

JOURNAL OF THE FLORIDA SENATE

Monday, May 3, 1976

The Senate was called to order by Senator Dunn at 8:30 a.m. for the purpose of conducting the order of business of introduction and reference of resolutions, memorials, bills and joint resolutions pursuant to Rule 4.3.

INTRODUCTION

By Senator Plante—

SB 982—A bill to be entitled An act relating to State Revenue Laws; repealing Part II of chapter 213, Florida Statutes, which provides for the Multistate Tax Compact; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Commerce.

By Senator Zinkil—

SB 983—A bill to be entitled An act relating to homestead tax exemption; amending s. 196.031(3)(c), Florida Statutes; removing the prohibition against applying the \$500 exemption on the homestead for a person who is age 65 or over and who is a widow or a blind person; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Governmental Operations and Ways and Means.

By Senator Henderson—

SB 984—A bill to be entitled An act relating to sewage disposal facilities; amending s. 403.086, Florida Statutes; providing that certain wastes or industrial discharges shall not be disposed of into certain streams or bodies of water unless advanced treatment, approved by the Department of Environmental Regulation, is provided; deleting obsolete provision; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Natural Resources and Conservation.

SB 985 was introduced and passed on April 28.

By Senator Deeb—

SB 986—A bill to be entitled An act relating to fire prevention and control; amending s. 633.021(12), Florida Statutes, and adding subsection (18) to said section; redefining "fire protection system"; defining "registration"; amending s. 633.061(6), Florida Statutes; providing that the license and permit requirements for servicing, repairing, recharging, testing, inspecting, or installing fire extinguishers or systems do not apply to fire protection systems; deleting the exemption for licensed plumbing contractors; amending s. 633.065(1), Florida Statutes; requiring contractors of fire safety and fire protective equipment to be licensed; adding s. 633.521(7), (8), Florida Statutes; exempting licensed plumbing contractors from certification and registration requirements for installing standpipe systems and certain other items; providing that licensees under s. 633.061, Florida Statutes, are not required to be certified to deal with fire extinguishers or systems; amending s. 633.537(1), Florida Statutes; providing for the renewal of certain inoperative certificates; amending s. 633.541(1), Florida Statutes; providing penalties for registration violations; amending s. 633.544(1), Florida Statutes; permitting a contractor to work only in the geographical area covered by his registration; amending s. 633.547, Florida Statutes; providing disciplinary action relating to illegal action by registered contractors; amending s. 633.549, Florida Statutes; providing for injunctions against a contractor operating without a registration; amending s. 633.551(3)-(5), Florida Statutes; requiring an official who is authorized to issue building permits to ascertain that contractor is registered before issuing a permit; requiring the State Fire Marshal to supply registration lists to the county and municipal building departments; amending s. 633.554(1)(b), (2), Florida Statutes; requiring proof of registration by the bidder on county or municipal projects; providing an effective date.

By Senator McClain—

SB 987—A bill to be entitled An act relating to motor vehicle safety inspection, amending s. 325.14, Florida Statutes, removing the requirement that automobiles sold occasionally or privately have a current valid inspection certificate; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Transportation.

By Senator Poston—

SB 988—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Florida Retirement System; amending s. 121.052(1)(c), Florida Statutes, including judges of any metropolitan court established pursuant to s. 6 of Art. VIII of the State Constitution within a list of members of the Elected State Officers' Class of the Florida Retirement System who may purchase additional retirement credit for service prior to January 1, 1973, upon the payment of specified amounts; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Governmental Operations and Ways and Means.

By Senator Ware—

SB 989—A bill to be entitled An act relating to common law business trusts; creating s. 609.08, Florida Statutes, authorizing a common law business trust organized under the laws of the state pursuant to a declaration of trust filed in accordance with chapter 609, Florida Statutes, to merge into a wholly-owned subsidiary corporation if permitted by the laws of the jurisdiction under which the subsidiary corporation is organized; declaring that, except as otherwise provided in the declaration of trust, no shareholders of a common law business trust shall have any dissenters' rights of appraisal; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Judiciary-Civil and Commerce.

By Senators Gordon and Graham—

SB 990—A bill to be entitled An act relating to health care; providing for restricted licensing of retired health care professionals who have been licensed in other states; providing duties of directors of full-time local health units; providing for annual review of practices; providing for revocation of licenses; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Health and Rehabilitative Services.

