HB 152—A bill to be entitled An act relating to cruelty to animals; amending s. 828.13, Florida Statutes; prohibiting certain willful abandonment of animals; providing a penalty; providing an effective date.

CS for HB 275—A bill to be entitled An act relating to tax administration; creating s. 197.387, Florida Statutes, providing for conveyance of Murphy Act lands under certain circumstances; providing an effective date.

By the Committee on Governmental Operations—

HB 1556—A bill to be entitled An act relating to energy conservation in state-owned buildings; amending s. 255.252(3), Florida Statutes; providing that it shall be state policy to retrofit existing state-owned buildings to accomplish energy conservation; providing an effective date.

HB 1090—A bill to be entitled An act relating to environmental control; adding subsection (10) to s. 403.182, Florida Statutes; authorizing the Department of Environmental Regulation to allow counties and municipalities to regulate independently the construction of certain water distribution mains and sewage collection laterals; providing for reports to the department; amending s. 403.805, Florida Statutes, relating to the powers of the secretary of the Department of Environmental Regulation; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Natural Resources and Conservation; and Economic, Community and Consumer Affairs.

HB 79—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the tax on sales, use, and other transactions; amending s. 125.0165, Florida Statutes, expanding the present permissible uses of the discretionary 1 percent sales tax which may be adopted in certain counties for rapid transit to explicitly include related costs of expressways and bus systems; amending s. 212.055, Florida Statutes, to incorporate the amendment to s. 125.0165 in a reference thereto; providing for the distribution of tax receipts; authorizing the Department of Revenue to employ persons and incur expenses; providing for future repeal; providing an effective date.

CS for HB 1422—A bill to be entitled An act relating to land and water management; adding subsection (19) to s. 380.031, Florida Statutes, defining the term "downtown development authority"; amending s. 380.032(2), Florida Statutes, providing for review of rules adopted by the state land planning agency; amending s. 380.06, Florida Statutes, substantially revising Florida law concerning developments of regional impact in an effort to incorporate certain administrative procedures into the law; providing for legislative review of certain rules; providing procedures with respect to developments of regional impact; requiring developers to submit certain reports; repealing s. 380.10, Florida Statutes, relating to the adoption of standards and guidelines by the Administration Commission, since, under the act, this function is now assumed by the Legislature; providing an effective date.

HM 1045—A memorial to the Congress of the United States, urging Congress to ensure that the Federal Government reimburses each state for all costs incurred with respect to implementing new programs or providing increased levels of service under existing programs.

HB 1315—A bill to be entitled An act relating to insurance; amending s. 627.4132, Florida Statutes, eliminating the prohibition against the stacking of coverages with respect to uninsured motorist insurance coverage; providing an effective date.

HB 540—A bill to be entitled An act relating to public schools; amending s. 233.062, Florida Statutes; providing for a daily school period of silent prayer or meditation; providing an effective date.

HB 952—A bill to be entitled An act relating to enucleation of eyes; amending s. 732.919, Florida Statutes, to include a licensed funeral director who has completed a course in eye enucleation from described schools; providing an effective date.

CS for HB 724—A bill to be entitled An act relating to parking for disabled persons; amending s. 316.1955(4), Florida Statutes, providing that signs posted to designate handicapped parking spaces be permanent; amending s. 316.1956(2), Florida Statutes, providing that handicapped parking spaces provided by nongovernmental entities shall be posted and maintained with a permanent sign; amending s. 320.0848(1), Florida Statutes; removing the residency requirement for persons qualified for exemption entitlement parking permits; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Transportation.

By Representative Mills—

HB 893—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the physically handicapped; amending s. 286.26, Florida Statutes, providing that current provisions of law concerning accessibility of public meetings to the handicapped shall not be construed to permit the use of human physical assistance in lieu of mechanical devices; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Economic, Community and Consumer Affairs.

By Representatives Fontana and Kershaw—

HB 1333—A bill to be entitled An act relating to dogracing and horseracing; creating s. 550.245, Florida Statutes, to prohibit the use of medication and drugs on race animals except as provided by rule of the Division of Pari-mutuel Wagering of the Department of Business Regulation; delineating the Florida Pari-mutuel Commission's power to recommend rules to the division relating to use of medication and drugs; setting out guidelines with respect to rules; creating s. 550.101, Florida Statutes, to provide for summary suspensions and hearing rights of occupational licensees responsible for medication and drug rule violations; amending s. 550.24, Florida Statutes, prohibiting the attempt or conspiracy to affect the outcome of a race through illegal administration of medication or drugs to a race animal; providing a penalty; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Commerce.

CS for HB 412—A bill to be entitled An act relating to traffic infractions; amending s. 318.18(3), F.S., providing additional fines for those persons convicted for certain speeding violations; prohibiting waiver of the additional fines; amending s. 34.194(4) and s. 316.660, F.S., providing distribution of additional fines; providing an effective date.
