

JOURNAL OF THE FLORIDA SENATE

Tuesday, April 15, 1975

The Senate was called to order by the President at 8:30 a.m. for the purpose of conducting the order of business of introduction and reference of resolutions, memorials, bills and joint resolutions pursuant to Rule 4.3.

INTRODUCTION

By Senator Deeb—

SB 332—A bill to be entitled An act relating to abuse of children; amending s.827.07(6), Florida Statutes, 1974 Supplement; requiring the Department of Health and Rehabilitative Services to notify the state attorney of suspected child abuse; requiring the state attorney to assist in the investigation; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Health and Rehabilitative Services.

By the Committee on Education—

SB 333—A bill to be entitled An act relating to schools; amending s.234.03, Florida Statutes, to require liability insurance or other means of compensation for bodily injury or death or property damage on school buses and other motor vehicles, to set limits of coverage, and to require reports of accidents; amending s.768.28(2), Florida Statutes, to clarify legislative intent by including school boards in the waiver of sovereign immunity in tort actions; providing applicability; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Commerce.

By Senator Hair —

SJR 334—A joint resolution proposing an amendment to Section 9, Article XII of the State Constitution, relating to bonds for the acquisition and construction of roads, to continue the state tax, designated the "second gas tax".

—was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Rules and Calendar.

By the Committee on Transportation—

SB 335—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Florida Uniform Traffic Control Law; amending ss.316.181(2), 316.182(2), and 316.183(2), Florida Statutes, establishing maximum speed limits of 55 miles per hour; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Transportation and Judiciary-Criminal.

By Senators Hair, Thomas (30th) and Saylor—

SB 336—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Florida Psychological Practice Act; amending ss.490.18, 490.25(1), Florida Statutes, 1974 Supplement; increasing examination fee and license renewal fee for psychologists; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Governmental Operations and Ways and Means.

By Senators Brantley, Childers (1st), Thomas (30th), Sims, Gallen, Lewis, Trask and Thomas (4th)—

SB 337—A bill to be entitled An act relating to state agencies; creating the Florida Economic Impact Disclosure Act of 1975; providing legislative intent; providing definitions; requiring every agency, in advance of any agency action, to prepare an economic impact statement along specified lines; requiring agencies to make an economic impact statement a part of the record in proceedings relative to agency action under the Administrative Procedure Act; authorizing specified elected officials to request economic impact statements from agencies; providing exemptions; providing for judicial review; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Commerce.

By Senators McClain, Spicola, Gallen, Lane (23rd) and Henderson—

SB 338—A bill to be entitled An act relating to governmental reorganization; transferring the Florida Mental Health Institute at Tampa from the Division of Mental Health of the Department of Health and Rehabilitative Services to the Division of Universities of the Department of Education; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Governmental Operations, Health and Rehabilitative Services and Education.

By Senators Childers (1st), Gordon, Poston and Thomas (4th)—

SB 339—A bill to be entitled An act relating to travel expenses; amending s.112.061(3)(a), Florida Statutes; providing that an agency head may request a statement from the traveler's supervisor that proposed travel is for official state business; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Governmental Operations.

By Senator Sims—

SB 340—A bill to be entitled An act relating to education; amending s.232.01(1)(a), (b), Florida Statutes; providing that a child who attains the age of 14 years shall not be required to attend school; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Education.

By Senators Childers (1st) and Brantley—

SB 341—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Florida Public Service Commission; amending s.350.01, Florida Statutes; increasing the number of commissioners; providing for election of commissioners from districts; providing terms of office of commissioners; amending s.366.06(3), Florida Statutes, 1974 Supplement, and adding subsection (5) to said section; providing for location of rate hearings; providing for filing of copies of rate orders; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Governmental Operations and Commerce.

By the Committee on Transportation—

SB 342—A bill to be entitled An act relating to transfer of motor vehicle certificates of title; amending s.319.23(5), Florida Statutes; increasing the fee to \$10 for failing to file application for transfer within 10 days; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Transportation and Ways and Means.

