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INTRODUCTION AND REFERENCE OF BILLS

First Reading

The following bills are offered for introduction. This constitutes first reading as prescribed in Article III, Section 7 of the Constitution and the bills are referred as indicated.

By Senator Anderson—

SB 429—A bill to be entitled An act relating to minimum sentences; amending s. 775.087(2), Florida Statutes; correcting cross-references regarding ineligibility for statutory gain-time allowances; requiring that mandatory minimum sentences for certain crimes committed while in possession of a firearm or destructive device be served consecutively; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committees on Judiciary-Criminal; and Corrections, Probation and Parole.

By Senator Hill—

SB 430—A bill to be entitled An act relating to clinical laboratory registration fees; amending s. 483.051(3), Florida Statutes; permitting the Department of Health and Rehabilitative Services to retain and use such fees for the administration of the Florida Clinical Laboratory Law; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

By Senator Anderson—

SB 431—A bill to be entitled An act for the relief of Crystal Andrews; providing an appropriation to a trust to compensate her for the death of Jeffrey Allen Andrews, her father; providing for payment of attorneys' fees and administration fees; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Special Master and the Committee on Finance, Taxation and Claims.

By Senator Anderson—

SB 432—A bill to be entitled An act relating to arrests; creating s. 901.35, Florida Statutes; authorizing peace officers or owners, lessees of farms, ranches, orchards, fruit groves, nurseries, gardens, fish hatcheries, or fish farms to take into custody and detain persons for theft upon probable cause; exempting such officers, owners, lessees or agents from certain criminal or civil liability; authorizing peace officers to make arrests on or off the premises without warrant upon probable cause; exempting an owner, lessee or his agent who causes an arrest of a person for theft from certain criminal or civil liability; prescribing penalties for persons convicted of petit theft involving certain agricultural products; prohibiting persons from resisting attempts to recover stolen property by such officers, owners, or agents under certain circumstances; adding s. 812.022(5), Florida Statutes; providing that proof of possession of produce under certain circumstances is prima facie evidence of intent to commit theft; providing penalties; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committees on Agriculture and Judiciary-Criminal.

SB 433—A bill to be entitled An act relating to confidential records of the Department of Banking and Finance; amending s. 655.057(1)(b), Florida Statutes, 1980 Supplement; providing

for the release of certain confidential records to the Auditor General or his staff; providing an effective date.

By Senator Trask—

SB 434—A bill to be entitled An act relating to public officers and employees; creating s. 112.0215, Florida Statutes, providing a limitation upon the number of full-time salaried state employees; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committees on Governmental Operations; Personnel, Retirement and Collective Bargaining; and Appropriations.

SCR 435—A concurrent resolution commending Robert MacDonald for his contributions to the fine arts.

SB 436—A bill to be entitled An act relating to mobile home parks; amending ss. 83.759(1)(d), 83.760(4), Florida Statutes; providing procedures for rezoning, conversion, or change in land use of mobile home parks; requiring advance notice to tenants; requiring filing of tenant displacement impact report; authorizing denial of proposed changes based on such report; authorizing the governmental entity having jurisdiction over zoning to require the park owner to take certain actions; requiring notice to tenants of current zoning and contemplated changes; authorizing local adoption of more stringent requirements; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committees on Economic, Community and Consumer Affairs; and Commerce.

SB 437—A bill to be entitled An act relating to unemployment compensation; renumbering s. 443.101(2)-(9), Florida Statutes, 1980 Supplement, and adding new subsections (2) and (3) to said section; providing disqualification from benefits for certain suspensions and leaves of absence; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committee on Commerce.

By Senator Trask—

SB 438—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Health Maintenance Organization Act; amending s. 641.19(4), Florida Statutes; defining "comprehensive health care services"; repealing s. 641.19(3), Florida Statutes, which defines "minimum services"; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committees on Health and Rehabilitative Services and Commerce.

By Senator Hill—

SB 439—A bill to be entitled An act relating to minors; creating s. 743.066, Florida Statutes; removing the disability of nonage of certain minors adjudicated as adults for specified purposes; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committee on Judiciary-Civil.

By Senator Hill—

SB 440—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Little Randolph Sheppard Act; amending s. 413.051(2)(d), Florida Statutes; exempting from the definition of "state property", as used in said act, any state correctional institution; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committees on Corrections, Probation and Parole; and Appropriations.

