The Senate was called to order by Senator Trask for the purpose of conducting the order of business of introduction and reference of resolutions, memorials, bills and joint resolutions pursuant to Rule 4.3. Senator Henderson represented the Committee on Rules and Calendar and the Minority Party.

INTRODUCTION

By Senator Scott—

SB 621—A bill to be entitled An act relating to eminent domain; empowering the Department of Natural Resources with the right of eminent domain for public park and recreational uses or purposes; amending s. 74.011, Florida Statutes, 1978 Supplement; providing for proceedings supplemental to eminent domain; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Judiciary-Civil, Natural Resources and Conservation and Governmental Operations.

By Senator Jenne—

SB 622—A bill to be entitled An act relating to state banks and trust companies; amending s. 659.11(2), Florida Statutes; requiring not less than 50 percent of the directors of a state bank or trust company to be United States citizens; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Commerce.

SR 623 was introduced and adopted on April 5.

By Senator MacKay—

SB 624—A bill to be entitled An act relating to unemployment compensation; amending s. 443.08(3)(a), (e), Florida Statutes, 1978 Supplement; providing that an employment record shall be charged if the eligible individual was paid in excess of a specified amount within the base period; prohibiting an employer's contribution rate from being rounded to less than one-tenth of one percent; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Commerce.

By Senator MacKay—

SB 625—A bill to be entitled An act relating to insurance; amending s. 625.121(4), (5), (6), (7)(b) and (9), Florida Statutes; increasing the percentage interest allowable with respect to the valuation of life insurance contracts; providing that the commissioners' reserve valuation method of the Standard Valuation Law shall apply to certain insurance contracts; providing a new formula for the computation of deficiency reserves; amending s. 627.476(1) and (8), Florida Statutes; providing that the standard nonforfeiture law shall be renamed the standard nonforfeiture law for life insurance; increasing the interest rate allowable under such law; providing for conditional repeal; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Commerce.

SB 626—A bill to be entitled An act relating to insurance; amending ss. 631.271, 631.60(2), Florida Statutes; prescribing

priorities of distribution upon liquidation of certain insurers; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Commerce.

By Senator Peterson—

SB 627—A bill to be entitled An act relating to education; amending s. 236.081(1)(c), Florida Statutes, 1978 Supplement; providing cost factors for certain educational programs for fiscal years 1979-1980 and 1980-1981; amending s. 236.013(2)(c), Florida Statutes; defining the term "full-time equivalent student;" providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Education and Ways and Means.

By Senator Grizzle—

SB 628—A bill to be entitled An act relating to vocational rehabilitation; amending s. 20.15(2)(a), Florida Statutes; creating a Division of Vocational Rehabilitation within the Department of Education and transferring the powers and duties of the Department of Health and Rehabilitative Services relating to vocational rehabilitation under parts II and III of chapter 413, Florida Statutes, to the division; amending ss. 413.20(1), 413.47(1), 413.49(2), 413.501(1), 413.602(1) and (2), 413.603, and 413.605(1) and (2), Florida Statutes, to conform to this act; repealing s. 322 of chapter 77-147, Laws of Florida, and reenacting and amending s. 413.45, Florida Statutes, 1975, relating to reports by the division; directing that changes in terminology in the Florida Statutes be made; repealing s. 20.19(3)(c)2.e., Florida Statutes, abolishing the Vocational Rehabilitation Program Office of the Department of Health and Rehabilitative Services; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Health and Rehabilitative Services, Education and Ways and Means.

By Senator Henderson—

SB 629—A bill to be entitled An act relating to Lee County and Charlotte County; creating the Gasparilla Island Historic and Conservation District; prescribing restrictions on density, land use, and structures; declaring the district a wildlife sanctuary; creating a review board and providing membership, terms, powers, and duties thereof; prescribing procedures for the election of such members; requiring the review board to prepare a plan for the district; providing for the adoption of rules; requiring approval of the review board for certain projects; providing penalties; providing for the classification of areas, buildings, structures, and objects as historic or conservation; providing for judicial relief; prescribing rules of construction; requiring recording of the act; providing for election of the initial members of the review board; providing for a referendum; providing an effective date.

SB 630—A bill to be entitled An act relating to investments; adding s. 215.47(1)(i), Florida Statutes; authorizing the investment of certain state funds in obligations of the Federal Farm

Credit Banks and obligations of the Federal Home Loan Bank; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Governmental Operations.

By Senator Myers—

SB 631—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Florida Public Service Commission; amending s. 350.06(3), Florida Statutes; removing the limitation on salaries paid to official reporters of the commission; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Economic, Community and Consumer Affairs; Commerce; and Ways and Means.