By Senator Sims—

SB 991—A bill to be entitled An act relating to motor vehicle repair; creating the "Motor Vehicle Repair Act of 1976"; providing definitions; providing exceptions to the application of the act; providing for the creation of a State Motor Vehicle Repair Board; providing for the organization of the board and the compensation of board members; providing for the powers and duties of the board; requiring persons who engage in the repair of motor vehicles to be licensed as a specialty or master mechanic; providing for applications for licensure issued by the board; providing permits for mechanic trainees; requiring motor vehicle repair facilities to be registered with the board; providing penalties; providing for a simplified licensure procedure with respect to certain mechanics who have practiced before the effective date of this act; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Commerce, Governmental Operations, Judiciary-Criminal and Ways and Means.

By Senator Plante—

SB 992—A bill to be entitled An act relating to private passenger automobile energy absorption system; repealing s. 501-

125, Florida Statutes, relating to manufacturer's warranty of equipment; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Commerce.

By Senator Spicola—

SB 993—A bill to be entitled An act relating to voter registration; amending s. 98.081, Florida Statutes; specifying electors who are entitled to receive from the county supervisor of elections the form for advising the supervisor of any change in an elector's status for voter registration purposes; providing additional procedures for a temporarily withdrawn elector to have his name restored to the registration records; creating s. 101.062, Florida Statutes; providing that a withdrawn elector may vote after verification of his status and execution of an oath; prescribing a form for oath of a withdrawn elector; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary-Civil.

By Senator Lewis—

SB 994—A bill to be entitled An act relating to public health; amending s. 381.293(1)-(3), Florida Statutes; providing that the Department of Environmental Regulation shall examine and certificate all water purification and waste-water treatment plant operators; authorizing the department to adopt rules relating to certificates, which may be issued initially for less than 1 year but thereafter shall be renewable annually; removing certification exemption for public lodging establishments; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Governmental Operations, Health and Rehabilitative Services and Ways and Means.

By Senator Hair (by request)—

SB 995—A bill to be entitled An act relating to vocational rehabilitation; amending s. 413.051, Florida Statutes; providing definitions; providing that blind licensees shall be given priority on state property to operate vending facilities; providing duties of the Bureau of Blind Services relating to establishing vending facilities; providing for notification to the bureau by persons in charge of state property regarding new construction or remodeling or expiration of certain vending facility concessions; providing for disposition of certain vending machine income; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Health and Rehabilitative Services and Ways and Means.

By Senator Hair (by request)—

SB 996—A bill to be entitled An act relating to weapons and firearms; adding paragraph (o) to s. 790.25(3), Florida Statutes; providing an exception to the weapons and firearms licensing law for investigators employed by public defenders if such investigators meet certain qualifications; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary-Criminal.

By Senator Holloway—

SB 997—A bill to be entitled An act relating to drivers' licenses; adding subsection (6) to s. 316.028, Florida Statutes, providing a penalty for any person convicted of driving while under the influence of certain substances, or with a certain blood alcohol level, when, at the time, such person's license was revoked for having previously committed such an offense; amending s. 322.28(2), Florida Statutes; increasing the periods of revocation for second and third and subsequent convictions of persons for driving while under such influence, or with such blood alcohol level; deleting provisions requiring proximity between such convictions; deleting provisions requiring the department to revoke a license for the maximum period allowed if the court fails to specify a period; deleting provisions relating to review of periods of revocation; amending s. 322.34, Florida Stat-

utes, exempting such persons from penalty provisions relating to driving with a suspended or revoked license; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary-Criminal.

By Senators Gordon, Brantley, Plante and Wilson—

SB 998—A bill to be entitled An act relating to ethics in government; implementing section 8, Article II of the State Constitution; requiring certain persons to publicly disclose certain information; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary-Civil.

By Senators Johnston, D. Childers and MacKay—

SB 999—A bill to be entitled An act relating to taxation; creating s. 201.0215, Florida Statutes, authorizing the imposition of a real property transfer tax by the various school boards of the state; providing for the imposition and levy of a real property transfer tax of four-tenths of one percent by school boards upon the transfer of any real property within the school district; providing a method of collection of such tax; limiting the use of such revenue for school capital outlay; providing the provisions of this act shall affect school districts only upon its enactment by the various school boards and upon referendum of the electors; exempting agricultural lands from the tax; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Education, Governmental Operations and Ways and Means.

