INTRODUCTION

By Senator Holloway—

SB 864—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the State Road Arbitration Board; amending s. 337.32(3), Florida Statutes; granting the board jurisdiction to hear matters concerning \$100,000 or less; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Transportation.

By Senators Holloway and Hill—

SB 865—A bill to be entitled An act relating to apprentices; amending s. 446.101, Florida Statutes; removing certain contract requirements relating to labor standards for ratios of apprentices or trainees to journeymen in state, local, and municipal contracts for work or services in excess of \$25,000; removing the requirement that a contractor make application to the Bureau of Apprenticeship for a certification of his diligent efforts to employ the requisite ratio of apprentices to journeymen and removing provisions relating to the revocation of such certificate; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Commerce.

SB 866—A bill to be entitled An act relating to hospitals; amending s. 395.20(1), Florida Statutes, and adding a new subsection (3) thereto; providing requirements with respect to itemized patient billing; requiring itemized daily expenses in patients' daily progress charts; providing an effective date.

SB 867—A bill to be entitled An act relating to exemptions from ad valorem taxation; adding s. 196.012(13), (14), Florida Statutes; providing definitions; creating s. 196.1995, Florida Statutes; providing for referendum to authorize the governing board of a county or municipality to exempt from certain ad valorem taxation certain property of a new business or of an expansion of an existing business; providing for application for exemption; specifying duties of property appraisers; adding s. 193.085(5), Florida Statutes, as amended; providing for separate assessment of certain property; adding s. 195.073(4), Florida Statutes, as amended; providing for adoption of rules; renumbering s. 195.097(4) and adding a new subsection (4) to said section; specifying duties of the Department of Revenue; providing an effective date.

SB 873—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the practice of public accounting; amending s. 473.307, Florida Statutes; prescribing qualifications for licensure as a certified public accountant; providing that the experience requirement

for becoming licensed as a certified public accountant may be satisfied by employment in certain positions with units of federal, state or local government; providing an effective date.

SB 874—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Department of Natural Resources; amending s. 370.021(7), Florida Statutes; directing the department to retain certain records; authorizing the department to dispose of such records under certain conditions; providing that certain reproductions of such records be admissible in evidence as originals; authorizing the department to furnish certified copies of records for a fee to be deposited in the Motorboat Revolving Trust Fund; providing an effective date.

SB 884—A bill to be entitled An act relating to Medicaid fraud control; creating s. 11.55, Florida Statutes; authorizing the Auditor General to conduct a statewide program of Medicaid fraud control; authorizing the Auditor General to enter premises, examine records, investigate alleged patient abuse, and investigate alleged misappropriation of patients' funds; specifying duties of Department of Health and Rehabilitative Services; authorizing the Auditor General to subpoena witnesses and materials; requiring certain violations to be referred to the state attorney; providing an appropriation; providing an effective date.

SB 896—A bill to be entitled An act relating to social welfare programs; creating part X of chapter 23, Florida Statutes; establishing the legislative policy that all able-bodied adults participate in a work program as a condition to their receipt of assistance from the aid to families with dependent children program and the food stamp program; requiring the Department of Health and Rehabilitative Services and the Department of Labor and Employment Security work to overcome federal government obstacles to such a work program; providing that the departments make use of certain federal government programs; providing for the cooperation of state employees; providing for reports; providing an effective date.

SB 897—A bill to be entitled An act relating to marine fisheries; creating s. 370.059, Florida Statutes; creating the Marine Fisheries Resources Conservation and Management Trust Fund; providing for the uses and administration of such fund; amending s. 370.06, Florida Statutes; defining "commercial fisherman"; requiring such fishermen to pay a license tax; providing that certain fees and fines be deposited in the fund; prohibiting any seafood dealer from buying or offering to buy any catch from any commercial fisherman who does not hold a valid license; providing penalties; amending s. 370.07 (4)(a), Florida Statutes; providing for the revocation of the license of a seafood dealer under certain circumstances; providing an effective date.

By Senator Henderson—

SB 899—A bill to be entitled An act relating to county government; amending s. 125.56(2), Florida Statutes; providing that charter counties may by ordinance establish building code fee schedules with limitations different than those provided by law; providing an effective date.

SB 902—A bill to be entitled An act relating to postsecondary education; adding paragraph (m) to s. 240.209(3), Florida Statutes; amending s. 240.349, Florida Statutes; directing the Board of Regents and each board of trustees of each community college to adopt rules allowing older persons to attend certain courses without paying certain fees; providing that this privilege be limited to admission on a space available basis under certain circumstances; providing priority in admission to state university courses for certain other persons; providing an effective date.

By Senators Jenne and Scott—

SB 903—A bill to be entitled An act relating to sale of liquid fuels; amending s. 526.06, Florida Statutes; authorizing the sale at retail service stations of alcohol blended fuels meeting certain specifications for a designated period; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Commerce.

By the Committee on Transportation—

SB 904—A bill to be entitled An act relating to railroads; amending s. 338.21(2), Florida Statutes; providing that annual maintenance costs of railway-highway crossing signals are the responsibility of the railroad companies and certain public authorities; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Transportation, Commerce and Ways and Means.

By Senator Henderson—

SB 905—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Beverage Law; adding subsections (12) and (13) to s. 561.01, Florida Statutes, defining the terms "special airport license" and "airport terminal"; amending s. 561.20(2)(a), Florida Statutes, and adding paragraph (f) thereto, exempting certain alcoholic beverage vendors operating in airports publicly owned or leased by a county or municipality from the quota alcoholic beverage license limitations; providing for the issuance of "special airport licenses"; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Commerce and Ways and Means.

By Senator Maxwell—

SB 906—A bill to be entitled An act relating to witnesses; amending s. 92.142, Florida Statutes, increasing the mileage compensation for witnesses from 6 to 14 cents per mile; providing that certain subpoenaed witnesses residing outside Florida shall be entitled to per diem and travel expenses at the same rate provided for state employees; providing an effective date.

SB 907—A bill to be entitled An act relating to driving while under the influence of alcoholic beverages; amending s. 322.261(1)(d), Florida Statutes; providing that refusal to submit to a chemical breath test be admissible as evidence in certain civil or criminal actions or proceedings; providing an effective date.

SB 908—A bill to be entitled An act relating to developments of regional impact; adding s. 380.031(19), Florida Statutes; defining "Downtown Development Authority"; amending s. 380.06, Florida Statutes; specifying the types of development within the term "development of regional impact"; authorizing recommendations, adoption, amendment, rejection or approval of rules on standards and guidelines; providing for binding letters of interpretation; regulating applications, hearings, and orders concerning developments of regional impact; amending s. 380.07, Florida Statutes; requiring the parties to meet in an effort to resolve disputes after filing an appeal with the Florida Land and Water Adjudicatory Commission; repealing s. 380.10, Florida Statutes, relating to adoption of standards and guidelines; providing an effective date.

SB 909—A bill to be entitled An act relating to environmental land and water management; adding a subsection to s. 380.031, Florida Statutes, defining "downtown development authority"; adding a new subsection (14) to s. 380.06, Florida Statutes, providing for the submission of development of regional impact applications by downtown development authorities; providing content of applications and extent of review of development; providing for determination of effect of deviation from an approved downtown development authority plan; providing an effective date.
