INTRODUCTION

By Senator Pat Thomas—

SCR 1024—A concurrent resolution honoring the bravery and heroism of Sgt. Ernest I. "Boots" Thomas and endorsing the erection of a memorial in honor of his wartime deeds.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Rules and Calendar.

By Senator Pat Thomas—

SB 1025—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the state officers and employees group insurance program; amending s. 112.075(7), Florida Statutes; requiring the state to pay 75 percent of the cost of health insurance premiums for its officers and full time employees who wish to participate in the group insurance program; requiring the state to pay 50 percent of the cost of insuring the dependents of state officers and full-time employees under such health insurance program; providing that the name of said program be changed from the State Group Insurance Program to the State Health and Hospitalization Insurance Program; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Personnel, Retirement and Collective Bargaining; and Appropriations.

By Senator Scarborough—

SB 1026—A bill to be entitled An act relating to public employees; renumbering s. 447.301(4), (5), Florida Statutes, as s. 447.301(5), (6), Florida Statutes, and adding new subsections to said section; prescribing the right of public employees to have their interests represented before the Legislature; providing for administrative leave for public employees when representing their employee organizations; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Personnel, Retirement and Collective Bargaining; and Governmental Operations.

By Senator Hair (by request)—

SB 1027—A bill to be entitled An act relating to independent colleges and universities; creating the State Tuition Grant Fund and authorizing the Department of Education to administer such fund; authorizing tuition grants from said fund to certain students at certain independent colleges and universities located in the state; providing for eligibility standards and priorities in the awarding of such grants; providing standards for the renewal of such grants, for the transfer of such grants between certain schools, and for the refund of such grants to the Department of Education under certain circumstances; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

By Senator Hair—

SB 1028—A bill to be entitled An act relating to community colleges; creating s. 230.7595, Florida Statutes; empowering the district boards of trustees of community colleges to employ police officers for their community colleges; providing for powers, duties, and requirements of such officers similar to

those of police officers in the State University System; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Education and Appropriations.

By Senator Hair—

SB 1029—A bill to be entitled An act relating to courts; amending ss. 26.031(1)(d), (g), (m), 34.022(50), Florida Statutes; providing an additional circuit judge in the Fourth, Seventh, and Thirteenth Judicial Circuits; providing an additional county court judge in Palm Beach County; providing an appropriation; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Judiciary-Civil and Appropriations.

By Senator Dunn—

SB 1030—A bill to be entitled An act relating to enforcement of foreign judgments; providing a short title; providing rules of construction; providing that certain foreign judgments may be filed and enforced as judgments of a circuit court; requiring certain information to be filed along with the judgment; requiring mailing of notice of filing to the judgment debtor; providing circumstances for a stay of enforcement; requiring payment of certain fees and service charges; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Judiciary-Civil and Commerce.

By Senator McClain—

SB 1031—A bill to be entitled An act relating to telephone solicitation; creating s. 365.165, Florida Statutes; prohibiting the use of automated telephone solicitation systems; providing a penalty; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Commerce.

By Senator Castor—

SB 1032—A bill to be entitled An act relating to alimony and garnishment; amending s. 61.12(2), Florida Statutes, authorizing a court to issue a continuing writ of garnishment for the periodic payment of alimony; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary-Civil.

By Senator Don Childers—

SB 1033—A bill to be entitled An act relating to possession of controlled substances; adding s. 893.13(1)(h), Florida Statutes; requiring that persons convicted of possession of more than 100 pounds of cannabis be sentenced to and be required to serve a minimum of 3 years' imprisonment; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary-Criminal.

By Senator Don Childers—

SB 1034—A bill to be entitled An act relating to local health units; creating s. 154.065, Florida Statutes, enabling local health units to provide prepaid health care services; creating s. 641.39, Florida Statutes, exempting local health units providing such services from the provisions of part II of

chapter 641, Florida Statutes, relating to health maintenance organizations; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Health and Rehabilitative Services; and Appropriations.

By Senator Jon Thomas—

SB 1035—A bill to be entitled An act relating to automobile no-fault insurance; amending s. 627.736(4), Florida Statutes; removing the requirement that Medicaid benefits be credited against personal injury protection benefits; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Commerce.

