The Senate was called to order by Senator Beard for the purpose of conducting the order of business of introduction and reference of resolutions, memorials, bills and joint resolutions pursuant to Rule 4.3. Senator Holloway represented the Committee on Rules and Calendar and Senator Gorman represented the Minority Party.

## INTRODUCTION

By Senator MacKay—

SB 1100—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Florida Human Rights Act; amending s. 23.167(8)(b), Florida Statutes, prohibiting involuntary retirement for reasons other than ability to perform a job; provides that certain rejection or termination of employment shall not be unlawful; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Commerce; Economic, Community and Consumer Affairs; and Ways and Means.

By Senator Gordon—

SB 1101—A bill to be entitled An act relating to vital statistics; amending s. 68.07(7), Florida Statutes, and adding a new subsection, to provide that a petition for a change of name shall not be denied on the basis of sex or marital status; limiting application of the statute; creating s. 68.075, Florida Statutes, requiring applicants for marriage certificates to select as a legal surname to be used after marriage is solemnized, and requiring both applicants to select as a legal surname for the children of the marriage, certain names or combinations of names; amending s. 382.16(5)(a), (b) and (c), Florida Statutes, conforming provisions relating to certificates of birth and authorizing entry of a surname on a certificate of birth consisting of a combination of the surnames of the mother and father under certain circumstances; amending s. 382.28, Florida Statutes, which requires the Department of Health and Rehabilitative Services to prescribe the form for application for marriage license, to require that such forms include provisions relating to the selection of surnames; providing an effective date.

SB 1102—A bill to be entitled An act relating to hospitals; amending s. 395.0653, Florida Statutes, requiring certain notification of reasons for denial of hospital staff membership or professional clinical privileges to certain health care providers; providing a penalty for violation of provisions relating to such membership and privileges; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Health and Rehabilitative Services and Commerce.

By Senator Peterson—

SB 1103—A bill to be entitled An act relating to soil and water conservation; amending s. 582.16, Florida Statutes; providing for administrative realignment of soil and water conservation district boundaries; amending s. 582.19(1), (2), Florida Statutes; providing for qualifications of supervisors; providing for compensation for soil and water conservation district supervisors; amending s. 582.29, Florida Statutes; authorizing soil and water conservation districts to enter into certain memoranda of agreement; amending s. 582.30(1), Florida Statutes; provid-

ing for the discontinuance of soil and water conservation districts and for a public referendum; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Agriculture, Natural Resources and Conservation and Ways and Means.

SB 1104—A bill to be entitled An act relating to education; amending ss. 235.002, 235.01, 235.011, 235.016, 235.018, 235.02, 235.04, 235.05, 235.055(1), 235.06(1), 235.065, 235.09, 235.149, 235.15, 235.155, 235.16, 235.18, 235.19(1), (4), 235.195, 235.211, 235.212, 235.221, 235.26, 235.30, 235.31, 235.33, 235.40, 235.41, 235.42, 235.4235, 235.43, 235.435, 240.295, 240.297, 240.327, 240.353, 236.602(1), Florida Statutes; creating ss. 235.017, 235.056, 235.196, Florida Statutes; revising provisions relating to educational facilities and capital outlay; providing intent; providing purpose; providing definitions; specifying duties of associate commissioner and associate deputy commissioner; authorizing delegation of powers of Office of Educational Facilities Construction; specifying duties of the office; authorizing lease of educational facilities; providing for survey for instructional space and educational plant survey; providing for cooperative development; providing for restoration of historic facilities; specifying design and construction criteria; authorizing emergency construction; providing for award of contracts; providing for budget requests; providing for administration of Capital Outlay and Debt Service Trust Fund; providing for transfer of funds among projects; requiring departmental reorganization; providing for annual determination of facility and remodeling needs; specifying applicability to State University System; providing procedures for computing instruction units; repealing s. 235.14, Florida Statutes, relating to emergency drills; repealing s. 236.012(3), (4), Florida Statutes, relating to legislative intent; repealing s. 236.013(4), Florida Statutes, relating to definition of "utilization factor"; repealing chapter 79-583, Laws of Florida, relating to countercyclical construction industry jobs program for special school maintenance; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Education and Ways and Means.