By Senator MacKay—

SB 343—A bill to be entitled An act relating to alcoholic beverages; amending s.561.12, Florida Statutes, providing that 12 percent of the revenue collected from the excise tax on alcoholic beverages containing between 14 percent and 48 percent of alcohol by weight, except wines, shall be deposited in the Alcoholic Rehabilitation Trust Fund, and the remainder shall be paid into the General Revenue Fund; amending s.565.12(1)(a), Florida Statutes, increasing the excise tax on such alcoholic beverages; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Commerce, Health and Rehabilitative Services and Ways and Means.

By Senator Thomas (30th)—

SB 344—A bill to be entitled An act relating to law enforcement officers; amending s.112.531(1), Florida Statutes, 1974 Supplement, exempting police chiefs from the definition of

"law enforcement officer" for purposes of certain law enforcement officers' rights relating to disciplinary investigations and actions; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Governmental Operations.

By Senator Thomas (80th)—

SB 345—A bill to be entitled An act relating to retardation; creating "The Bill of Rights of Retarded Persons"; providing legislative intent; providing definitions; providing certain rights relating to the type and manner of services to be received by persons, or "clients", admitted to the Division of Retardation for receipt of its services; providing civil liability for persons who violate or abuse any rights or privileges of a client; providing certain exceptions from liability; requiring the Department of Health and Rehabilitative Services to provide each client or his parent or legal guardian with a written copy of the act; requiring each residential facility operated by the division to develop a program of resident government to represent resident interests; adding s.393.11(4), Florida Statutes, entitling persons involuntarily admitted to the division or their parent or legal guardian to a writ of habeas corpus for certain purposes; amending s.393.021(1), (2), and adding s.393.021(3)—(6), Florida Statutes, requiring the Division of Retardation to reassess person certified to the division for services not less than once each year; requiring the division to provide each client with an individual habilitation plan; providing for the supervision of the plan by one specialist; requiring the Division to make an annual report of progress of each client; requiring the Department of Health and Rehabilitative Services to develop a plan to implement the act; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Health and Rehabilitative Services and Judiciary-Civil.

By Senator Saylor—

SB 346—A bill to be entitled An act relating to elections; creating s.100.095, Florida Statutes, prohibiting the holding of municipal elections on the same date as state or county primary or general elections or within 30 days thereof; amending s.100.261, Florida Statutes, conforming same with this act; creating s.101.325, Florida Statutes, authorizing counties to use separate voting machines for each party in primary election; amending s.102.012(1), (2), (7), (8), Florida Statutes, providing for appointment of election boards by the supervisor of election; providing the election board appointed for the first primary election shall also serve for the second primary election; requiring election board members be physically capable of serving on the election board; repealing s.104.451, Florida Statutes, relating to change of dates of municipal elections; amending s.105.021, Florida Statutes, providing for nonpartisan elections at the time of the second primary election and the general election; providing an effective date.

By the Committee on Transportation—

SB 347—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles; amending s.319.25 (5)(b), (c), Florida Statutes, and adding paragraphs (e) and (f) to said subsection; providing fees charged for certain records of the Division of Motor Vehicles; amending s.321.23, Florida Statutes, providing fees charged for certain records of the Division of Highway Patrol; creating s.322.202, Florida Statutes; providing fees charged for certain records of the Division of Driver License; providing for cabinet to set such fees in interim; providing for deposit of revenues; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Transportation, Governmental Operations and Ways and Means.

By the Committee on Transportation—

SB 348—A bill to be entitled An act relating to motor vehicle license plates; amending s.320.031, Florida Statutes; authorizing the mailing of revalidation stickers to applicants upon request; requiring a mail service charge; amending s.320.04(1), Florida Statutes, 1974 Supplement; increasing the service charge for

the issuance of certain licenses, license plates, revalidation stickers, certificates of title, and transfers or duplicates thereof; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Transportation and Ways and Means.

By Senators Gallen and Tobiassen—

SB 349—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the elected state officers class of the Florida retirement system; amending section 121.052(4)(a), Florida Statutes, to provide that the state shall pay the entire contribution at the rate of sixteen (16) percent of gross compensation per pay period for each supreme court justice, district court of appeal judge, circuit judge or county court judge who is a member of such class; providing for a period of election for a justice or judge who is not currently a member of such class; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Governmental Operations and Ways and Means.