By Senator MacKay—

SB 1036—A bill to be entitled An act relating to bingo; amending s. 849.093, Florida Statutes; authorizing certain non-profit and veterans' organizations and licensed public lodging establishments to conduct bingo games, and authorizing the leasing of premises for the conduct of such games, upon issuance of a license or upon filing notification; providing procedures and fees; providing for determination of eligibility of applicants; prohibiting certain activities with regard to the conduct of bingo games and the lease of premises therefor; providing for records and for inspection thereof; providing for suspension of license and investigation by the state attorney; requiring posting of bond; providing penalties; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Commerce; Judiciary-Criminal; and Finance, Taxation and Claims.

By the Committee on Judiciary-Civil—

SB 1037—A bill to be entitled An act relating to elections; creating s. 106.125, Florida Statutes; authorizing statewide candidates and political committees supporting or opposing statewide candidates or issues to obtain and use credit cards; providing terms and conditions for use of such cards; providing for report to Secretary of State; adding s. 106.07(4)(1), Florida Statutes; providing for reporting of credit card purchases to Division of Elections; amending s. 106.14(1), Florida Statutes; providing for payment for goods or services by credit card; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary-Civil.

By Senator Gordon—

SB 1038—A bill to be entitled An act relating to nursing; amending ss. 464.021(2)(a), 464.051(3)(d), Florida Statutes; deleting provisions relating to an advisory committee to the State Board of Nursing; adding s. 464.22(9), (10), Florida Statutes; providing that the rendering of nursing services on a fee-for-services, or the establishment of an independent nursing practice are not prohibited by law; adding s. 409.266(3), Florida Statutes; requiring the Department of Health and Rehabilitative Services to provide the services of a nurse practitioner to certain persons; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Health and Rehabilitative Services; Governmental Operations; and Appropriations.

By the Committee on Judiciary-Civil—

SB 1039—A bill to be entitled An act relating to a jury management and jury selection pilot program; providing for the development of a pilot program to study and evaluate jury management and jury selection techniques; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Judiciary-Civil; and Rules and Calendar.

By Senator W. D. Childers—

SB 1040—A bill to be entitled An act relating to credit unions; amending ss. 657.01(1), 657.04(2), 657.10(1), and 657-

161, Florida Statutes, to eliminate the requirement that loans to members must be for provident and productive purposes and the requirement that members must state such purpose on the loan application; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Commerce.

By Senators W. D. Childers and Tobiassen—

SB 1041—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Division of Recreation and Parks of the Department of Natural Resources; authorizing and directing the division to designate the state recreation area located in Escambia County, Florida, and commonly referred to as the Big Lagoon Recreation Area as the Reubin O'D. Askew Big Lagoon Recreation Area; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Natural Resources and Conservation.

By Senator Plante—

SB 1042—A bill to be entitled An act relating to education; amending ss. 231.29(2)(c), 231.36(3) and (4), and 236.02(3), Florida Statutes, and repealing ss. 231.36(7) and (9) and 231-351, Florida Statutes; prohibiting the granting of continuing contracts to instructional personnel of the public schools; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Education; and Personnel, Retirement and Collective Bargaining.

By Senator Plante—

SB 1043—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Public Employees Relations Commission; amending s. 447.205(6), Florida Statutes, providing that the commission shall only charge the actual cost of reproduction for publications, subscriptions, and copies of records and documents; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Governmental Operations.

By Senator Vogt—

SB 1044—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Environmental Land and Water Management Act; adding s. 380-031(18), Florida Statutes; providing a definition of "electrical transmission line"; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Natural Resources and Conservation.

By Senator Vogt—

SB 1045—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the sale of lands; amending s. 373.089(1), (2), Florida Statutes; providing that water management district governing boards may transfer lands owned by the district to the Board of Trustees of the Internal Improvement Trust Fund; requiring each sale of district lands to be approved by the trustees; requiring proceeds from the sale of such lands be deposited in the state working capital fund unless decided otherwise by the trustees; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Natural Resources and Conservation.

By Senator Sayler—

SB 1046—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Canal Authority Act; amending s. 374.011, Florida Statutes; providing for the principal offices of the Canal Authority of the State of Florida; transferring all funds of the authority to the Department of Natural Resources; providing for the use and distribution of such funds; prohibiting expenditures for certain purposes relating to the project for a canal across the peninsula of Florida; authorizing the sale of any lands acquired for the canal project to the Federal Government; providing for the distribution of proceeds from such sales; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Natural Resources and Conservation; Economic, Community and Consumer Affairs; Commerce; and Appropriations.