By Senator Williamson—

SB 1105—A bill to be entitled An act relating to public documents; amending s. 283.28(1)(a) and (b), Florida Statutes, and adding a subsection thereto; requiring annual rather than biennial purging of publication mailing addresses by state agencies; requiring the Auditor General to report annually to the Legislature regarding compliance with the required purging of mailing lists; requiring cooperation from state agencies; requiring the Auditor General to determine which publication programs are not in the public interest; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Governmental Operations and Rules and Calendar.

By Senator Williamson—

SB 1106—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the solicitation of charitable funds; amending s. 496.03(1)(f), Florida Statutes, reducing the maximum amount of contributions a charitable organization may receive to be exempt from audit requirements for registration; exempting consideration of bequests; providing for conditional repeal; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Commerce and Governmental Operations.

By Senator Trask—

SB 1107—A bill to be entitled An act relating to public nuisances; creating s. 823.15, Florida Statutes, to provide for designation of smoking and nonsmoking areas in restaurants and similar facilities and in hospitals and to prohibit smoking in such nonsmoking areas and in specified areas of certain other facilities; providing a penalty; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Commerce.

By Senator Gordon—

SB 1108—A bill to be entitled An act relating to hospitals; amending s. 395.105, Florida Statutes; requiring hospitals to set standards and procedures, other than pursuant to chapter 120, Florida Statutes, relating to reasonable access by chiropractors to certain reports; providing for conditional repeal; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Health and Rehabilitative Services.

By Senator Steinberg—

SB 1109—A bill to be entitled An act relating to motor carriers; adding a new subsection (12) to s. 323.29, Florida Statutes; authorizing chartered counties to regulate persons operating motor vehicles with seating capacity of nine or more; excluding interstate carriers on routes and classes of transportation authorized by the Interstate Commerce Commission; excluding common carriers with certificates from the Public Service Commission for intercounty and intracounty carriage; providing eligibility for continued operation subsequent to adoption of county regulatory ordinance; providing for conditional repeal; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Economic, Community and Consumer Affairs; Commerce and Transportation.

By Senators Neal and Stuart—

SB 1110—A bill to be entitled An act relating to tax on sales, use, and other transactions; amending s. 212.20(1), Florida Statutes; providing for disposition of sales tax revenues collected on aviation gasoline and jet fuel; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Transportation, Ways and Means Subcommittee D and the Committee on Ways and Means.

By Senator Trask—

SB 1111—A bill to be entitled An act relating to hypnosis; amending s. 456.32(3), Florida Statutes, and adding subsection (5) thereto; adding practicing psychologists to the list of practitioners of the healing arts authorized to practice hypnosis for therapeutic purposes; defining "practicing psychologist"; providing an effective date.

SB 1112—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the tax on motor fuels and special fuels; creating ss. 206.78, 206.781, 206.782, and 206.98, Florida Statutes, and adding subsection (5) to s. 206.45, Florida Statutes; providing a price responsive adjustment for said tax; providing for calculation of the adjustment; providing for collection and distribution of the price responsive tax; providing for use of the proceeds thereof; creating a Local Government Transportation Trust Fund; providing an effective date.

SB 1113—A bill to be entitled An act relating to motor vehicle licenses; amending s. 320.06(1)(a), Florida Statutes,

providing that the penalty for not transferring registration license plates and certificates of registration pursuant to law shall be a civil penalty; providing an effective date.

SB 1114—A bill to be entitled An act relating to educational facilities; amending s. 235.26(3), Florida Statutes, requiring certain boards to permit local building department inspectors who are certified to inspect all educational facilities to determine whether or not the facilities are in compliance with the Uniform Building code; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Education.

By Senator MacKay—

SB 1115—A bill to be entitled An act relating to gasoline stations; adding a new subsection (5) to s. 526.141, Florida Statutes, requiring attendants at full-service gasoline stations offering self-service to dispense gasoline from the self-service portion of the station to motor vehicles properly displaying an exemption entitlement parking permit when the person to whom the permit has been issued is the operator of the vehicle and such service is requested; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Commerce.

