First Reading

The following bills are offered for introduction. This constitutes first reading as provided in Article III, Section 7 of the Constitution and the bills are referred as indicated.

SB 694—A bill to be entitled An act relating to school funding; amending s. 236.081(6)(c), Florida Statutes, 1980 Supplement, providing a minimum percentage of net annual state allocation to each school district for current operations; providing an effective date.

SB 695—A bill to be entitled An act relating to Volusia County; providing for the relief of Laura M. Pasetto; providing an appropriation; providing an effective date.

SB 697—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the acquisition of state lands; creating s. 253.022, Florida Statutes; establishing the Land Acquisition Administrative Trust Fund and specifying purposes thereof; amending s. 253.025, Florida Statutes, 1980 Supplement; providing procedures and standards for acquisition of state lands; applying such procedures and standards to all acquisitions not made by exercise of the power of eminent domain; requiring the Board of Trustees of the Internal Improvement Trust Fund to adopt minimum criteria; providing an effective date.

SB 698—A bill to be entitled An act relating to vocational education; amending s. 228.041(1)(b), Florida Statutes, 1980 Supplement; changing the term "occupational education" to "vocational education"; amending s. 229.551(1)(e), (g), Florida Statutes, and adding paragraph (h) to said subsection; conforming language; requiring common course numbering for postsecondary vocational education courses; directing the development of common definitions; amending s. 230.2313(3)(d), Florida Statutes, 1980 Supplement; requiring certain school district personnel to identify certain areas of curriculum deficiency and to report adjustment in certain programs; amending s. 230.645, Florida Statutes; providing for postsecondary student fee deferrals and deferments for certain students and for settlement of

delinquent accounts; amending ss. 240.311(1)(a), 240.353(1), Florida Statutes; conforming language; amending s. 240.355, Florida Statutes; requiring community college placement personnel to make recommendations regarding certain curriculum deficiencies; amending s. 240.359(1)(b), Florida Statutes, 1980 Supplement; conforming language; providing an effective date.

SB 701—A bill to be entitled An act relating to trust administration; adding a subsection to s. 737.303, Florida Statutes, requiring trustees to provide guardians of minor beneficiaries with annual trust statements upon reasonable request by the guardian; providing an effective date.

SB 702—A bill to be entitled An act relating to farm labor contractors; amending s. 450.31(3), Florida Statutes; increasing the fee for issuance or renewal of a certificate of registration; providing an effective date.

SB 703—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Governor's mansion; amending s. 272.185(1)(b), Florida Statutes; providing for the purchase of insurance for the contents of the mansion; providing an effective date.

SB 704—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Career Service Commission; amending s. 110.309(5), Florida Statutes; removing a provision authorizing the inclusion of certain fees and expenses in certain orders issued by the commission; creating s. 110.311, Florida Statutes; authorizing the inclusion of attorney's fees, witness fees, and expenses in certain orders issued by the commission; providing an effective date.

SB 705—A bill to be entitled An act relating to local government finance; creating s. 215.432, Florida Statutes; authorizing units of local government to issue notes in anticipation of receipt of certain moneys; providing procedures for issuance, redemption, and sale; providing a maximum term and maximum interest; specifying purposes of moneys borrowed under the notes; amending ss. 125.012(23), 166.111, Florida Statutes; specifying power of counties and municipalities to issue anticipation notes; providing an effective date.

SB 707—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Department of Health and Rehabilitative Services; providing legislative intent; providing definitions; requiring the department to collect fees for certificate of need applications; requiring the department to contract with health systems agencies to perform specified functions; requiring the department, health systems agencies and the Statewide Health Coordinating Council to make recommendations regarding allocation of certain specified federal funds; requiring health systems agencies to assist the hospital cost containment board under certain circumstances; requiring annual reporting to the Governor and the Legislature; providing for an appropriation; providing an effective date.

the State of Florida or its agencies; or (c) When the goods, supplies or materials are used or damaged; or (d) When the goods, supplies or materials are available from only one source; or (e) When, as part of a resolution authorizing the construction contract or the purchase of such goods, supplies or materials, the Board also finds that such construction contract or such goods, supplies or materials are needed to alleviate an existing emergency and that such construction work or such goods, supplies or materials cannot be obtained in sufficient time if bids, public notice and advertisement are required; providing time for taking effect.
