SCR 1044—A resolution recognizing the national honors received by the Florida chapters of the Phi Theta Kappa Fraternity as a result of their high academic achievement in community and junior colleges and extensive support of their institutions and communities through outstanding projects benefiting thousands of Florida citizens.

Statutes; providing law enforcement officer qualifications; amending ss. 943.14, 943.15, 943.17, 943.18, Florida Statutes; specifying the relationship between the commission and the department; providing that studies and reports relating to compensation and benefits of police officers shall be made to the Governor; amending s. 943.19, Florida Statutes; providing a saving clause; amending s. 943.20, Florida Statutes; providing for hiring and promotional standards; creating s. 943.145, Florida Statutes; providing for certification and decertification of law enforcement officers; amending s. 943.22, Florida Statutes; providing salary incentives for law enforcement officers; amending s. 943.23, Florida Statutes; providing that notices of employment, appointment, or termination of employment of law enforcement officers shall be made to the department; amending s. 943.25, Florida Statutes; specifying the relationship between the department and the commission; providing restrictions on use of certain trust funds; conforming to changes in federal law; providing for retention of existing rules; providing an appropriation; providing an effective date.

SB 1050—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Joint Administrative Procedures Committee; amending s. 11.60(2), Florida Statutes; directing the committee to review administrative rules and request the repeal or modification of certain rules; authorizing the committee to issue a subpoena or subpoena duces tecum under certain conditions; amending s. 120.545(1), Florida Statutes; specifying additional purposes for which the committee is to examine proposed and existing rules; amending s. 120.55(1), Florida Statutes; deleting provisions which direct the Department of State to conduct a study of rules and remove certain rules from the Florida Administrative Code; providing an effective date.

SB 1051—A bill to be entitled An act relating to homeopathic practice; providing intent; providing definitions; providing for applicability; providing for a Board of Homeopathic Examiners; providing membership and terms of the board; providing licensure requirements and eligibility requirements for examination; providing for issuance of license by endorsement; providing disciplinary actions and penalties and specific grounds therefor; prohibiting sexual misconduct; requiring homeopathic organizations to provide certain notification of disciplinary actions taken against homeopathic physicians; providing criminal penalties; providing for the renewal of licenses; providing for inactive status; providing for registration of homeopathic schools; providing for repeal of the Homeopathic Board of

Examiners and legislative review in accordance with the Sun-down Act; providing an effective date.

SB 1052—A bill to be entitled An act relating to electrical transmission line siting; creating s. 403.520-403.535, Florida Statutes, providing a short title; creating s. 403.522, providing intent; providing definitions; prescribing powers and duties of the Department of Environmental Regulation; providing for a fee for each application for site certification and for each application for modification of certification; providing for applicability; directing the department to request the Division of Administrative Hearings to designate a hearing officer within 7 days after receipt of an application; prescribing procedures for processing applications; directing the department to provide copies of each application to certain agencies; directing the department to prepare a report as to the environmental impact of each proposed transmission line or corridor; requiring reports on various impacts of each proposed transmission line or corridor to be prepared by the Department of Natural Resources, the Department of Community Affairs, the Game and Fresh Water Fish Commission, and appropriate water management districts; providing for certification hearings; providing for notice; prescribing procedures for hearings; providing criteria for parties to proceedings; providing for powers and duties of the hearing officer; providing for alteration of time limits; requiring the Governor and Cabinet, sitting as the siting board, to dispose of each application within a certain time; providing that such disposition shall be final administrative action; preempting the certification of transmission lines and transmission line corridors to the state; authorizing the siting board to adopt rules; providing that certification shall constitute the sole license as to the state and any agency as to the approval of transmission lines and corridors; prescribing conditions for revocation or suspension of certification; requiring compliance with Part II of chapter 403, Florida Statutes; providing penalties; providing for amendment to an application; providing for modification of certification; providing that certification is admissible as evidence of public need and necessity in eminent domain proceedings; creating s. 366.14, Florida Statutes; directing the Public Service Commission to schedule a public hearing to determine the need for a transmission line under certain circumstances; prescribing powers and duties of the commission relative to such determinations of need; providing for the adoption of rules; providing an effective date.