SB 1116—A bill to be entitled An act relating to education; creating s. 229.8041, Florida Statutes, providing a state policy for instructional computing and technology; authorizing the Department of Education to assist school districts, community colleges and state universities to make appropriate use of computing; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Education and Ways and Means.

By Senator Myers—

SB 1117—A bill to be entitled An act relating to corporations; amending s. 607.014(5), Florida Statutes; authorizing a corporation to pay certain expenses incurred in defending a civil or criminal action prior to final disposition as authorized by the corporation's board of directors; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Commerce.

By Senator Vogt—

SJR 1118—A joint resolution proposing an amendment to Section 9, Article IV of the State Constitution to rename the Game and Fresh Water Fish Commission and prescribe its membership, powers, and duties.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Natural Resources and Conservation, Ways and Means and Rules and Calendar.

SB 1119—A bill to be entitled An act relating to harness racing; amending s. 550.37(4), Florida Statutes; prescribing the number of night performances allowed for a winter horse-racing season; prescribing the dates of such season; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Commerce and Ways and Means.

By Senator Williamson—

SB 1120—A bill to be entitled An act relating to intangible personal property tax; amending s. 199.072(3), Florida Statutes; increasing the exemption from the tax on certain intangible personal property; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Commerce, Ways and Means Subcommittee D and the Committee on Ways and Means.

SB 1121—A bill to be entitled An act relating to real estate; amending s. 475.01(3) and (6), Florida Statutes, redefining "broker" and "real property" as used in provisions regulating real estate brokers, salesmen and schools; providing for conditional repeal; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Commerce; Economic, Community and Consumer Affairs; and Ways and Means.

By Senator Jenne—

SB 1122—A bill to be entitled An act relating to Sunland Centers; providing that the park at the Sunland Center in the City of Ft. Myers in Lee County shall be designated and named the Ira C. Hatch, Sr., Memorial Park; providing for appropriate signs and markers; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Health and Rehabilitative Services.

By Senator Skinner—

SB 1123—A bill to be entitled An act relating to alcoholism; amending s. 396.102(1), Florida Statutes, providing that in certain counties the certificate for habitual abuser may be waived by the circuit court; providing a definition; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Judiciary-Civil and Health and Rehabilitative Services.

By Senator Jenne—

SB 1124—A bill to be entitled An act relating to intangible personal property taxation; amending s. 199.052(5), Florida Statutes; providing that, for purposes of applying provisions relating to the filing of a consolidated return, a corporation may elect to treat a qualified branch as a separate corporation domiciled outside the state; providing requirements; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Commerce, Ways and Means Subcommittee D and the Committee on Ways and Means.

By Senator Steinberg—

SB 1125—A bill to be entitled An act relating to motor carriers; amending s. 323.052, Florida Statutes, permitting chartered counties to regulate and license for-hire passenger motor vehicles throughout the county; providing for eligibility for continued operation; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Economic, Community and Consumer Affairs; Commerce and Transportation.

By Senator Hair—

SB 1126—A bill to be entitled An act relating to registration of boats; amending s. 371.051(2) and (5), Florida Statutes, and adding subsection (11) to said section; providing requirements for vessel registration and hull identification; prohibiting fraudulent registration decals and unauthorized transfer of decals; providing penalties; specifying the time within which license fees are to be remitted to the department; amending s. 371.65(1), Florida Statutes; clarifying applicability of certain prescribed fees; amending s. 371.68(2), Florida Statutes; providing for resolution of conflicts in imposition of penalties; amending s. 371.75, Florida Statutes; providing for vessel registration and hull identification; prohibiting purchase, possession, or transfer of illegal title, registration, or other indicia of ownership and providing a penalty; amending s. 371.77, Florida Statutes; requiring all vessels to display a hull identification number or hull serial number; prohibiting the alteration or destruction of such number; prohibiting the possession or transfer of vessels with altered hull numbers; establishing probable cause for inspection; providing a penalty; amending s. 371.791, Florida Statutes; prohibiting issuance or obtaining of fraudulent certificates of origin by manufacturers and providing a penalty; amending s. 371.81(6), Florida Statutes; increasing the fee for recording notice of a lien and removing

the fee for recording a satisfaction of a lien; amending s. 371.82, Florida Statutes; providing for resolution of conflicts in imposition of penalties; providing an effective date.