By Senator Ware—

SB 1000—A bill to be entitled An act relating to group insurance for public officers, employees and retired public officers and employees; amending s. 112.075(1)(b), (2), (3)(b), (5), (6), (7)(a), (e), Florida Statutes; authorizing part-time employees and retirees to participate in the state group insurance program at their own expense; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Governmental Operations and Ways and Means.

By Senator Deeb—

SB 1001—A bill to be entitled An act relating to escapes; amending s. 944.40, Florida Statutes; providing for what constitutes prima facie evidence that a prisoner is guilty of an escape; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary-Criminal.

By Senator Gallen—

SB 1002—A bill to be entitled An act relating to elections; adding section 97.063(6), Florida Statutes, providing for sworn statement of physical disability; providing a penalty; amending section 97.065, Florida Statutes, providing for two witnesses to attest absentee registration application; adding subsection (6) to section 98.051, Florida Statutes, providing for the registration of physically handicapped persons by mail; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Judiciary-Civil and Judiciary-Criminal.

By Senator Myers—

SB 1003—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the use of prisoners in public works; amending s. 945.11, Florida Statutes; authorizing the use of prisoners in public works by political subdivisions; providing that political subdivisions, state agencies, or institutions may reimburse the Department of Offender Rehabilitation for such services; deleting the basis for determining the amount of such reimbursement; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

By Senator Graham—

SB 1004—A bill to be entitled An act relating to environmental regulation; amending s. 403.062, Florida Statutes; providing that the Department of Environmental Regulation shall have general control and supervision over wetlands including transitional zones; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Natural Resources and Conservation.

By Senator Renick (by request)—

SB 1005—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Department of Health and Rehabilitative Services; amending s. 500.351, Florida Statutes, relating to the regulation of drugs and cosmetics; transferring fees paid to the Division of Health to the State Treasurer for deposit in the General Revenue Fund; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Health and Rehabilitative Services and Ways and Means.

By Senator Dunn—

SB 1006—A bill to be entitled An act relating to improving the administration of justice; creating s. 27.36, Florida Statutes; creating the Office of Prosecution Coordination; prescribing its purpose, duties, and functions; creating a supervisory board for such office; providing for an executive director of such office; providing for support personnel; providing for funding of the office from the State Attorneys' operating budgets; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Judiciary-Criminal, Governmental Operations and Ways and Means.

By Senators Firestone (by request), Brantley and Barron—

SB 1007—A bill to be entitled An act relating to governmental reorganization; creating s. 20.241, Florida Statutes, to create the Department of Highway Patrol; transferring the powers, duties and functions of the Divisions of Motor Vehicles and Driver Licenses of the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles to the Department of Insurance; adding subsections (7)-(9) to s. 20.13, Florida Statutes, to conform thereto; repealing s. 20.24, Florida Statutes, which created the former department; directing that changes in terminology in the Florida Statutes be made; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Governmental Operations, Transportation and Ways and Means.

By Senators Graham, Zinkil, J. Thomas, P. Thomas, Winn, Gallen and Barron—

SB 1008—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Florida Mental Health Act; adding s. 394.461(4), Florida Statutes; requiring separate housing facilities for the criminally insane; requiring early transfer from state hospitals; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Health and Rehabilitative Services.

SB 1010—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the control of the imported fire ant; authorizing the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services to institute a program for the control of the imported fire ant; providing for authority to set up cooperative programs with local governments or private landowners; establishing restrictions for application of mirex bait to wooded areas and the seacoast; providing an appropriation to the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Agriculture and Ways and Means.

By Senator Graham—

SB 1011—A bill to be entitled An act relating to education; amending s. 228.091, Florida Statutes; providing a penalty for the trespass by certain persons upon the grounds or facilities of educational institutions; increasing the penalty for the failure of such persons to leave after being ordered to do so; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary-Criminal.