By Senator Myers—

SB 632—A bill to be entitled An act relating to motor carriers; amending s. 323.31(2), Florida Statutes, 1978 Supplement; requiring the Florida Public Service Commission to give notice to all transportation brokers within the county to be served by an applicant for a transportation broker license or by an applicant for assignment of such license; providing for the issuance or assignment of such license without public hearing in the absence of any objection or protest; prescribing procedure for filing such objections or protests and requiring a fee therefor; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Economic, Community and Consumer Affairs; and Commerce.

By Senator Myers—

SB 633—A bill to be entitled An act relating to motor carriers; creating s. 323.081, Florida Statutes; prohibiting the imposition of any charge in excess of a specified percent over any estimate or bid made to a customer by a motor carrier for transportation of household goods; requiring the customer copy of any invoice, bid, or other shipping document to reflect such restriction; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Economic, Community and Consumer Affairs; and Commerce.

By Senator Myers—

SB 634—A bill to be entitled An act relating to motor carriers; amending s. 323.29(1), Florida Statutes; exempting from the requirements of chapter 323, Florida Statutes, persons operating motor vehicles wholly within the corporate limits of any municipality and the adjoining suburban territory where such business of carriage is licensed or regulated by the legislative body of such municipality; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Economic, Community and Consumer Affairs; and Commerce.

By Senator Myers—

SB 635—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Florida Public Service Commission; amending s. 350.58, Florida Statutes; providing the commission with an alternative to making annual reports to the Governor; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Economic, Community and Consumer Affairs; and Commerce.

By Senator Myers—

SB 636—A bill to be entitled An act relating to motor carriers; adding s. 323.28(8), Florida Statutes; authorizing the Florida Public Service Commission to suspend or cancel certain certificates of registration for failure to respond to citation or notice issued by the Florida Public Service Commission; providing for service of notice of such suspension or cancellation; providing for revocation of such suspension or cancellation without public hearing; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Economic, Community and Consumer Affairs; and Commerce.

By Senator Myers—

SB 637—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the employment of personnel by the Florida Public Service Commission; adding s. 367.171(3), Florida Statutes; authorizing the Department of Administration to approve the employment of additional personnel required by the Florida Public Service Commission as a result of any additional county declaring such county to be subject to the provisions of chapter 367, Florida Statutes, relating to the regulation of water and sewer systems; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Economic, Community and Consumer Affairs; Commerce; and Ways and Means.

By Senator Myers—

SB 638—A bill to be entitled An act relating to pupil assignment by school boards; amending s. 230.232(3), Florida Statutes, 1978 Supplement; providing for a prompt and fair hearing in accordance with the rules and regulations of a school board for a parent or guardian whose child's application for enrollment in any public school within the district in which such child resides is denied; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Education.

By Senator Frank—

SB 639—A bill to be entitled An act relating to cruelty to animals; creating s. 828.1215, Florida Statutes; prohibiting the use of any live animal to train greyhounds, or any dead animal killed for the purpose of training greyhounds; providing that the act shall not prohibit training greyhounds by a method in which greyhounds compete against dogs in a contest of speed as long as no other animals are used; providing a penalty; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Judiciary-Criminal and Commerce.

By Senator Johnston—

SB 640—A bill to be entitled An act relating to taxation; amending s. 199.052(7)(c), Florida Statutes, and adding s. 201.08(4), Florida Statutes; providing that the intangible personal property tax and the excise tax on documents do not apply to the assumption of a mortgage agreement under certain circumstances; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Commerce and Ways and Means.

SB 641—A bill to be entitled An act relating to cable television; removing authority of counties and municipalities to regulate rates for cable television service; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Economic, Community and Consumer Affairs.

SB 642—A bill to be entitled An act relating to life and disability insurance agents; creating s. 626.3411, Florida Statutes; providing continuing education requirements for all life and disability insurance agents; providing for license suspension or revocation for noncompliance; amending ss. 626.792(1) and 626.835(1), Florida Statutes; providing for the applicability of such education requirements to nonresident agents; providing for conditional repeal; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Commerce and Ways and Means.

By Senator Myers—

SB 643—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Florida Public Service Commission; amending s. 350.06(8), Florida Stat-

utes; authorizing the clerk of the commission to publish and sell a weekly summary of orders; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Economic, Community and Consumer Affairs; Commerce; and Ways and Means.

