The Senate was called to order by Senator Jon Thomas at 8:30 a.m. for the purpose of conducting the order of business of introduction and reference of resolutions, memorials, bills and joint resolutions pursuant to Rule 4.3.

## INTRODUCTION

By Senator MacKay—

SB 631—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Public Service Commission; amending s. 366.041(1), Florida Statutes; prohibiting the commission from requiring existing customers to pay the capital outlay cost of providing utility services to new customers; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Economic, Community and Consumer Affairs; and Commerce.

By Senators MacKay and Pat Thomas—

SB 632—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Teachers' Retirement System; creating s. 238.072, Florida Statutes; providing that certain state and county cooperative extension personnel who are members of such system be entitled to retire with full benefits at age 55 upon completion of 30 years of creditable service; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Personnel, Retirement and Collective Bargaining; and Appropriations.

By Senator Sayler—

SB 633—A bill to be entitled An act relating to wages of persons employed on public works; repealing s. 215.19, Florida

Statutes, relating to the rate of wages for laborers, mechanics, and apprentices employed on public works; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Commerce and Governmental Operations.

By Senator Trask—

SB 634—A bill to be entitled An act relating to assessments; amending s. 193.062, Florida Statutes; requiring that tangible personal property and inventory tax returns be filed by April 15; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Finance, Taxation and Claims.

By Senator Henderson—

SB 635—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the John and Mable Ringling Museum of Art; amending s. 265.27, Florida Statutes; providing for the temporary loan of objects of art to certain institutions located outside the state; specifying institutions and organizations within the state to which such loans may be made for educational purposes; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Governmental Operations.