By Senator Hill—

SB 441—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Department of Corrections; repealing s. 945.09(3), Florida Statutes, which subsection provides for reception and evaluation of a prisoner in the area where he was committed or incarcerated; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committee on Corrections, Probation and Parole.

By Senator Hill—

SB 442—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Department of Corrections; creating s. 945.216, Florida Statutes; providing powers of the department with respect to money or other property received for personal use or benefit of an inmate; providing for disposition of money received in payment of claims against an inmate; providing for disposition of unclaimed trust funds; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committee on Corrections, Probation and Parole.

By Senator Hill—

SB 443—A bill to be entitled An act relating to corrections; amending s. 944.28, Florida Statutes; providing circumstances and procedures for forfeiture of gain-time, extra gain-time, and the right to earn gain-time in the future; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committee on Corrections, Probation and Parole.

By Senator Langley—

SB 444—A bill to be entitled An act relating to home warranty associations; amending s. 634.301(6), Florida Statutes; modifying the definition of "premium"; adding s. 634.308-(1)(c), Florida Statutes; amending s. 634.308(2)(f) and (3)(b), Florida Statutes; providing an additional ground for the suspension or revocation of a license; requiring the maintenance of a minimum net worth; eliminating the maximum 18-month term of a warranty contract; amending s. 634.312(3), Florida Statutes; providing for the approval of contract forms; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committee on Commerce.

By Senators Stevens, Winn, Jenkins and Beard—

SB 445—A bill to be entitled An act relating to state uniform traffic control; creating s. 316.1996, Florida Statutes, restricting certain vehicles with eight or more wheels from being operated in the far left lane on multilaned roadways in certain counties; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committee on Transportation.

By Senator Scott—

SB 446—A bill to be entitled An act relating to workers' compensation; creating s. 440.385, Florida Statutes; establishing the Florida Insolvency Guaranty Association, Incorporated; requiring certain individual self-insurers to become members of the association; providing for withdrawal upon termination of the self-insurance privilege; providing for a board of directors and providing for organization, operation, powers, and duties thereof; providing for creation of an insolvency fund; providing for a plan of operation; providing powers and duties of the Department of Labor and Employment Security; providing the effect of paid claims; providing for exchange of information to detect and prevent employer insolvencies; providing for examination and regulation of the association by

the department; providing certain immunity; providing for a stay of proceedings; providing a statute of limitations; amending s. 440.38(1)(b), Florida Statutes, 1980 Supplement, to conform; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committee on Commerce.

SB 447—A bill to be entitled An act relating to education; amending s. 240.125, Florida Statutes; requiring the Board of Regents to encourage and approve regional postsecondary educational consortia; providing purposes of the consortia; providing for funding; requiring annual reports; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committees on Education and Appropriations.

By Senator Trask—

SB 448—A bill to be entitled An act relating to sewage disposal facilities; repealing s. 403.086(1)(b), Florida Statutes, as amended, which provides that no such facilities shall dispose of wastes into certain waters without providing advance waste treatment; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committees on Natural Resources and Conservation; and Economic, Community and Consumer Affairs.

By Senator Neal—

SB 449—A bill to be entitled An act relating to DeSoto County; repealing chapter 78-499, Laws of Florida, relating to the creation of the Fort Ogden Fire Protection and Rescue Service District; providing an effective date.

Proof of publication of the required notice was attached.

—was referred to the Committee on Rules and Calendar.

By Senator Gordon—

SB 450—A bill to be entitled An act relating to victims of handgun shootings; creating the Florida Handgun Victim Compensation Act; providing that victims of handgun shootings or the parents, children, or spouses of deceased victims may receive awards of up to \$10,000; providing exceptions; providing definitions; creating the Handgun Victim Compensation Trust Fund; providing for a 10 percent surcharge on the sale of handguns; requiring the Department of Revenue to provide procedures for collecting such surcharge; providing that all moneys received from the surcharge imposed on the sale of handguns be placed in the fund; providing for administration of the fund and disposition of claims against the fund by the Division of Workers' Compensation of the Department of Labor and Employment Security; providing procedures for filing claims for compensation from the fund; authorizing emergency awards; providing for confidentiality of certain records; providing for subrogation; providing that payment of an award creates a debt due the state by any person who shoots a victim with a handgun; providing penalties for making fraudulent claims; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committees on Judiciary-Criminal, Commerce; and Finance, Taxation and Claims.