By Senator Johnston—

SB 1012—A bill to be entitled An act relating to ad valorem taxation; creating s. 197.017, Florida Statutes, providing for a deferral of certain taxes otherwise due; providing conditions for eligibility for deferral; providing procedures; providing for a lien for the amount of deferred taxes; providing for collection of deferred taxes; providing for other matters relative to the foregoing; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Governmental Operations and Ways and Means.

SB 1013—A bill to be entitled An act relating to education; amending sections 231.40(1)(c), and 231.48(2), Florida Statutes, 1974 Supplement; clarifying application of terminal pay provisions for instructional and non-instructional personnel; providing terminal pay for administrative personnel; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Education and Ways and Means.

By Senator Graham—

SB 1014—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the tax on cigarettes; amending s. 210.02(1), (3), (4), and (5), Florida Statutes, 1975, increasing the cigarette tax; amending s. 210.20(2) and (3), Florida Statutes, and adding a new subsection thereto; providing for the distribution of revenues from such tax to the General Revenue Fund; directing that a change in terminology in the Florida Statutes be made; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Commerce and Ways and Means.

By Senator Johnston—

SB 1015—A bill to be entitled An act relating to freshwater fish; requiring the tagging of fish taken from or caught in certain lakes as a condition precedent to sale for consumption; authorizing the assessment of a tag fee by the Game and Fresh Water Fish Commission; providing an appropriation; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Natural Resources and Conservation and Ways and Means.

SJR 1016—A joint resolution proposing an amendment to Section 10, Article VII of the State Constitution, relating to lending or using the taxing power or credit of this state, to allow the issuance of revenue bonds to finance or refinance the cost of capital projects for tourist-related attractions.

Rehabilitative Services to perform radiological environmental surveillance; providing powers and duties of the department; authorizing licensing of sources of ionizing radiation; providing rule-making authority for the department; providing for inspections; authorizing training and educational programs; authorizing the department to require records of persons who possess or use sources of ionizing radiation; providing authority to respond to emergencies involving the release of radioactive materials; authorizing the department to impound certain materials in emergencies; authorizing the department to require posting of a bond by licensees; authorizing the department to require a perpetual care trust fund; authorizing the department to charge and collect fees; providing prohibited uses for sources of radiation; providing for injunctive relief against violators; providing penalties; providing a severability clause; providing an effective date.

SB 1018—A bill to be entitled An act relating to motor vehicle licensing; amending s. 320.01(26), Florida Statutes; redefining registration period; adding s. 320.02(3), Florida Statutes; requiring an owner of a motor vehicle to notify the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles of any change in his address; amending ss. 320.06(1)(b), (d), (e), (5)(a), (b), (7), (8), 320.07(1), (3), 320.071, 325.19, Florida Statutes; providing for an indefinite period license plate; providing annual registration periods; providing renewal periods; requiring inspection of tags and stickers; providing for free replacement of tags not meeting inspection requirements; providing for advance renewals; repealing s. 320.72(1)-(4), (6)(d), Florida Statutes, which provides for specially selected tag numbers; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Transportation and Ways and Means.

By Senators D. Childers and Johnston—

SB 1019—A bill to be entitled An act relating to per diem and traveling expenses of public officers, employees, and authorized persons; amending s. 112.061(6)(b), (7)(h), Florida Statutes; providing that members of the Legislature may receive per diem for intradistrict overnight travel; providing that a traveler on a private aircraft may be reimbursed his fare under certain conditions; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Rules and Calendar, Governmental Operations and Ways and Means.

By Senators J. Thomas, D. Lane and Zinkil—

SB 1020—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Florida Retirement System; adding subsection (9) to s. 121.052, Florida Statutes, providing that, for service earned after July 1, 1974, with respect to compulsory members of the Elected State Officers' Class of the Florida Retirement System, any combination of terms of office of such an elected state officer totaling 8 years of service shall entitle such officer to be eligible to receive 8 years of service credit; creating s. 121.053, Florida Statutes, providing for the participation of county court judges, all other state and county elected officers, and elected municipal officers, in the Elected State Officers' Class of the Florida Retirement System; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Governmental Operations and Ways and Means.