SB 1064—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Tampa Port Authority; amending section 4, chapter 23338, Laws of Florida, 1945, as amended; deleting references to the President's Round Table; deleting requirement for the President's Round Table to submit names to the Governor for consideration for appointments to the authority board; requiring the affirmative vote of three members of the authority for certain expenditures or for the incurring of indebtedness in excess of a specified amount and for the establishment of policy governing the expenditure of funds by the Port Manager and his staff; providing an effective date.

SB 1076—A bill to be entitled An act relating to personnel of the district school system; creating ss. 231.545 and 231.555, Florida Statutes, to establish the Education Standards Commission and the Education Practices Commission within the Department of Education; providing membership and duties relating to the development of standards and practices of teaching and the revocation, suspension, and discipline of teachers and administrators; providing duties of the Department of Education and the Division of Administrative Hearings of the Department of Administration relating to investigation and hearing of complaints; providing penalties for violations of standards and rules; providing for financing of the commissions and removal of members therefrom; amending ss. 231.17(6), 231.28, 231.36(2), 231.608, and 231.611, Florida Statutes, to conform and to delete obsolete language; providing for transfer of pending cases, records, and other material; repealing ss. 231.10, 231.54, 231.57, 231.58, 231.59, and 231.604, Florida Statutes, relating to the Florida Council on Teacher Education, the Professional Practices Council, and the State Council for Teacher Education Centers; providing for conditional repeal, and repeal and leg-

SB 1077—A bill to be entitled An act relating to parking within the Capitol Center; amending s. 272.16(1), Florida Statutes, and adding a subsection thereto; authorizing the Department of General Services to assign parking spaces in the Capitol Center area to state agencies; deleting the requirement that the total number of reserved spaces in such area be no more than 60 percent of the spaces available; requiring the adoption of rules; amending s. 272.161, Florida Statutes; authorizing the department to rent parking spaces to providers of certain services and to state agencies; deleting the requirement that parking spaces for which a request for reserved parking has not been made continue to be made available to state employees; providing for payment of parking fees through agencies other than the department; deleting the requirement that the collection of parking fees be prorated in certain circumstances; requiring the deposit of parking fees in the Supervision Trust Fund of the department; requiring the department to establish parking fees on all state-owned reserved parking spaces under its jurisdiction; deleting the requirement that such fees be uniformly applicable; deleting the requirement that the total number of reserved spaces under the jurisdiction of the department not exceed 60 percent of the spaces available; abolishing the Capitol Center Parking Trust Fund; transferring the balance and obligations of such fund to the Supervision Trust Fund of the department; providing effective dates.

SJR 1078—A joint resolution proposing an amendment to Section 7 of Article X of the State Constitution relating to lotteries.

By Senator Steinberg—

SB 1081—A bill to be entitled An act relating to education; creating s. 229.61, Florida Statutes, requiring the Commissioner of Education to assure that foods prepared at public educational facilities meet kosher dietary requirements; requiring consultation with Biblical and rabbinic scholars; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Education and Ways and Means.

By Senator Chamberlin—

SJR 1082—A joint resolution proposing an amendment to Section 6 of Article VII of the State Constitution relating to homestead exemption.

SB 1083—A bill to be entitled An act relating to health and rehabilitative services; creating s. 402.38, Florida Statutes, requiring the Department of Health and Rehabilitative Services to provide patients and residents of its institutions and facilities who are observers of kosher diet commandments with a kosher diet; requiring the department to plan diets for all its patients and residents in accordance with Biblical law; providing an effective date.

SB 1084—A bill to be entitled An act relating to condominiums; adding subsection (5) to s. 718.402, Florida Statutes; requiring the return of certain security deposits with respect to conversions to condominiums under certain circumstances; providing an effective date.

SB 1087—A bill to be entitled An act relating to public records; adding paragraph (1) to s. 119.07(3), Florida Statutes, providing that certain files maintained by attorneys representing public agencies are exempt from disclosure provisions of the public records law; providing an effective date.

SB 1088—A bill to be entitled An act relating to public records; adding a paragraph to s. 119.07(3), Florida Statutes, providing that certain employee, personnel, medical, disciplinary, and grievance records are exempt from disclosure provisions of the public record law; providing an effective date.

SB 1089—A bill to be entitled An act relating to consumer protection; amending s. 501.021(2), Florida Statutes, redefining the term "home solicitation sale"; providing an effective date.