SB 451—A bill to be entitled An act relating to naming a causeway; designating the 192nd Street Causeway as the Norman M. Giller Causeway; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committee on Transportation.

By Senator Frank—

SB 452—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the School Health Services Act of 1974; adding s. 402.32(3)(d), Florida Statutes, and amending subsection (7) of said section; prescribing the type of screening for which written permission from a parent or guardian is required; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committees on Health and Rehabilitative Services and Education.

SB 453—A bill to be entitled An act relating to elections; amending s. 97.021(13), Florida Statutes, authorizing supervisors of elections to provide for voter registration on Sundays; providing an effective date.

By Senator Dunn (by request)—

SB 454—A bill to be entitled An act relating to public employment; amending s. 110.117(3), Florida Statutes, 1980 Supplement, and adding subsection (4) to said section; specifying eligibility for personal holidays; providing that holidays be prorated for part-time employees; renumbering s. 110.123(7), Florida Statutes, and adding a new subsection (7) to said section; providing a group insurance plan for state law enforcement and correctional officers; amending s. 110.227(3)(b), Florida Statutes; specifying requirements of layoff procedures; amending s. 112.061(6), (7)(d), Florida Statutes; specifying rates of per diem and travel allowances; amending s. 121.021(24), Florida Statutes, 1980 Supplement; excluding accumulated compensatory leave from calculation of average final compensation; creating s. 240.226, Florida Statutes; requiring the Board of Regents to adopt rules allowing state employees to enroll in courses free of charge; repealing s. 240.227(10), Florida Statutes, relating to free courses for State University System employees; providing a retroactive effective date.

SR 455—A resolution commending the Bunnell Chapter of the Future Farmers of America in the chapter's dune restoration project on the beaches of Flagler County.

SB 456—A bill to be entitled An act relating to garnishment of wages; amending s. 222.11, Florida Statutes; providing that a single person who supports a child or other dependent is a head of family for purposes of the exemption from attachment or garnishment; providing an effective date.

SB 457—A bill to be entitled An act relating to administrative procedures; amending s. 11.60(2)(d) and (j), Florida Statutes, 1980 Supplement, authorizing the Administrative Procedures Committee of the Legislature to recommend the adoption, amendment, or rejection of agency rules; deleting standing of the committee to challenge agency rules in court; amending s. 120.54(13), Florida Statutes, 1980 Supplement, and adding new subsections (14)-(19), authorizing the committee to recommend legislative rejection or modification of proposed agency rules under certain circumstances; authorizing the Legislature to invalidate and modify proposed and effective agency rules; authorizing the committee to suspend agency rules adopted or filed with the committee during the interim between legislative sessions; amending s. 120.545(8), Florida Statutes, 1980 Supplement, conforming to the act provisions relating to the powers and duties of the committee; providing severability; providing an effective date.

SB 458—A bill to be entitled An act relating to cemeteries; adding s. 559.31(3), Florida Statutes, 1980 Supplement; applying specified provisions relating to care and maintenance trust funds to county and municipal cemeteries; providing an effective date.

By Senator McKnight—

SB 459—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Health Facilities and Health Services Planning Act; adding s. 381.494(7)(g), Florida Statutes; providing for the issuance of a certificate of need containing conditions; providing an effective date.

SB 460—A bill to be entitled An act relating to health care of the aged; requiring each county health department to cooperate with the Department of Health and Rehabilitative Services in the establishment and maintenance of gerontology clinics; providing for staffing; requiring the department to establish a pilot program staffed by a geriatric nurse specialist; requiring program evaluation; providing an appropriation; providing an effective date.

SB 461—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Tampa Housing Authority, Hillsborough County; making it subject to s. 286.011, Florida Statutes; providing an effective date.

SB 462—A bill to be entitled An act relating to unincorporated areas of Hillsborough County; providing that vendors holding malt beverage off-premises sales licenses under state beverage laws shall be subject to alcoholic beverage zoning regulations of Hillsborough County, Florida; providing an effective date.