By Senator Neal—

SB 644—A bill to be entitled An act relating to Cedar Hammock Fire Control District, Manatee County; amending subsection (1) of section 4, chapter 57-1546, Laws of Florida, as amended; increasing the maximum amount of special assessments which may be levied upon specified categories of property; providing that fees may be charged for emergency services rendered with respect to motor vehicles; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Rules and Calendar.

By Senators MacKay and Skinner—

SB 645—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the J. Hillis Miller Health Center; amending s. 241.471, Florida Statutes; providing for the organization of the J. Hillis Miller Health Center; authorizing the State Board of Education to lease the Shands Teaching Hospital and Clinics to a nonprofit corporation organized solely for certain specified purposes; specifying the contents of the lease or agreement between the board and the nonprofit corporation; providing conditions under which the State Board of Education may increase, remodel, or renovate the hospital facilities; transferring funds appropriated and accumulated trust funds from the Shands Teaching Hospital and Clinics to the J. Hillis Miller Health Center; providing an appropriation; repealing ss. 241.096, 241.097, Florida Statutes, relating to the establishment of the Schools of Dentistry and Veterinary Medicine at the University of Florida; repealing chapter 78-314, Laws of Florida, authorizing the establishment of a capital construction trust fund by the Shands Teaching Hospital; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Governmental Operations, Education, and Ways and Means.

By Senator Johnston (by request)—

SB 646—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the registration of public employee labor organizations; amending s. 447.02(1), Florida Statutes; clarifying the definition of the term "labor organization"; amending s. 447.305, Florida Statutes; revising certain procedures and requirements for the registration of public employee labor organizations; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to Ways and Means Subcommittee E and the Committee on Ways and Means.

By Senator Tobiassen—

SB 647—A bill to be entitled An act relating to sheriffs' offices; requiring each sheriff's office to establish and administer a Youth Aid Division for the purpose of handling missing persons under 18 years of age and rendering assistance to runaways under 18 years of age; providing that each sheriff's office cooperate with any local authority or organization which renders assistance to minors or runaway youths; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Economic, Community and Consumer Affairs.

By Senator Tobiassen—

SB 648—A bill to be entitled An act relating to pawnbrokers; creating s. 715.041, Florida Statutes; requiring pawnbrokers to maintain a record of the identification of any person from whom they receive property, and, upon request, to provide this information to any law enforcement agency or officer thereof; providing for the recovery by the lawful owner of stolen property possessed by a pawnbroker; providing for restitution to

the pawnbroker under certain circumstances; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Commerce.

By Senator Tobiassen—

SB 649—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the intangible personal property tax; repealing ss. 192.001(11)(b), 192.042(4), 193.114(4), Florida Statutes, s. 192.032(4), Florida Statutes, as amended, and chapter 199, Florida Statutes; repealing the intangible personal property tax; amending s. 20.21(4), Florida Statutes, 1978 Supplement, and s. 192.091(5), Florida Statutes; deleting references to the tax; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to Ways and Means Subcommittee D and the Committee on Ways and Means.

By Senator Skinner—

SB 650—A bill to be entitled An act relating to fertilizer; adding new subsections (3) and (4) to s. 576.011, Florida Statutes, providing definitions; creating s. 576.055, Florida Statutes, authorizing the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services to require facilities manufacturing bulk mixed fertilizer to adopt certain procedures to avoid coning of fertilizer; amending s. 576.061(3)(c), Florida Statutes, changing the procedure and the time period in which a fertilizer manufacturer, dealer, or agent must pay any penalties to a consumer following an analysis of fertilizer; providing an effective date.

SB 651—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Division of Forestry; adding a paragraph to s. 590.02(1), Florida Statutes; providing for rulemaking authority in the area of forest protection; providing an effective date.

SB 652—A bill to be entitled An act relating to forest protection; amending s. 590.02(4)(a), Florida Statutes, authorizing the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services to purchase a schedule position bond to cover special forest officers; providing an effective date.

SB 653—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Auditor General; creating s. 220.25, Florida Statutes; requiring the Department of Revenue to make certain information relating to the Income Tax Code available to the Auditor General or his agent; providing for applicability of confidentiality requirements and penalties; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Rules and Calendar.

SB 654—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Auditor General; amending s. 214.21(1), Florida Statutes, and adding subsection (4) to said section; requiring the Department of Revenue to make certain information relating to the administration of certain designated nonproperty taxes available to the Auditor General or his agent; providing for applicability of confidentiality requirements and penalties; providing an effective date.

SB 657—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the tax on the lease or rental of real property; adding s. 212.031(7), Florida Statutes, 1978 Supplement; exempting certain leases of space by fairs from the tax; providing an effective date.