By Senator Saylor—

SB 1047—A bill to be entitled An act relating to Pinellas County; making it unlawful to take or attempt to take thread herring, hairy backs, greenbacks, or other sardine-like fish with a purse seine, purse gill net, lampara net, or similar net or device for certain purpose; prohibiting the possession for certain purposes of such fish so taken; providing a penalty; providing a referendum; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Rules and Calendar.

By Senator Saylor—

SB 1048—A bill to be entitled An act relating to a canal across the peninsula of Florida; prohibiting the Canal Authority of the State and the Department of Natural Resources from making certain expenditures relating to such a canal; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Natural Resources and Conservation; Economic, Community and Consumer Affairs; Commerce; and Appropriations.

By Senator Jon Thomas—

SB 1049—A bill to be entitled An act relating to medical assistance for the needy; adding s. 409.266(3), Florida Statutes; providing that third party coverage for medical services shall be primary coverage and shall be exhausted before payments are made under the Medicaid program; providing that a recipient shall inform the Department of Health and Rehabilitative Services of any third party coverage; providing for subrogation, recovery, and settlements; providing for the adoption of rules; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Health and Rehabilitative Services; and Commerce.

By Senator Gordon (by request)—

SB 1050—A bill to be entitled An act relating to taxation; amending s. 196.032, Florida Statutes; providing that each qualified county or municipality is entitled to receive an annual payment from the Local Government Exemption Trust Fund; specifying formula for calculating the amount of the annual payment due each qualified county or municipality; defining a "qualified county or municipality"; requiring the Department of Revenue to authorize payment by a specified date; deleting provisions specifying the manner of payment; deleting provision requiring the reversion to the General Revenue Fund of undistributed money remaining in the Local Government Exemption Trust Fund; amending s. 199.292(4), Florida Statutes; revising the formula for the disposition of the total net intangible taxes collected; requiring each property appraiser to compile certain information and furnish it to the Department of Revenue; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Economic, Community and Consumer Affairs; Finance, Taxation and Claims; and Appropriations.

By Senator Gordon—

SB 1051—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the performance records of surgeons; creating the Surgeons' Performance History Act; requiring that all hospitals and ambulatory surgical centers maintain performance records on surgeons with staff privileges at the respective facilities; prescribing the content of such records; requiring information to be updated at 6 month intervals; requiring such records to be made available upon request; requiring the posting of a notice advising persons of the availability of such records; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Health and Rehabilitative Services; Commerce; and Appropriations.

By Senator Gordon (by request)—

SB 1052—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Department of Revenue; amending s. 195.062(2), Florida Statutes; deleting a requirement that certain information appear in the instruction manual prepared by the department for property appraisers and certain other persons; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Finance, Taxation and Claims; and Commerce.

By Senator Gordon (by request)—

SB 1053—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Department of Revenue; amending s. 20.21(2), Florida Statutes, to restructure the divisions within the department along functional lines; requiring reports; providing a time period for implementation; directing that changes in terminology be made; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Finance, Taxation and Claims; and Governmental Operations.

By Senator Gordon—

SB 1054—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the tax on cigarettes; creating s. 210.027, Florida Statutes, providing a definition; imposing an excise tax or privilege tax upon the sale or use of cigarette papers; providing for the collection, deposit and distribution of the tax; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Finance, Taxation and Claims; and Commerce.

By Senator Gordon (by request)—

SB 1055—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the excise tax on documents; amending s. 201.08(1), Florida Statutes; requiring such tax to be paid only on the initial debt of a mortgage, trust deed, security agreement, or other evidence of indebtedness which secures future advances; requiring such tax to be paid on future advances at the time such advances are made; providing a penalty; amending s. 201.09, Florida Statutes; providing an exemption for a mortgage, trust deed, security agreement, or other evidence of indebtedness which evidences an exempt promissory note; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Finance, Taxation and Claims; and Commerce.

By Senator Poston—

SB 1056—A bill to be entitled An act relating to traffic offenses; amending s. 39.02(1), Florida Statutes; providing that a uniform traffic complaint be filed in circuit court when a case involving a juvenile traffic offense is certified to the court; amending s. 39.11(2)(e), Florida Statutes; providing certain penalties for juvenile traffic offenders; amending s. 316.655(4), Florida Statutes, and adding subsection (5) to said section; providing penalties for certain traffic offenses; providing for suspension of driver's license of person failing to appear in court or failing to comply with sentence of court for certain traffic offenses; adding s. 318.17(7)-(10), Florida Statutes; designating certain traffic offenses as criminal; amending s. 318.19(1), Florida Statutes; increasing the amount of property damage necessary to require a hearing for traffic law infractions; amending s. 322.28(2)(e), Florida Statutes; increasing the maximum time period for which certain temporary driver's permits are valid; amending s. 322.282(2), Florida Statutes; removing the time limit for applications for reinstatement of driving privilege; repealing s. 316.625(2), Florida Statutes, which prohibits driving without a valid license; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Transportation; Health and Rehabilitative Services; and Judiciary-Criminal.

