An act relating to municipal elections; amending §98.041, Florida Statutes, to provide a single permanent registration system for all elections held within a county, including municipal elections; amending §98.091, Florida Statutes, to provide procedures for municipal uses of county election books; providing that certain registered electors are qualified to vote in municipal elections; amending §98.031(1), Florida Statutes, as amended, to require precinct boundaries to conform to municipal boundaries; repealing §98.101(2), Florida Statutes, relating to election costs; providing an effective date.

By Senator Deeb—

SB 1073—A bill to be entitled An act relating to statutes of limitation; amending Section 95.11(10), Florida Statutes; providing for the inclusion of contractors, subcontractors, materialmen and other persons engaged in the construction of improvements to real property in Section 95.11(10), Florida Statutes; providing a limitations period of twelve years after substantial completion for the bringing of causes of action concerning the construction of improvements to real property; providing an effective date.

SB 1076—A bill to be entitled An act relating to apprenticeship; amending §446.011, Florida Statutes, declaring legislative intent; amending §446.021, Florida Statutes, providing definitions; amending §446.031, Florida Florida Statutes, specifying membership and duties of apprenticeship council and duties of the division of labor and employment opportunities; amending §446.041, Florida Statutes, defining duties of bureau of apprentice and department of commerce; amending §446.052, Florida Statutes, establishing a preapprenticeship educational program in the public school system; amending §446.071, Florida Statutes, providing duties and standards for apprenticeship sponsors; amending §446.101, Florida Statutes, by adding subsections (5) and (6) to provide for the assessment

of a civil penalty by the division of labor and employment opportunities against any state agency, county, municipality, contractor or supplier that violates the provisions of §446.101, Florida Statutes; providing an effective date.

SB 1086—A bill to be entitled An act relating to education; providing for a school safety fund; providing a formula for distribution; providing duties for school districts; providing responsibilities for the commissioner of education; providing an appropriation; providing an effective date.

SB 1087—A bill to be entitled An act providing for the chief internal auditor of the department of health and rehabilitative services; establishing the responsibilities of said auditor; establishing the qualifications of said auditor; amending chapter 402, Florida Statutes; providing an effective date.

By Senator Lane (31st)—

SB 1088—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the department of health and rehabilitative services; amending section 473.08 (2) (c), Florida Statutes, relating to qualifications and standards of applicants for CPA examinations; to include internal auditors of the department of health and rehabilitative services; providing an effective date.

SB 1089—A bill to be entitled An act relating to consumer protection; requiring that consumer reporting agencies send duplicate copies of consumer credit reports to persons who are subjects of the report; prohibiting distribution of consumer credit reports which have not been updated more recently than three (3) months prior to the time of release; providing for civil and equitable relief for aggrieved consumers; providing penalties for violation; providing an effective date.

SB 1090—A bill to be entitled An act relating to tax on sales, use and other transactions; amending section 212.08 (7), Florida Statutes, by adding paragraph (i) to exempt the building, maintenance, and repair of vessels of over 200 gross registered

tons which are engaged in foreign and interstate commerce from tax imposed by chapter 212, Florida Statutes, providing an effective date.

SB 1091—A bill to be entitled AN ACT relating to traffic laws; creating § 13.998, 13.9981, 13.9982, 13.9983, 13.9984, 13.9985, 13.9986, and 13.9987, Florida Statutes; creating a traffic court and safety commission composed of seven (7) members appointed by the supreme court; providing qualifications for members; providing terms of office; providing for organization and compensation; providing functions; providing for funding; providing an effective date.

SB 1092—A bill to be entitled An act relating to transportation; requiring traffic to yield right of way to construction workers and vehicles; providing an effective date.

SB 1093—A bill to be entitled An act relating to traffic violations; establishing requirements for alcohol counter-attack instruction and schools; providing for collection of fees, disbursements and deposit of revenues; providing an effective date.

SB 1094—A bill to be entitled An act relating to zoning ordinances; amending §163.205(1)(b), Florida Statutes; authorizing counties and municipalities through zoning ordinances to set aside land for certain public purposes; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Governmental Operations.