By Senator Gallen—

SB 350—A bill to be entitled An act relating to service of process; amending ss.48.031 and 48.183, Florida Statutes; providing that service of process may be made by leaving a copy of it and a copy of the complaint, petition or initial pleading at the usual place of abode of the person to be served with some person of the family who is fifteen years of age or older; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary-Civil.

By Senator Hair—

SB 351—A bill to be entitled An act relating to eminent domain; creating s.73.092, Florida Statutes; providing certain criteria to be considered by the court in assessing attorneys' fees; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary-Civil.

By Senator Hair—

SB 352—A bill to be entitled An act relating to masseurs and masseuses; adding a new subsection (5) to s.480.03, Florida Statutes, providing an exemption from chapter 480, Florida Statutes, which regulates the practice of masseurs and masseuses, for athletic trainers employed by professional athletic teams located or training within this state; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Commerce.

By Senator Brantley—

SB 353—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Florida Retirement System; amending s.121.081(2)(a), Florida Statutes, 1974 Supplement; providing conditions under which prior service may be claimed as creditable service without awaiting expiration of 3-year period; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Governmental Operations and Ways and Means.

By Senator Brantley—

SB 354—A bill to be entitled An act relating to judges of the district courts of appeal; amending s.35.19, Florida Statutes, to provide for the payment of per diem, sustenance allowances and travel expenses to said judges; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Governmental Operations, Judiciary-Civil and Ways and Means.

By Senator Brantley—

SJR 355—A joint resolution proposing an amendment to Section 5 of Article IV of the State Constitution, relating to

the terms of office of the lieutenant governor and the cabinet members.

—was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Rules and Calendar.

By Senator Saylor—

SB 356—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the state officers and employees group insurance program; amending s.112.075(10), Florida Statutes, 1974 Supplement; creating a trust fund and designating uses for funds deposited therein; providing for the deposit of interest and funds in the trust fund; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Governmental Operations and Ways and Means.

By Senator Hair—

SB 357—A bill to be entitled An act relating to domestic relations; adding s.61.181(3)-(5), Florida Statutes; authorizing the creation of a domestic relations payment enforcement system in each circuit, or county within a circuit; providing guidelines for the operation of such an enforcement system; providing for the funding thereof; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary-Civil.

By Senator Zinkil—

SB 358—A bill to be entitled An act relating to public school instructional staff; amending s.231.40(1)(b), Florida Statutes, 1974 Supplement; authorizing district school boards to permit a member of such staff 4 days of sick leave annually to be used for personal reasons; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Education and Ways and Means.

By Senator Saylor—

SB 359—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the appointment of the executive directors of specific executive agencies; amending ss.20.21(1), 20.24(1), and 20.25(1), Florida Statutes; amending s.20.22(1), Florida Statutes, 1974 Supplement; providing for appointment of the executive directors of the Department of Revenue, the Department of General Services, the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles, and the Department of Natural Resources by the governor with approval of 3 members of the cabinet; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Governmental Operations.

By Senator Zinkil—

SB 360—A bill to be entitled An act relating to transportation; providing for the Department of Transportation to study and identify alternatives that would increase the efficiency of energy utilization within the transportation sector and to develop an integrated transportation system for the state; requiring the department to make a preliminary report to the governor and legislature; providing an appropriation; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Transportation and Ways and Means.

By Senator Poston —

SB 361—A bill to be entitled An act relating to drivers' licenses; creating s.322.112, Florida Statutes; providing for a medical advisory board to advise the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles on certain medical criteria relating to drivers' licenses; providing for the appointment of a twelve member board, one member of which shall be a medical doctor employed by the Department of Health and Rehabilitative Services; providing for reporting of a driver with mental or physical disability; providing for confidentiality and immunity from legal action; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Governmental Operations and Transportation.

