HB 16—A bill to be entitled An act relating to property assessments; amending s. 193.085(4), Florida Statutes, directing the Department of Revenue to submit county railroad property assessments to the respective county property appraisers not later than a certain date; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Finance, Taxation and Claims.

By the Committee on Regulated Industries & Licensing and Representatives Culbreath and Ryals—

CS for HB 851—A bill to be entitled An act relating to horse-racing; amending s. 550.38(1), Florida Statutes, requiring the permanent standing of a stallion in Florida to be eligible for stallion awards; providing for the death of a stallion; requiring certain records to be maintained by the Florida Thoroughbred

Breeders Association and authorizing certain charges to owners by the association; providing that said section, as amended by chapter 77-167, Laws of Florida, relating to breeder awards for Florida-bred horses, shall not expire on July 1, 1979; providing that the provisions of subsection (4) of s. 550.42, Florida Statutes, 1975, as amended by section 16 of Chapter 77-167, Laws of Florida, and appearing as subsection (3) of s. 550.42, Florida Statutes, 1977, relating to the funding of such awards, shall not expire on July 1, 1979; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Commerce.

By the Committee on Tourism & Economic Development and Representative Bloom—

HB 1991—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Department of Commerce; adding subsection (6) to s. 20.17, Florida Statutes, creating the Central South American and Caribbean Trade and Development Commission; providing for the composition and appointment of the members of the commission; providing for reimbursement for necessary travel expenses and per diem of the members and staff; providing functions of the commission; providing powers and duties thereof; requiring an annual report to the Governor and the Legislature; providing for an executive director by appointment; providing for employees pursuant to state personnel system, and contracts for special services; providing for certain interagency cooperation; providing for an office in the Capitol; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Commerce.
