SB 269—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Department of Health and Rehabilitative Services; amending s. 20-19(5), Florida Statutes, 1980 Supplement; prohibiting departmental staff from being members of a district advisory council; providing an exception; providing procedure for appointing replacements for vacancies; limiting number of terms a member may serve; providing for reimbursement for travel expenses; requiring the department to make separate requests for appropriations for each district advisory council; authorizing the designation of subcommittees; requiring each council to send at least one member to the department's annual budget meeting; reviving and readopting s. 20.19(5), Florida Statutes, as amended, notwithstanding the provisions of the Sundown Act; providing for repeal and legislative review pursuant to the Sundown Act; providing an effective date.

Amendment 1—On page 4, line 2, after the period insert: *Any member who fails to attend two consecutive meetings without cause may be removed by the Governor.*

Amendment 2—On page 4, lines 7-10, strike all of said lines and insert: (e) (d) Each district advisory council shall hold quarterly meetings. Additional meetings shall be held upon the call of the chairman or upon the petition of a majority of the members to the chairman. In addition, at least two public hearings shall be conducted each year. The purpose of the public hearings shall be to take testimony from members of the public, service providers associated with the department, and other interested persons to discover how programs and services provided by the department can be more effectively and efficiently operated. The location of each hearing shall be alternated to assure that a hearing is conducted in each geographical area of the district. Seven days prior to each public hearing, notice of the hearing shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation in the area in which the hearing is to be conducted.