SB 658—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Beverage Law; amending s. 561.20(2)(a), Florida Statutes, 1978 Supplement; providing for issuance of a special license to a restaurant having a specified service area, whether such service area is covered or uncovered; providing an effective date.

SB 659—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Department of Health and Rehabilitative Services; prohibiting the department from adopting certain plumbing fixture requirements; providing an effective date.

SB 660—A bill to be entitled An act relating to negligence; amending s. 768.28(13), Florida Statutes; authorizing state agencies and subdivisions insuring against homogeneous risks to obtain protection jointly; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Governmental Operations and Ways and Means.

By Senator Vogt—

SB 661—A bill to be entitled An act relating to saltwater fishing; amending s. 370.08(2), Florida Statutes, 1978 Supplement; prohibiting any person from attaching any of certain kinds of nets to any state turnpike bridge, toll bridge, primary road bridge, or associated structure over any salt water; providing restriction on the use of such nets; providing a penalty; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Natural Resources and Conservation.

SB 662—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Florida Transportation Code; amending s. 339.27(1), Florida Statutes; authorizing the Department of Transportation to conduct certain investigations relative to the safety of fishing from any state-owned bridge or appurtenant structure; requiring the department to conduct such investigations if requested by the executive director of either the Department of Natural Re-

sources or the Game and Fresh Water Fish Commission; requiring the department to post appropriate signs; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Transportation.

SB 663—A bill to be entitled An act relating to insurance; amending and renumbering s. 627.7375, Florida Statutes, 1978 Supplement, which provides a penalty for furnishing false and fraudulent statements in support of claims, to specify that such provisions apply to the furnishing of statements to any insurance company, including, but not limited to, any motor vehicle, life, disability, credit life, credit, casualty, workmen's compensation, surety, title, premium finance, reinsurance, fraternal benefit, home or automobile warranty insurer; revising cross references; amending s. 626.989(1) and (3), Florida Statutes, 1978 Supplement; conforming cross references; providing an effective date.

SB 664—A bill to be entitled An act relating to insurance; adding s. 624.424(9), Florida Statutes; providing that an officer, director, or other person falsifying the financial statement of an insurer is guilty of a felony of the third degree; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Commerce and Judiciary-Criminal.

By Senator Hill—

SB 665—A bill to be entitled An act relating to negligence; amending s. 768.28(2), Florida Statutes; amending the definition of "state agencies or subdivisions" to include medical schools affiliated with the state, counties, municipalities, and certain corporations; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Governmental Operations and Ways and Means.

By Senator Henderson—

SB 666—A bill to be entitled An act relating to saltwater fishing; prohibiting the use of certain traps in fishing for saltwater finfish; prohibiting the possession of any such trap or the taking, sale, or offer for sale of any saltwater finfish caught by any such trap; providing that any vessel, vehicle, or equipment used in violation, and any fish caught by use of such trap, shall be seized and may be forfeited; providing a penalty; providing an effective date.

SB 667—A bill to be entitled An act relating to distress for rent; amending s. 83.11, Florida Statutes; providing for the filing of an affidavit in support of an action for a distress writ; amending s. 83.12, Florida Statutes; providing that a judge of any competent court may issue a distress writ if such affidavit is filed; providing that a clerk of that court may issue such writ under certain circumstances; providing for the content of the writ; creating s. 83.135, Florida Statutes; providing for an immediate hearing by a certain time on motion of the defendant; providing an effective date.

SB 668—A bill to be entitled An act relating to Okeechobee County and the City of Okeechobee; creating a consolidation plan for Okeechobee County; consolidating governments in the county into a single government; prescribing boundaries; prescribing powers and duties; prescribing rules of construction; providing for the creation of a general service district and for

the creation, expansion, or merger of urban service districts; prescribing services provided in such districts; providing for review of such districts; prescribing the composition, qualifications, terms, compensation, powers, duties, and procedures of the commission of the consolidated government; providing for filling of vacancies; providing for appointment, compensation, and removal of an administrator; prescribing powers and duties of the administrator; prescribing procedures for election of officers; prescribing procedures for amendment of the consolidation plan and for initiative, referendum, and recall; providing for assumption of certain indebtedness by the consolidated government; providing for the disposition of certain deficits and surpluses; prescribing procedures for issuance of bonds; providing for a budget; authorizing the use of enterprise accounts; limiting millage; providing for referendum on millage in excess of such limits; providing for administration and personnel; transferring fiscal functions of the clerk of circuit court to the consolidated government; providing for an administrative code; authorizing the creation of administrative and advisory boards; providing for transition; providing for a referendum; providing an effective date.