By Senators Poston, Holloway and Renick—

SJR 1057—A joint resolution proposing an amendment to Section 14 of Article VII of the State Constitution relating to general obligation bonds.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Natural Resources and Conservation; Finance, Taxation and Claims; and Rules and Calendar.

By the Committee on Judiciary-Civil—

SB 1058—A bill to be entitled An act relating to campaign financing; amending s. 106.08(2), (4), Florida Statutes; requiring the return of certain campaign contributions; providing a penalty; amending s. 106.11(3), Florida Statutes; prohibiting certain persons from authorizing certain expenses from a primary campaign account without sufficient funds therein; providing a penalty; allowing certain expenses to be incurred under certain circumstances; amending s. 106.25(5), Florida Statutes; prohibiting the Florida Elections Commission from issuing its findings of violations of chapter 106, Florida Statutes, involving two or more persons until a certain time; granting a person being investigated the right to waive the confidentiality of such investigation if the confidentiality has been breached; amending s. 106.26(5), Florida Statutes; prescribing contents of transcripts of hearings; providing that any witness at a hearing by the commission shall be entitled to a certified transcript of all testimony taken at the hearing; repealing s. 106.14(1), Florida Statutes, which requires prior payment for goods and services provided to a candidate or political committee; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary-Civil.

By Senator MacKay—

SB 1059—A bill to be entitled An act relating to insurance; creating s. 627.6057, Florida Statutes, restricting the termination of coverage of a spouse or dependent children in a disability insurance contract; requiring such contracts to entitle a former spouse and dependent children of an insured in the custody of the former spouse to retain coverage upon payment of premium; adding subsection (5) to s. 627.662, Florida Statutes, making such restrictions and requirement applicable to group disability, blanket disability, and franchise disability insurance policies; creating s. 641.345, Florida Statutes, making such restrictions and requirement applicable to health maintenance contracts issued by health maintenance organizations; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Commerce.

By Senator Gordon—

SB 1060—A bill to be entitled An act relating to public health; amending s. 20.19(3)(c), Florida Statutes; adding s. 20.19(1)(j), (4)(h)-(o), (5)(g), Florida Statutes; providing for the establishment of a public health services delivery system; allowing each county to provide such services either through a county health unit or through the district health unit of the Department of Health and Rehabilitative Services; designating the staff director of the Health Program Office of the department as the state health officer; providing definitions; establishing priority programs; providing for the establishment, administration, and duties of district and county health units; requiring each county to contract with the department for the provision of the core public health program; providing for the shared funding of public health programs; authorizing each county to levy taxes for the funding of its share of the public health program; requiring the department to establish a uniform schedule of fees for public health services; providing for the formation of a subcommittee on public health by each district advisory council; repealing ss. 154.01-154.06, Florida Statutes, as amended, relating to county public health units; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Health and Rehabilitative Services; Governmental Operations; and Appropriations.

By Senator Gordon—

SB 1061—A bill to be entitled An act relating to insurance; amending s. 627.419, Florida Statutes, providing that insurance contracts which provide for the payment for procedures which are within the scope of a chiropractor's license shall be construed to include payment to a chiropractor who performs such services; deleting current provisions of law which require certain

insurers to offer optional chiropractic riders on policies; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Commerce.

By Senator Gordon—

SB 1062—A bill to be entitled An act relating to licensed medical practitioners; creating ss. 458.23, 459.23, 460.235, 461.23, Florida Statutes; requiring itemized patient billing by physicians, osteopathic physicians, chiropractic physicians, and podiatrists, for professional services rendered; prohibiting the requirement of prior payment by the patient as a condition of the right to an itemized statement; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Health and Rehabilitative Services; and Commerce.

By Senator Ware (by request)—

SB 1063—A bill to be entitled An act relating to service charges and fees of clerks of court; repealing s. 28.24(10), Florida Statutes, relating to charges for making microfilm copies of public records; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Judiciary-Civil; and Finance, Taxation and Claims.