By the Committee on Health and Rehabilitative Services—

SB 1095—A bill to be entitled AN ACT relating to housing; providing for findings and declaration of necessity by the legislature; providing definitions; establishing the revolving housing land acquisition assistance trust fund; authorizing the secretary of community affairs to make loans to local governments and local housing authorities for the acquisition of land for housing for persons and families of low or moderate income; providing for the disposition of property acquired by a loan under the act; providing for terms of loan agreements; providing powers of the secretary in the event of default; providing recourse in the event that housing is not developed on land acquired by a loan; providing for the disposition of property accruing to the state; providing for tax exemption of land under certain conditions; providing for severability of invalid portions; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Health and Rehabilitative Services and Ways and Means.

SB 1096—A bill to be entitled AN ACT relating to relocation assistance; providing uniform, fair, treatment of persons, businesses, and non-profit organizations displaced by state and local programs; providing definitions; providing for the authority of the secretary of community affairs; providing au-

thorization of state participation in cost of local relocation payments and services; providing for appeals; providing severability; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Health and Rehabilitative Services and Ways and Means.

By Senator Gallen—

SB 1097—A bill to be entitled An act relating to game and nongame animals; amending §372.99, Florida Statutes, as amended by chapter 71-136, Laws of Florida, to provide that certain display or use of a light at night, together with the possession of certain firearms or other weapons by a freeholder or leaseholder or his invitees or licensees in a place that is their property and where any animal protected by subsection (1) may be found, and for the purpose of patrolling said property, shall not be prima facie evidence of a violation of the provisions of subsection (1); providing an effective date.

By Senator Gallen—

SB 1098—A bill to be entitled An act relating to saltwater fisheries; amending §370.08(1) and (3), Florida Statutes, 1971, to extend the prohibition against custody or possession of fishing seines or nets to waters within three (3) marine leagues of any county bordering on the Gulf of Mexico and to require that the use of shrimp, pound, or purse nets or seines in taking certain fish complies with §370.08(3), Florida Statutes, 1971, as amended by this act; prohibiting the taking of any fish in the waters within or without three (3) marine leagues of any county bordering on the Gulf of Mexico with certain seines and nets and the possession for sale or shipment of any fish so taken within said waters; providing criminal penalties and forfeitures for certain violations of the provisions of the section; providing a definition; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Natural Resources and Conservation.

By Senators Lane (23rd) and de la Parte—

SB 1099—A bill to be entitled An act relating to summer thoroughbred horse racing; extending the authority therefor to a ratified permit holder in certain counties; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Commerce.

By Senator Lane (23rd)—

(a) At a state-wide general election in each calendar year the number of which is even but not a multiple of four, the electors shall choose a governor and a lieutenant governor and members of the cabinet each for a term of four years beginning on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in January of the succeeding year. ~~In the general election and in party primaries, if held, all candidates for the offices of governor and lieutenant governor shall form joint candidacies in a manner prescribed by law so that each voter shall cast a single vote for a candidate for governor and a candidate for lieutenant governor running together.~~

(b) When elected, the governor, lieutenant governor and each cabinet member must be an elector not less than thirty years of age who has resided in the state for the preceding seven years. The attorney general must have been a member of the bar of Florida for the preceding five years. No person who has, or but for resignation would have, served as governor or acting governor for more than six years in two consecutive terms shall be elected governor for the succeeding term.

SECTION 6. Executive departments.—All functions of the executive branch of state government shall be allotted among not more than twenty-five departments, exclusive of those specifically provided for or authorized in this constitution. The administration of each department, unless otherwise provided in this constitution, shall be placed by law under the direct supervision of the governor, ~~the lieutenant governor, the governor and cabinet, a cabinet member, or an officer or board appointed by and serving at the pleasure of the governor, except:~~

(a) When provided by law, confirmation by the senate or the approval of three members of the cabinet shall be required for appointment to or removal from any designated statutory office.