By Senators Gordon, Myers, Vogt and MacKay—

SB 362—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Medical Practice Act; amending s.458.01, Florida Statutes; providing for the membership of the State Board of Medical Examiners to be composed of eight physicians and two consumers; provides for the physicians to include one dean or assistant dean and two primary care faculty members; amending s.458.02(1), Florida Statutes; providing for appointments to the board; amending s.458.04, Florida Statutes; providing for fifty dollar reimbursement for Board members; providing for not less than two regular meetings annually; repealing four successive weekly notice requirement; amending s.458.05(3)(a), and s.458.09, Florida Statutes; eliminating written examination requirement; amending s.458.1201(1), (m), Florida Statutes, and adding paragraphs (o), (p), to said section; providing that the State Board of Medical Examiners determine standards of acceptable and prevailing medical practice; authorizing board action in court adjudicated medical malpractice cases and certain disciplinary cases; providing for a civil penalty; adding paragraphs (c) and (d) to s.458.1201(2); providing for appointment of licensed physicians to act for the board; providing for immunity from liability for investigations conducted pursuant to this act; amending s.458.1201(3)(a), Florida Statutes; authorizing board to require physicians to participate in continuing education programs; authorizing board to require physicians to practice under the direction of a physician in certain locations; adding s.458.1201(5), Florida Statutes; requiring the board to report to the legislature; amending s.458.121(1), Florida Statutes; eliminating provisions for delivering ten copies of charges to secretary and board members; by the complainant amending s.458.122(1), Florida Statutes; providing for the executive director to require production of evidence for hearings; providing an effective date.

By the Committee on Agriculture—

SB 363—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Florida Pesticide Application Act of 1974; amending s.487.162(1), Florida Statutes, 1974 Supplement; redesignating the membership of the Pesticide Application Council; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Agriculture.

By Senator Hair—

SB 364—A bill to be entitled An act relating to district courts of appeal; creating s.35.055, Florida Statutes; providing for the establishment of a branch court and headquarters of the First District Court of Appeal in Jacksonville, Duval County; amending s.35.22, Florida Statutes; providing for assignment of deputy clerks to branch courts; amending s.35.23, Florida Statutes; providing for an office at the headquarters of a branch court; providing an effective date.

By Senator Thomas (4th)—

SB 365—A bill to be entitled An act relating to connections to or from roads on a state-maintained system; defining connections; providing for powers and duties of the Department of Transportation; providing for regulations governing connections and the issuance of permits; providing for payment by the permittee for construction or alteration of connections; providing an effective date.

SB 366—A bill to be entitled An act relating to state attorneys; amending s.27.14(1), Florida Statutes, 1974 Supplement; providing that executive orders that exchange or assign state attorneys and that are filed by the governor with the office of the Department of State shall be valid for a period of 6 months from the date of issuance of the order; providing for renewal

of such orders; removing provisions relating to Supreme Court approval of an exchange or assignment in excess of 60 days; providing an effective date.

SB 367—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Florida Statutes; amending s. 11.242(6), Florida Statutes; requiring the looseleaf system of binding of the Florida Statutes; providing an effective date.

SB 368—A bill to be entitled An act relating to education; amending s.229.57, Florida Statutes, 1974 Supplement; providing for an integrated educational information system; providing for an office of educational accountability and an educational auditor; providing for an educational evaluation review; providing for auditing of districts; providing for reporting; repealing ss.228.165, 229.802, 236.02(7), Florida Statutes, relating to annual reports of school progress, recommendations for improvements in schools and institutions, and comprehensive educational planning; repealing s.237.34, Florida Statutes, 1974 Supplement, relating to the comprehensive information, accounting and reporting system; providing an effective date.

SB 370—A bill to be entitled An act relating to juveniles; amending s.39.11(8), Florida Statutes, 1974 Supplement, and adding a new subsection to said section; authorizing court to order parents or legal guardian of a child adjudicated dependent or delinquent or in need of supervision to participate in child's rehabilitation program; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Health and Rehabilitative Services and Judiciary-Criminal.

By Senators Childers (28th), MacKay and Thomas (30th)—

SB 371—A bill to be entitled An act relating to juveniles; amending s.39.02(5)(c), Florida Statutes; subjecting all felony charges to review by the state attorney; amending s.39.03(3)(c), Florida Statutes; providing for detention of juveniles charged with a third subsequent delinquent offense; amending s.39.04(1), Florida Statutes; providing for consultation with the state attorney; providing for a history of child's previous involvement with the law; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary-Criminal.