By Senator Gordon—

SB 1064—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the transient rentals sales tax; amending s. 212.03(4), (7), Florida Statutes; reducing to 6 months the period of time a person must reside in certain rented living quarters before being exempt from the transient rentals sales tax; providing an exemption for certain persons who reside in a condominium for 6 months; providing an exemption for persons who have resided for 6 months or more in such living quarters or who have paid the tax for 6 months upon the effective date of the act, and exempting full-time students enrolled in institutions offering post-secondary education; authorizing the Department of Revenue to reform rental contracts in certain cases; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Finance, Taxation and Claims; and Commerce.

By Senator McClain—

SB 1065—A bill to be entitled An act relating to workmen's compensation; amending s. 440.02(18), Florida Statutes, and adding a subsection; providing for apportionment of certain benefits and prohibiting apportionment of certain benefits; defining permanent impairment; amending s. 440.12(2), Florida Statutes, and adding a new subsection, relating to limits on rate of compensation; amending s. 440.13(3)(b), Florida Statutes, modifying provisions relating to the limitation on the right to certain medical benefits; adding a subsection to s. 440.14, Florida Statutes, providing for determination of average monthly wages; amending s. 440.15, Florida Statutes, providing for temporary disability compensation benefits, permanent impairment benefits, wage-loss benefits and matters related thereto, permanent total disability benefits, subsequent injury benefits, compensation for hernia and limitations thereon, termination of benefits for refusing vocational rehabilitation, procedure with respect to a compensated employee leaving employment or becoming an inmate of a public institution, and procedures with respect to employees who are eligible for workmen's compensation benefits and are also eligible for and receiving social security benefits or unemployment compensation benefits; amending s. 440.19(1)(a), Florida Statutes, relating to time and procedure for filing claims; amending s. 440.20(2), Florida Statutes, and adding new subsections; providing for payment of certain compensation within 14 days after the employer has certain knowledge; providing for certain reporting; amending s. 440.49(1) and paragraphs (b), (c), (e), (f), and (j) of subsection (4), Florida Statutes; removing authority of Division of Labor to expend funds for certain rehabilitation; redefining "permanent physical impairment," "merger," and "excess permanent compensation"; providing a formula for reimbursing the employer or carrier for excess benefits from the Special Disability Trust Fund; repealing the knowledge requirement with respect to such reimbursement; providing for reimbursement from the fund in certain apportionment cases; providing for applicability of substantive provisions based on

date of accident or injury; amending s. 440.50(1)(a), Florida Statutes, removing liability of the Workmen's Compensation Administration Trust Fund for vocational rehabilitation benefits; amending s. 440.51(1)(b), Florida Statutes, to conform; repealing s. 440.151(3), Florida Statutes, which defines terms, "disablement" and "disability"; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Commerce.

By Senators Trask and Peterson—

SB 1066—A bill to be entitled An act relating to municipal service taxing units; renumbering s. 171.042(2), Florida Statutes, and adding a new subsection (2) to said section; providing that prior to annexation of a municipal service taxing unit, certain provisions shall be made by the governing body of the municipality and the governing body of the municipal service taxing unit; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Economic, Community and Consumer Affairs.

By the Committee on Commerce and Senator Scarborough—

SB 1067—A bill to be entitled An act relating to alcoholic beverages; amending s. 561.49, Florida Statutes; providing a tax exemption for sales of alcoholic beverages to military bases; adding s. 561.55(3), Florida Statutes; providing that sales to military bases be considered and reported as export; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Commerce.

By the Committee on Commerce and Senator Scarborough—

SB 1068—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Beverage Law; creating s. 562.132, Florida Statutes; prohibiting certain enumerated sexual acts to be performed or simulated while in or upon licensed premises; prohibiting the exposure of specified parts of the body while upon licensed premises; prohibiting the performance of host or hostess services by a licensee, his agent, or entertainer unless properly clothed; prohibiting the showing of films, pictures and other visual representations of certain parts of the body or sexual acts; prohibiting the use of artificial or inanimate objects to depict certain acts; providing severability; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Commerce.

By the Committee on Commerce and Senator Scarborough—

SB 1069—A bill to be entitled An act relating to alcoholic beverages; adding s. 562.12(3), Florida Statutes; defining the term "bottle club"; prohibiting any person from establishing, keeping, maintaining, or operating an unlicensed bottle club; providing an exception; providing a rule of construction; providing a penalty; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Commerce.

By the Committee on Commerce and Senator Scarborough—