SB 463—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Hillsborough County Port District; providing that the Tampa Port Authority is the sole agency in the port district with the power to issue industrial development bonds pertaining to port and maritime industrial development within the port district; providing an exception; providing an effective date.

SB 464—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Tampa Sports Authority, City of Tampa, Hillsborough County; amending s. 4(j), chapter 65-2307; Laws of Florida, as amended; authorizing the Tampa Sports Authority to contract for use of any part of its facilities by private users for any lawful purpose, when such use will not interfere with the operation of any of the facilities for sports and recreational purposes; providing an effective date.

SB 465—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Department of Natural Resources; requiring the department to establish a grant program to assist urban counties or municipalities in acquiring, constructing, or improving outdoor recreation areas, parks or facilities; specifying the sources of funding; authorizing the department to exercise certain powers; authorizing the department to adopt rules; prohibiting the department from placing certain limits on grants unless warranted by special circumstances; specifying allowable local matching funds; providing an appropriation; providing an effective date.

SB 466—A bill to be entitled An act relating to electrical standards; amending s. 553.19, Florida Statutes; prescribing minimum electrical standards in the state; providing applicability; providing an effective date.

SB 467—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the sales and use tax; providing legislative intent; amending ss. 212.03(1), (3), (6), 212.031(1)(c), (d), 212.05(1)(a), (2)-(6), 212.055(1), 212.06(1)(a), 212.12(10), (11), Florida Statutes, and ss. 212.04(1), 212.08(3), (11)(c), Florida Statutes, 1980 Supplement; increasing the tax on sales, use, storage, consumption, rentals, admissions, communication services, and other transactions; providing an effective date.

SB 470—A bill to be entitled An act relating to Workers' Compensation; amending s. 440.13(1), Florida Statutes, 1980 Supplement; granting an injured employee the right to select a physician or surgeon or other recognized practitioner, nurse, or hospital furnishing remedial treatment, care, and attendance under the Workers' Compensation Act; providing that the employer may offer and recommend physicians or surgeons or other recognized practitioners, nurses, or hospitals to the employee at any time and petition for a change upon good cause shown; providing an effective date.

SB 471—A bill to be entitled An act relating to unemployment compensation; amending s. 443.111(2)(a), Florida Statutes, 1980 Supplement; providing for an individual's weekly benefit amount; providing an effective date.

SJR 472—A joint resolution proposing an amendment to Section 18, Article I of the State Constitution, to authorize the Legislature to nullify any rule or regulation promulgated by the executive branch and providing for deferral with respect to such nullification and to provide for suspension of such rule as provided by law.

SB 473—A bill to be entitled An act relating to water conservation; creating the Water Conservation Act; creating s. 381.2612, Florida Statutes; providing that, after a specified date, no new building or addition to or renovation of an existing building may be built if they contain certain plumbing equipment; providing exceptions; providing a penalty; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committees on Commerce; and Economic, Community and Consumer Affairs.

By Senator Neal—

SB 474—A bill to be entitled An act relating to Glades County; authorizing the Board of County Commissioners to use surplus gas tax funds for the paving of residential streets within city limits; providing an effective date.

SB 475—A bill to be entitled An act relating to disinterested witnesses; providing for reimbursement of costs incurred by such witnesses in producing documents at certain legal proceedings; providing definitions; providing procedures for reimbursement; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committee on Judiciary-Civil.

By Senators Johnston and Lewis—

SB 476—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Florida Retirement System; adding subsection (5) to s. 121.0515, Florida Statutes, providing certain members of the special risk class of the system with retirement credit for prior service under a county or special district employer under the provisions of chapter 122, Florida Statutes; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committees on Personnel, Retirement and Collective Bargaining; and Appropriations.