SB 1127—A bill to be entitled An act relating to health facilities and health services planning; amending s. 381.493(2), Florida Statutes; expanding legislative intent; providing an effective date.

SB 1128—A bill to be entitled An act relating to appointments to public office; creating s. 113.075, Florida Statutes; authorizing the requiring of fingerprints of persons considered for public appointments; providing for exchange of criminal history records; amending s. 114.05(2), Florida Statutes; providing for exchange of records by the Senate; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Executive Business, Judiciary-Criminal and Rules and Calendar.

SB 1129—A bill to be entitled An act relating to water resources; amending s. 373.503(1), Florida Statutes; clarifying the method of financing water management district functions; clarifying legislative intent; providing an effective date.

SB 1130—A bill to be entitled An act relating to parking for handicapped persons; amending s. 316.1956(2), Florida Statutes; providing that required signs be fixed and nonmovable; amending s. 320.0848(1), Florida Statutes; removing the residency requirement to qualify for certain parking permits; providing an effective date.

SB 1131—A bill to be entitled An act relating to criminal justice information and records; amending and redesignating s. 943.07, Florida Statutes, as s. 943.045, Florida Statutes; providing definitions; amending s. 943.05, Florida Statutes; extending the duties of the Criminal Justice Information System Division; creating ss. 943.051-943.058, Florida Statutes; providing for the collection and storage of criminal justice information, dissemination of criminal history information, and disposition reporting; approving the charging of certain fees; allowing the exchange of federal criminal history records; providing for the keeping of dissemination records and audits of certain agencies; providing for personal access, review, and challenge of criminal history records; allowing access to records for research, and providing for expunction and sealing of records; amending s. 943.06(1), Florida Statutes; providing for the membership of the Criminal Justice Information Systems Council; extending the duties of the Criminal Justice Information Systems Council; repealing ss. 30.31, 893.14, and 901.33, Florida Statutes, relating to fingerprinting by sheriffs and to expunctions of certain criminal history records; providing severability; providing an effective date.

SB 1134—A bill to be entitled An act relating to residential construction; providing definitions; requiring building contractors or developers of one- or two-family residential dwelling units to notify prospective buyers of their right to have certain deposits placed in escrow; requiring the building contractor or developer to deposit certain funds in interest-bearing escrow accounts; providing that the building contractor or developer shall be entitled to the interest in such accounts; providing for surety bonds; providing that the building contractor or developer may borrow funds for construction purposes; providing for the release of funds in escrow accounts; providing for priority; prohibiting certain claims; providing a penalty; providing for attorney's fees and court costs with respect to civil litigation; providing for maximum statewide standards; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Economic, Community and Consumer Affairs; and Judiciary-Criminal.

By Senator Frank—

SB 1135—A bill to be entitled An act relating to search warrants; amending ss. 933.06, 933.07, Florida Statutes; authorizing the issuance of search warrants by oral affidavit and providing a procedure therefor; amending s. 933.11, Florida Statutes; conforming provisions relating to the deliverance of search warrants to such procedure; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary-Criminal.

By Senator Jenne—

SB 1136—A bill to be entitled An act relating to bridge designation; designating and naming the bridge which will span the Intracoastal Waterway in the City of Delray Beach, Palm Beach County, being constructed as a part of Linton Boulevard, as the Jack L. Saunders Bridge; providing for appropriate markers to be erected by the Department of Transportation; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Transportation.

By Senator MacKay—

SB 1137—A bill to be entitled An act relating to workers' compensation and employer's liability insurances; amending subsection (6) of s. 627.091, Florida Statutes; clarifying the requirements for committees of rating organizations to hold meetings in Florida subject to the Sunshine Law; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Commerce.

By Senator Jenne—

SB 1138—A bill to be entitled An act relating to county government; creating s. 125.0175, Florida Statutes, providing for the creation of a local government management and efficiency review commission in certain counties; providing for the membership of the commission; providing for terms of commission members; providing duties; requiring affected governmental units to cooperate with the commission; providing for the dissolution of the commission; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Economic, Community and Consumer Affairs.

