

JOURNAL OF THE FLORIDA SENATE

Monday, May 7, 1973

The Senate was called to order by the President Pro Tempore for the purpose of conducting the order of business of introduction and reference of resolutions, memorials, bills and joint resolutions pursuant to Rule 4.3.

INTRODUCTION

By Senator Gallen—

SB 1331—A bill to be entitled An act relating to Manatee County, Commercial Fishing: Amending Section 1 and its Subsections (1) and (2), Section 2 and its Subsections (1), (2), (3), (4), (5), (5a), (5b), (6), (7) and (8), Section 3 and its Subsections (1) and (2), Sections 4, 5, 6 and Section 7 and its Subsections (1) and (2), and Sections 8 and 9 of Chapter 67-1685, Laws of Florida, Special Acts of 1967, as amended by Chapter 70-799, and amending Sections 1, 2, and 3 of Chapter 70-799, Laws of Florida, Special Acts of 1970, defining terms, regulating fishing and closing certain inland waters of Manatee County, Florida, to commercial fishing and netting and making exception thereto, regulating the bag limits or number of fish in possession thereon, and further providing that any person so fishing upon said inland waters is deemed to have given his consent for inspection to any law enforcement officer, providing for confiscation and disposition of certain illegal devices and declaring them a nuisance, making a violation of this act a misdemeanor, providing for severability in the event any part of this act is held to be unconstitutional and providing an effective date and repealing all laws in conflict with this act, declaring fishing in such waters to be a privilege and not a right subject to regulations by the State of Florida and stating the Legislature's intent of this act.

Evidence of notice and publication was established by the Senate as to SB 1331.

By Senators Johnston and Childers—

SB 1332—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the City of Pensacola; providing an increase in the amount of pension received by persons from the firemen's relief and pension fund; prescribing the computation of such increase and the amount thereof; repealing conflicting laws; providing an effective date.

Evidence of notice and publication was established by the Senate as to SB 1332.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Rules and Calendar.

By Senators Johnston and Childers—

SB 1333—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the City of Pensacola; amending §4, chapter 21483, as amended by chapters 24809, 31157, 57-1713, 59-1723 and 61-2653, Laws of Florida, relating to the creation and maintenance of the firemen's relief and pension fund, to provide increased contributions of firemen and the City of Pensacola into said fund; repealing conflicting laws; providing an effective date.

Evidence of notice and publication was established by the Senate as to SB 1333.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Rules and Calendar.

By Senators Johnston and Childers—

SB 1334—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the City of Milton; creating a civil service system for certain employees of the City of Milton; creating a civil service board to administer said system; fixing the powers and duties of said board and providing for the method and terms of employment of certain employees of the City of Milton; regulating the employment and discharge of said employees and providing for the procedure therefor; providing penalties; providing an effective date.

Evidence of notice and publication was established by the Senate as to SB 1334.