Be It Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

That the repeal of section 2, article IV, the following amendment to section 17, article III, and the amendments to sections 3, 5 and 6, article IV, of the state constitution, are hereby agreed to and shall be submitted to the electors of this state for approval or rejection at the general election to be held in November 1974, or, if authorized by three-fourths of the membership of each house of the legislature, at a special election to be held October 2, 1973:

ARTICLE III

LEGISLATURE

SECTION 17. Impeachment.—

(a) The governor, ~~lieutenant governor,~~ members of the cabinet, justices of the supreme court, judges of district courts of appeal and judges of circuit courts shall be liable to impeachment for misdemeanor in office. The house of representatives by two-thirds vote shall have the power to impeach an officer. The speaker of the House of representative shall have power at any time to appoint a committee to investigate charges against any officer subject to impeachment.

(b) An officer impeached by the house of representatives shall be disqualified from performing any official duties until acquitted by the senate, and unless the governor is impeached he may by appointment fill the office until completion of the trial.

(c) All impeachments by the house of representatives shall be tried by the senate. The chief justice of the supreme court, or another justice designated by him, shall preside at the trial, except in a trial of the chief justice, in which case the governor shall preside. The senate shall determine the time for the trial of any impeachment and may sit for the trial whether the house of representatives be in session or not. The time fixed for trial shall not be more than six months after the impeachment. During an impeachment trial senators shall be upon their oath or affirmation. No officer shall be convicted without the concurrence of two-thirds of the members of the senate present. Judgment of conviction in cases of impeachment shall remove the offender from office and, in the discretion of the senate, may include disqualification to hold any office of honor, trust or profit. Conviction or acquittal shall not affect the civil or criminal responsibility of the officer.

SCR 857—A concurrent resolution commending and honoring Congressman Robert L. F. Sikes for his outstanding service to the people of Florida.

WHEREAS, Florida has achieved international recognition through the energies of Robert L. F. (Bob) Sikes as a Member of Congress, and

WHEREAS, Congressman Sikes entered upon his career of public service as a Member of the Florida House of Representatives with election in 1936 from Okaloosa County, and

WHEREAS, Congressman Sikes not only is Dean of the present Florida Congressional Delegation but has served Florida longer in the Congress of the United States, House and Senate, than any other person in the State's history, and

WHEREAS, Mr. Sikes equaled in 1963 the record of the Congressman Stephen M. Sparkman of Tampa, who retired in 1917 after eleven terms and twenty years of service, and

WHEREAS, Mr. Sikes on July 5, 1968, equaled the record of United States Senator Duncan U. Fletcher of Jacksonville, twenty-seven years and one hundred and six days, and

WHEREAS, it is not for longevity alone that Congressman Sikes has achieved distinction but for the distinguished use

of those years as a Florida Congressman. As a colleague said on the occasion of "Bob Sikes Day" in Congress on July 8, 1968, "there is only one proof of ability—results," adding that Bob Sikes had combined ability with action to get results, and

WHEREAS, Congressman Sikes has acquitted himself with honor, patriotism, dedication, and love of country and of countrymen as a public servant through the years, and

WHEREAS, though he has walked with Presidents and potentates, Bob Sikes never has lost the common touch, giving courteous attention to all who wish his ear and aid, and

WHEREAS, his political prowess is attested by the fact of his successive reelection, always by overwhelming majorities when opposed, since the campaign in 1940 when he told the people of Florida's panhandle that even the Bobwhite Quail were on his bandwagon, having switched to chirping, "Bob Sikes, Bob Sikes" instead of "Bob White, Bob White," NOW, THEREFORE,

BIOGRAPHICAL

Robert L. F. Sikes, Democrat, of Crestview, Okaloosa County, Florida, U. S. Representative from the First District, was born in Isabella, Georgia, on June 3, 1906. He received his Bachelor of Science Degree from the University of Georgia in 1927, and his Master's Degree from the University of Florida in 1929. On March 15, 1969, he was awarded an Honorary Degree of Doctor of Laws from Stetson University; on April 26, 1969, an Honorary Degree of Doctor of Humane Letters from St. Leo College; and on June 14, 1970, an Honorary Degree of Doctor of Laws from the University of West Florida. On August 17, 1970, he received an Honorary Doctorate from the University of Inca Garcilaso de la Vega in Peru. He is a Major General AUS (Ret.) and was awarded the Legion of Merit.