By Senator Don Childers—

SB 1139—A bill to be entitled An act relating to intergovernmental programs; creating s. 163.166, Florida Statutes; prohibiting zoning or similar local ordinances or regulations which preclude solar collectors, clotheslines or other energy devices based on renewable resources; providing for payment of costs and fees for litigation under certain circumstances; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Economic, Community and Consumer Affairs.

By Senator Hill—

SB 1140—A bill to be entitled An act relating to insurance; amending s. 627.728(3), Florida Statutes, exempting automobile liability insurers from notice of cancellation requirements if a premium finance company has complied with certain notice requirements; amending s. 627.848(2), (4), and (6), Florida Statutes, requiring premium finance companies to provide the insured with certain information following notice of intent to cancel an insurance contract; requiring insurers to return unpaid premium balances; providing for conditional repeal; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Commerce.

By Senator Don Childers—

SB 1141—A bill to be entitled An act relating to group insurance; amending s. 112.0801, Florida Statutes, to provide that participation in certain group insurance plans by retired personnel of a county, municipality, community college or district school board may be paid for by the employer; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to Ways and Means Subcommittee E and the Committee on Ways and Means.

SB 1142—Introduced and passed April 23.

SB 1143—A bill to be entitled An act relating to pretrial intervention programs; amending s. 944.025(3), Florida Statutes; extending the period of time during which criminal charges against an individual admitted to such a program may be continued without final disposition; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Judiciary-Criminal and Ways and Means.

By Senator Vogt—

SB 1144—A bill to be entitled An act relating to alcoholic beverages; creating s. 561.67, Florida Statutes; requiring each manufacturer of beer to grant distributors of beer a restricted, exclusive sales territory specified in an agreement; providing for state approval thereof; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Commerce and Ways and Means.

By Senator Trask—

SB 1145—A bill to be entitled An act relating to supervisors of elections; amending s. 98.051, Florida Statutes; au-

thorizing the supervisor of elections to open his office or any branch office on any Saturday or Sunday; authorizing the supervisor to determine the time such offices shall be open; authorizing voter registration on Sunday; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary-Civil.

By Senator Maxwell—

SB 1146—A bill to be entitled An act relating to education; amending s. 244.07, Florida Statutes; requiring certain members of the Florida Education Council to be members of local advisory committees; establishing the council as the chief state-level coordinating and monitoring body for local advisory committees; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Education and Ways and Means.

By Senator Carlucci—

SB 1147—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Secretary of State; amending s. 15.03(3), Florida Statutes; removing the prohibition against the use of the great seal for advertising or promotional purposes; providing for manufacture, use, and display of facsimiles and reproductions only upon approval by the Department of State; authorizing the adoption of rules; providing penalties; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Governmental Operations.

By Senator Steinberg—

SB 1148—A bill to be entitled An act relating to consumer protection; creating s. 501.214, Florida Statutes; providing that certain limitations on liability constitute deceptive and unfair trade practices; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committee on Commerce.

By Senator Vogt—

SB 1149—A bill to be entitled An act relating to state property; amending s. 216.011(1)(q), Florida Statutes; redefining "operating capital outlay"; amending s. 273.02, Florida Statutes; redefining "property" and providing for marking and inventory thereof; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Governmental Operations and Ways and Means.

By Senator McClain—

SB 1150—A bill to be entitled An act relating to unemployment compensation; amending s. 443.06(8), Florida Statutes; providing that the term, "base period employing unit," shall not apply to any branch of the United States Armed Forces for purposes of disqualification from benefits because of benefits received under retirement, pension, or annuity program; providing an effective date.

—was read the first time by title and referred to the Committees on Commerce and Ways and Means.

SB 1151—A bill to be entitled An act relating to farm labor registration; amending ss. 450.28(2), 450.30, 450.31, 450.32(1), 450.33(1), (6), (8), (9), 450.35, 450.36 and 450.37, Florida Statutes; changing references to, and reassigning to the Division of Employment Security of the Department of Labor, certain duties of the administrator of the Farm Labor and Rural Manpower Section of the division; providing an effective date.

By Senator Vogt—

SB 1152—A bill to be entitled An act relating to real property; amending s. 713.35, Florida Statutes; providing that the

making of a false statement in connection with the improvement of real property is a felony of the third degree; providing an effective date.