By Senators Stolzenburg and Tobiassen—

SB 1021—A bill to be entitled An act relating to law enforcement; amending s. 321.02, Florida Statutes, directing the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles to furnish each patrol officer of the Florida Highway Patrol with a bulletproof vest; amending s. 370.021(5), Florida Statutes, providing that the Department of Natural Resources shall furnish each of

its law enforcement officers with a bulletproof vest; providing an appropriation; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Governmental Operations and Ways and Means.

By Senator Poston—

SB 1022—A bill to be entitled An act relating to gasoline taxation; amending s. 206.41(1), (4), Florida Statutes; providing for an additional 2 cents per gallon gas tax; renumbering s. 206.45(3), (4), Florida Statutes, and adding a new subsection to said section; providing that the proceeds go to the State Transportation Trust Fund; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Commerce, Transportation, Ways and Means Subcommittee A and Ways and Means.

By Senator D. Lane—

SB 1023—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the district school system; amending s. 230.67(2), Florida Statutes, relating to job placement and follow-up services, to require district school boards to conduct follow-up studies of all students graduating or leaving public and vocational-technical schools or a random sample thereof; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Education.

By Senator Myers—

SB 1024—A bill to be entitled An act relating to payment of jurors and witnesses; creating ss. 40.291, 40.293, Florida Statutes; prescribing the manner and method for payment of jurors and witnesses; providing for requisition upon the State Comptroller for reimbursement; providing for legislative appropriation by separate category; providing for allocation of moneys upon deficiency; repealing ss. 40.29-40.35, Florida Statutes, which sections prescribe the manner and method for payment of jurors and witnesses; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Judiciary-Civil and Ways and Means.

By Senator Gordon—

SB 1025—A bill to be entitled An act relating to medical practice; amending s. 458.06(2), Florida Statutes; increasing the annual license fee for physicians; providing that no certificate of registration be issued to a physician not completing courses in continuing medical education; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Health and Rehabilitative Services and Ways and Means.

By Senator Graham—

SB 1026—A bill to be entitled An act relating to education; amending s. 230.234, Florida Statutes, providing for the payment of costs of legal services for officers, agents, and employees of school boards; providing for public meeting; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Education and Governmental Operations.

By Senators Graham, MacKay and Gordon—

SB 1027—A bill to be entitled An act relating to corrections; creating s. 944.0235, Florida Statutes; providing intent; requiring the Department of Offender Rehabilitation to establish a mutual agreement program for certain prisoners whereby prisoners contract with the department for release upon completion of a mutually agreed upon set of objectives; providing procedures for intake, evaluation, and contract negotiation; providing effect of contract and requiring certain contract provisions; providing for reversion of the prisoner to regular institutional care under certain circumstances; requiring the progress of the prisoner to be monitored; providing a procedure for contract renegotiation under certain circumstances; providing an effective date.

SM 1028—A memorial to the Congress of the United States, urging Congress to enact into law a universal comprehensive health care program.

SB 1029—A bill to be entitled An act relating to lewd and lascivious behavior; creating s. 798.021, Florida Statutes, providing that open, public, and gross lewdness and lascivious behavior shall be a misdemeanor of the second degree; repealing ss. 798.01, 798.02, and 798.03, Florida Statutes, relating to the crimes of adultery, lewd and lascivious behavior, and fornication; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary-Criminal.

By Senator Gordon—

SB 1030—A bill to be entitled An act relating to tax on sales, use and other transactions; amending s. 212.03(4), Florida Statutes; providing that any person who enters a written lease for a specified period for continuous residence at a hotel, apartment house, rooming house, or tourist or trailer camp, or who resides for a specified period in such accommodations shall be exempt from the payment of such tax on such rentals; repealing s. 212.03(7), Florida Statutes, relating to the exemption from such tax for the rental or lease of accommodations intended as a principal or permanent residence; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Commerce and Ways and Means.

By Senator Winn—

SB 1031—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the issuance and sale of revenue bonds; amending ss. 159.26 and 159.27(5), Florida Statutes; authorizing the issuance of revenue bonds by counties, municipalities; special districts, and other local governmental bodies and agencies to finance tourist related attractions; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Commerce.

By Senator Gordon—

SB 1032—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the tax on the lease or rental of real property; adding s. 212.031(5), Florida Statutes; providing a partial tax exemption for real property subleased for conventions, public shows, or trade shows; providing an effective date.