He is married (Mrs. Sikes is the former Miss Inez Tyner, Laurel Hill, Florida); has two children (Mrs. Bobbye S. Wicke, Newville, Pennsylvania; and Robert K. Sikes, Martin Marietta Corporation, Orlando, Florida).

He was twice elected to the Florida Legislature, representing Okaloosa County in the 1937 and 1939 Sessions. He was elected to Congress in 1940 and has been reelected in sixteen successive elections, and is currently serving his seventeenth term. He has also served as Chairman of the Okaloosa County Democratic Committee; Chairman, Okaloosa Planning Committee; Member of Democratic Congressional Committee; Chairman of the Florida Delegation to the Democratic National Convention, 1956 and 1960.

He is an honorary member of Rotary, Lions, and Civitan Clubs, Retired Officers Association, National Association of Supervisors, American Federation of Government Employees, United Federation of Postal Clerks, National Association of Master Mechanics and Foremen, American Society of Arms Collectors, Order of Ahepa, and Toastmasters International; honorary life member of Fleet Reserve Association and the Navy League; life member National Rifle Association, and Director 1965-1967; member Florida Historical Society, Kiwanis, Moose, Elks, V.F.W., American Legion, 40 and 8, Military Order of The World Wars, Reserve Officers Association, and Sons of Confederate Veterans. He was President of the Florida Press Association in 1937, and Lieutenant Governor of Kiwanis in 1940.

Congressman Sikes is a 33° Scottish Rite Mason, and an Honorary Member and Inspector General of Scottish Rite for the Southern Jurisdiction of the United States. He is a member of the Red Cross of Constantine of York Rite of Freemasonry, York Rite College; Royal Order of Scotland, KCCH; Knights Templar; Shrine, Grotto; National Sojourners; Knights of Pythias. He is a charter member and Ambassador at Large of Hadji Shrine Temple of Pensacola, Florida; and was Grand Orator of the Masonic Grand Lodge of Florida for 1968-1969.

He is a member of Phi Kappa Phi, Alpha Zeta, Sigma Delta Chi, Phi Sigma, Alpha Gamma Rho, Blue Key, and AGHON.

He is a member, Board of Trustees of the Naval Aviation Museum Association; member, Board of Visitors, Civil Air Patrol; National Vice President and National Director, 1959-1971,

and First Vice President, 1970-1971, National Rivers and Harbors Congress (now Water Resources Congress); member, Executive Committee, 1971, Water Resources Congress; member, Board of Visitors, U. S. Air Force Academy; member, Advisory Committee, American Enterprise Institute; member, Americana Committee for the National Archives.

He has served as Delegate to Pan American Roads Conference, Caracas, Venezuela, 1954; Delegate to Inter-Parliamentary Conference, Warsaw, Poland, 1959; Delegate to Sixth World Forestry Congress, Madrid, Spain, 1966; Delegate to Seventh World Forestry Congress, Buenos Aires, Argentina, 1972.

5. Has cosponsored all anticrime bills which have received Congressional approval.

6. Was largely responsible for rewriting federal statutes on forestry to provide stronger state and federal forestry programs.

7. Has cosponsored all legislation leading to improved pay, living conditions, and benefits for American servicemen and their families.

8. Has sponsored liberalized Social Security programs with special emphasis on plight of the aged.

9. Constantly stresses recreation as a way to the future in Florida and is a leader in pollution control.

10. Is seeking to arouse more interest on the part of the federal government in programs to vitalize rural areas in smaller communities as an antidote to big-city problems.

11. Has sponsored legislation leading to major improvements in all ports and navigable waterways in his district, and was one of those responsible for approval of the Cross-Florida Barge Canal.