By Senator Anderson—

SB 477—A bill to be entitled An act relating to international banking facilities; renumbering s. 199.023(10), (11), Florida Statutes, 1980 Supplement, adding a new subsection (10) to said section, and amending present subsection (10); defining "international banking facility" and "international banking transaction"; adding s. 220.62(3), (4), Florida Statutes, 1980 Supplement; defining "international banking facility" and "foreign person"; amending s. 220.63(3), Florida Statutes, and adding subsection (5) to said section; providing a tax deduction for certain income of an international banking facility; amending s. 213.053(4), (6), Florida Statutes, 1980 Supplement; providing exceptions to confidentiality requirements; providing that certain information be made available to the Comptroller; amending s. 199.052(2), Florida Statutes, 1980 Supplement; requiring filing of tax return without regard to liability in certain cases; adding s. 658.68(4), Florida Statutes, 1980 Supplement; excluding certain amounts from the total deposit liability of a bank; amending s. 687.13, Florida Statutes; providing an exception for international banking transactions from certain provisions relating to interest and usury; requiring an annual report from the Department of Revenue; providing an effective date.

SB 478—A bill to be entitled An act relating to unemployment compensation; amending s. 443.131(5)(b), Florida Statutes, 1980 Supplement; requiring the state to reimburse the Unemployment Compensation Trust Fund for certain benefits obtained through fraud or error; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committees on Commerce and Appropriations.

By Senator Maxwell—

SB 479—A bill to be entitled An act relating to elections; amending s. 97.061(2), Florida Statutes; deleting provision requiring each supervisor of elections to record certain information about electors needing assistance at the polls; amending s. 98.031(1), Florida Statutes, 1980 Supplement; deleting provision which requires each county election precinct to have clearly observable boundaries; amending s. 98.051(1)(c), Florida Statutes, 1980 Supplement; requiring the supervisor of elections to provide for registration during certain periods; amending s. 98.271(1), Florida Statutes, 1980 Supplement; prescribing the office in which the written oath required of deputy supervisors of elections is to be filed; amending ss. 101.141(6), 101.151(8), 101.27(6), Florida Statutes; removing the require-

ment that the Department of State approve ballots; amending s. 101.72, Florida Statutes, prescribing the number of voting booths or compartments required in certain counties; authorizing each supervisor of elections to determine the actual number of booths or compartments to be used in each precinct; amending s. 106.29(1), Florida Statutes; changing the day on which executive committees of political parties are to file reports of contributions and expenditures; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committee on Judiciary-Civil.

SB 480—A bill to be entitled An act relating to charity racing days; adding paragraph (n) to s. 550.03(2), Florida Statutes, directing the Florida Pari-mutuel Commission to allow an additional charity day of operation for jai-alai frontons located in Brevard County for certain purposes; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committee on Commerce.

By Senator Renick—

SB 481—A bill to be entitled An act relating to building construction; creating s. 553.895, Florida Statutes; requiring future public lodging establishments to be equipped with an automatic sprinkler system; providing standards; requiring existing public lodging establishments to be equipped with an automatic sprinkler system or an automatic smoke detection system by a specified date; providing standards; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committees on Commerce and Appropriations.

By Senator Dunn—

SB 482—A bill to be entitled An act relating to trust and agency investment matters; amending s. 215.46, Florida Statutes; establishing the authorized sales price for sales under call options; creating s. 215.455, Florida Statutes; authorizing the loan of securities; amending s. 215.47(1)(h), (3), Florida Statutes, 1980 Supplement; adding s. 215.47(1)(l), (m), (2)(i), (6), Florida Statutes, 1980 Supplement; authorizing the investment of trust funds and agency funds in certificates of deposit of any domestic bank; authorizing the investment of public funds in prime commercial paper and bankers acceptances; increasing the percentage of state trust funds and agency funds which can be invested in common stocks; revising the criteria for investment in common stock; authorizing the use of options in selling or purchasing portfolio securities; authorizing repurchase agreements and reverse repurchase agreements; providing an effective date.

SB 483—A bill to be entitled An act relating to drivers' licenses; amending s. 322.142(3), Florida Statutes; increasing the fee for a color photographic driver's license; providing an effective date.

SB 484—A bill to be entitled An act relating to drivers' licenses; amending s. 322.05(7), Florida Statutes; prescribing conditions for denial of a license to any person having an uncorrectable visual disability; providing an effective date.

By Senator Henderson—

SB 485—A bill to be entitled An act relating to condominiums; amending s. 718.112(2)(1), Florida Statutes, 1980 Supplement; providing a specified minimum sum for fidelity bonds required of certain officers or directors of condominium associations; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committee on Economic, Community and Consumer Affairs.

By Senator Henderson—
