HB 1645—A bill to be entitled An act relating to usury; amending s. 687.03(2)(a), Florida Statutes, clarifying certain provisions granting exemptions to loans made pursuant to a commitment to guarantee by the Veterans Administration from provisions relating to usurious contracts and unlawful interest rates; deleting the requirement that for certain loans to be exempt they must be made pursuant to the sale of or binding commitment to sell such loans to certain federal instrumentalities; specifying when commitments shall not be exempt; providing an effective date.

HB 187—A bill to be entitled An act relating to industrial savings banks; amending s. 656.18(5), Florida Statutes, relating to the taking of second mortgages on real estate by such banks; providing an effective date.

HB 815—A bill to be entitled An act relating to marriage licenses; amending s. 741.04, Florida Statutes; deleting provisions relating to parental consent for marriage of minors; revising the population limitation with respect to the requirement for posting applications for marriage licenses at the courthouse door; creating s. 741.0405, Florida Statutes; providing conditions for issuance of marriage licenses to persons under 18 years of age; providing an effective date.

HB 1305—A bill to be entitled An act relating to computer crimes; creating chapter 815, Florida Statutes; providing a short title; providing legislative intent; providing definitions; providing for offenses against intellectual property; providing for offenses against computer equipment and supplies; providing for offenses against computer users; providing penalties; providing that provisions of this chapter are not exclusive; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary-Criminal.

By Representatives Hill and Blackburn—

HB 1219—A bill to be entitled An act relating to solar energy; amending s. 377.705(4)(d), Florida Statutes, to re-

quire that solar energy systems manufactured or sold in Florida meet the standards of the Florida Solar Energy Center; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Natural Resources and Conservation; Commerce; and Appropriations.

By the Committee on Appropriations and Representative Smith—

HB 1990—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Department of Offender Rehabilitation; creating s. 944.0265, Florida Statutes, directing the department to make rules requiring prisoners in the correctional system to disclose sources of income and assets while incarcerated and to pay a portion or all of their daily subsistence cost; providing that refusal to disclose such income and assets or false disclosure shall make the prisoner ineligible for parole until the prisoner complies; providing a time limit on the adoption of such rules; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Corrections, Probation and Parole.

I am directed to inform the Senate that the House of Representatives has passed CS for House Bills 691 and 839 and requests the concurrence of the Senate.

By the Committee on Community Affairs and Representative McPherson and others—

CS for HB's 691 and 839—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the financing of new local government duties; providing that any general law requiring municipalities or counties to administer any program or provide any service or facility shall include an economic impact statement estimating total costs, and shall provide a method of financing such program or service; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Economic, Community and Consumer Affairs; Rules and Calendar; and Appropriations.