By Senator Poston—

SB 372—A bill to be entitled An act for the relief of specified individuals to compensate them for serving as grand jurors or appearing as witnesses after the term of court for which they

were called had expired due to an oversight by the state attorney; providing an effective date.

By Senator Lane (31st)—

SB 373—A bill to be entitled An act relating to limitation of malpractice actions; amending s.95.11(4)(a), Florida Statutes, 1974 Supplement, to provide a limitation of actions arising from any medical, dental or surgical diagnosis, treatment or care; requiring such actions be commenced within 1 year from date of discovery, but no later than 4 years from date of incident; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Judiciary-Civil and Commerce.

By Senator Peterson—

SB 374—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Florida Retirement System; amending s.121.021(24), Florida Statutes, to change the definition of "average final compensation"; providing an effective date.

By Senator Childers (1st)—

SB 375—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Beach and Shore Preservation Act; amending s.161.052(6), (7), Florida Statutes, and adding a new subsection (6) to said section; adding s.161.053(8), Florida Statutes; exempting from coastal construction setback restrictions additions to or modification, maintenance or repair of existing structures within existing foundations; providing exclusions; providing an effective date.

SB 376—A bill to be entitled An act relating to municipalities; amending s.166.231(4), Florida Statutes, requiring, instead of permitting, municipalities to exempt from the public service tax the purchase of certain public services by the United States Government, the state, or any other public body; providing for retroactive effect; providing an effective date.

By Senators Childers (28th), MacKay and Thomas (30th)—

SB 377—A bill to be entitled An act relating to juveniles, amending s.39.11(5), Florida Statutes, 1974 Supplement, requiring the Division of Youth Services to inform and consult the committing judge, state attorney, appropriate law enforcement agency, and public defender or defense attorney prior to the release to the community of a committed youth; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary-Criminal.

By Senators Childers (28th), and Thomas (30th)—

SB 378—A bill to be entitled An act relating to juveniles and youth services; amending ss.39.02(4), 39.11(3)(a), (c), (5), Florida Statutes, 1974 Supplement; amending ss.39.12(2), 959.115(4), 959.116(1), 959.12, 959.225(1), Florida Statutes; to provide that the term of commitment of a child to the Division of Youth Services shall be until the child's 18th birthday, unless sooner discharged; providing an effective date.

SB 379—A bill to be entitled An act relating to juveniles; amending ss. 39.01(4), (5), (18), (22), (23), (25), (27), (28), 39.03(2)(b), (3)(a), (b), 39.04(1), 39.05(2), (4), (5), (7), 39.06(2), (4)(a), 39.08, 39.09(1)(b), (3), 39.10, Florida Stat-

utes, and s.39.02(1), (4), Florida Statutes, 1974 Supplement; deleting references to children in need of supervision; adding s.39.01(10)(h), (i), Florida Statutes; expanding the definition of "dependent child"; amending s.39.03(1)(d), Florida Statutes; authorizing law enforcement officers to take runaway children into custody for the purpose of delivering such children to certain persons; amending s.39.11(2)(d), Florida Statutes; providing commitment of dependent children by the court for subsequent adoption be unavailable for runaway or truant children; amending ss. 232.09(2), 232.19(3), Florida Statutes; providing truant children be dealt with as dependent children; providing any child under the supervision of the Division of Youth Services as a child in need of supervision prior to the effective date of this act be discharged or transferred; repealing ss.39.01(11), 39.11(1), Florida Statutes, as amended, relating to children in need of supervision; repealing s.232.19(6)(b), Florida Statutes, providing truant children be dealt with as children in need of supervision; providing an effective date.

By Senators Childers (28th) and MacKay—

SB 381—A bill to be entitled An act relating to juvenile delinquents; amending ss.39.03(6)(a),(b), 39.12(3), and 959.225(2), Florida Statutes, to provide that certain information relating to a child who has been adjudicated delinquent more than once shall be a public record; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary-Criminal.

By Senators Lewis and Henderson—

SB 382—A bill to be entitled An act relating to property rights; creating a Property Rights Study Commission to study property rights in relation to environmental and land use regulations and to report to the Governor and the Legislature a plan to compensate owners of land affected by such regulations; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Natural Resources and Conservation and Ways and Means.

By Senator Vogt—
